Troy Stevenson, Director of State Advocacy
Campaigns, The Trevor Project, informed Board members
of their work on ending conversion therapy across the
country for over a decade and are focusing on
Pennsylvania.

Mr. Stevenson addressed a research report over the last five years, where there is a perception that conversion therapy is a part of the past and done only by religious practitioners or some sort of faith leader in churches, but have found that licensed practitioners around the country are practicing conversion therapy.

Mr. Stevenson reported that it has been growing exponentially over the last decade and have identified around 1,320 practitioners across the country, both licensed and unlicensed. He noted hiring an outside contractor to verify the information and forwarded the same to their own research professionals to receive further verification.

Mr. Stevenson stated 88 individuals were identified in Pennsylvania, noting 59 were licensed

psychologists and 21 licensed social workers. He
noted also finding a network of religious
practitioners who will actually refer to licensed
practitioners. He reported that the biggest network
of individuals were in the western Pennsylvania and
eastern Ohio regions with Allegheny County being the
largest county identified.

Mr. Stevenson stated Governor Wolf prepared an Executive Order on funding, where no state or national funding could go to conversion therapy, along with allowing state agencies to review further and provide education. He noted state prosecutors are willing to take licensure complaints.

Mr. Stevenson informed Board members that The Trevor Project continues lobbying in the state legislature to get this codified into law and working with Governor Shapiro's office. He stated they are approaching all of the boards of licensure with their discovery and to help.

Ms. Byrd stated the information concerning

Pennsylvania is something that resides with the

Board, because the greatest number of practitioners

in Pennsylvania were identified as social workers,

marriage and family, or professional counselors. She

reported no complaints had been filed.

4.3

Ms. Byrd addressed a provision in the Executive Order under responsibilities of the Commonwealth agencies, where the Department of State is directed to inform licensed healthcare practitioners in Pennsylvania that the Commonwealth discourages the provision and reimbursement for conversion therapy. The Department of State shall also inform the public of mechanisms available to report licensed professionals that cause harm to patients as a result of conversion therapy.

Ms. Martin noted being in Allegheny County and requested the number of social workers and licensed social workers providing conversion therapy in Allegheny County and the total for the surrounding counties in southwest Pennsylvania. She also requested clarification that the information was obtained from the practitioners' websites.

Mr. Stevenson reported 13 in Allegheny, 7 in Beaver, 6 in Westmoreland, 1 in Greensburg, and 0 in Washington. He noted the information was obtained through their website or through the referral list.

Chair Santiago asked whether their research shows the individuals are receiving their degrees from brick-and-mortar schools or online programs. Mr. Stevenson could not provide that information.

Mr. Barrett informed Board members that enforcement-related issues or complaints should be directed to the Professional Compliance Office (PCO). He cautioned members of the Board to not speak or give personal opinions that may be viewed as the opinion of the Board.

Chair Santiago asked whether the individuals are working in agencies or in private practice. Ms. Byrd explained that they would be in private practice for the most part, like group practice, as opposed to agency settings, because agencies would not have the same kind of information available.

Mr. Stevenson commented that conversion therapy is not taught at any university in the country or any degree certificate granting institution. He noted it to be a mix of practice individuals that are taking it up on their own.

Ms. Byrd had statements from NASW, the American Psychiatric Association, the Psychology Association, the Counselors Association, the American Family Therapy Association, and probably about 20 other national associations that are taking a strong stance against the practice of conversion therapy.

Mr. DeCriscio requested current information at the federal level with Congress regarding the

practice of conversion therapy.

Mr. Stevenson noted two pieces of legislation trying to go through Congress.

Ms. Byrd reporting hearing of at least a couple of bills attempting to force insurance companies to reimburse for conversion therapy or mandate conversion therapy in certain cases, but did not believe those bills have moved.

Mr. Stevenson reported two pieces of federal legislation that had not moved concerning funding and consumer fraud, neither of which would relate to licensure because licensure is handled at the state level.

Ms. McCarthy referred to her meeting with Mr. Stevenson discussing the The Trevor Project's concerns. She noted describing their complaint process if the organization wants to make a complaint about any specific licensee, noting prosecution reviews every single complaint and routinely investigates complaints with the use of their investigators.

Ms. McCarthy stated prosecution cannot review past complaints, because it is confidential until formal charges are filed or formal Board adjudications are issued. She noted not being aware

of any Board adjudications on this topic, but if they
do become aware of the specific licensees and
specific complaints, the matters will be
investigated.

Ms. Martin referred to Ms. Byrd's comment of conversion therapy being an unethical practice according to the social work code and asked whether she had the number of the social work code that says it would be unethical practice. Mr. Barrett did not want to go down a path where the Board is reaching predetermined legal conclusions on the interpretation of their law. He wanted to ensure the Board does not give an opinion on an issue that may come before the Board in a hypothetical or advisory situation.

Mr. Barrett explained that any complaints before the Board will be in the form of an order to show cause detailing the section a licensee is charged with violating, noting the Board will have time to review those allegations. He again noted that anyone who is aware of any violations should report those to PCO for enforcement. He further explained that prosecution will make a decision as to whether a violation has occurred, and then the Board will be able to determine that decision based on the facts.

Ms. Early requested information concerning the

- 1 repercussions of someone providing conversion therapy
- 2 but not licensed in Pennsylvania or by any other
- 3 board. Ms. Byrd noted there are regular
- 4 repercussions for practicing without a license, but
- 5 | for conversion therapy, if somebody was operating
- 6 within their professional scope, like a faith
- 7 practitioner, it would depend on the law itself for
- 8 conversion therapy. She mentioned someone under a
- 9 local ordinance might go to the county, where there
- 10 is a fine, specifically in Allegheny County.
