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7 Report of Board Counsel

[Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the Board will be discussing consent agreements in executive session along with agenda items 13 through 16 and 23 through 34. She also noted the hearing today at 1:00 p.m.

Ms. Wucinski addressed the on-going discussion of a proposed regulation regarding the qualifications of supervisors. She noted the current push to not create regulations that result in barriers to licensure and suggested that any amendments to require additional hours of continuing education courses for supervisors be contained within the 30 hours of continuing education that is already required for license renewal. Ms. Wucinski suggested that the Board create required topics of courses, within the 30 hours, for those licensees who wish to become supervisors. Ms. Wucinski explained that this would keep the proposed regulation within the continuing education

requirements that already exist and not create additional requirements for those individuals who want to provide supervision..

Chair Cardone commented that the Board would like supervisors of candidates for licensure to have qualifications beyond tenure in the profession.

Ms. Wucinski noted her concern with the current difficulty individuals face in trying to find supervisors. Ms. Wucinski commented that increasing qualification requirements for licensees who are willing to supervise may result in additional problems, especially since individuals are not going to be able to work independently while completing their supervision hours. She noted problems with individuals who received supervision from out of state, where their supervisor does not have the extra qualification required by our state.

Ms. Wucinski suggested the Board choose certain topics for supervisors as part of the existing continuing education requirements. She noted that licensees cannot be punished if their supervisor did not complete the required CE courses by being denied licensure; however, if the supervisor checks a box stating that they completed the required continuing education course when they did not complete the

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courses, it could result in disciplinary action against the supervisor for providing fraudulent information to the Board.
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Acting Commissioner Johnson agreed that not everybody should be holding themselves out as supervisors if they are not qualified but noted the importance of notifying people of the requirements for their supervisors coming to the state as well.

Dr. Corby believed it is important for those who supervise to have training. She noted prior discussion regarding a checkbox on the renewal and suggested putting information on the actual application that the supervisor signs noting their completion.]

[Christian Jordal, Ph.D., LMT, entered the meeting at 10:19 a.m.]

Chair Cardone noted the requirement to be a separate course or a series of courses that the supervisor would take totally independent of CEs. She commented that organizations could look at developing courses, and it would not be the responsibility of the Board.

Ms. Keisling was in favor of supervisors being properly trained but expressed a concern with limiting the availability of adequate supervision to prospective licensees to the point where people cannot get licensed.

Ms. Wucinski noted the importance of keeping the training widely available.

Dr. Corby stated supervisors must complete either a 3-credit semester graduate course in supervision or an organized training program in clinical supervision covering theories and models of supervision, cultural issues in clinical supervision, legal and ethical issues in supervision, methods and techniques of supervision, and supervisory relationship issues.

Acting Commissioner Johnson noted the importance of licensees having access to the training and not creating barriers.

Dr. Santiago noted that the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC) has training for supervision after an individual has 45 credits. She believed courses were relatively easy to find.

Johanna Byrd, ACSW, IOM, CAE, Executive Director,
National Association of Social Workers, Pennsylvania
Chapter, addressed availability and her own experience
and knowledge in another state regarding supervisory

courses. She was positive that NASW and other continuing education providers would institute the courses that would be required for the state of Pennsylvania.

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Chair Cardone commented that the NASW system was similar to the Board's discussion of taking the continuing education which could count towards continuing education if an individual chooses to be a supervisor and then periodically require additional CEs. She commented that the Board will continue to have committee meetings to discuss this issue.

Chair Cardone mentioned including this in the revisions to the regulations that Ms.

Montgomery was working on. Ms. Wucinski commented that this will further delay the general revisions. Chair Cardone noted the importance of reviewing the regulation revisions by Ms. Montgomery before the next regulatory process.

Ms. Wucinski addressed changes in the office, where Board counsel was responsible for their own regulations, and regulatory counsel will be more an expert in the drafting and language and getting it through the process.

Ms. Wucinski addressed the proposed regulation regarding requirements for licensure by endorsement.

She suggested including language that addresses the 1 2 education and experience of those coming in from other 3 states. She noted that the proposed regulation should have "substantially equivalent" language as opposed to 4 5 the Board accepting any education or supervised 6 experience. She also suggested putting a timeline on how long individuals must be licensed in the other state in order to apply for licensure by endorsement in Pennsylvania. She noted that in order to change 10 the current requirements for licensure by endorsement, 11 it would require a change to the Board's practice act. Ms. Wucinski noted that the Board cannot open the act 12 13 to change it but instead would have to lobby for that 14 change as individual licensees and not as a Board.

Dr. Corby noted a comment by Ms. Matter last time regarding the need to add a fourth point to state, "must have been actively engaged in practice for 5 of the last 7 years to match the act."

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Ms. Wucinski stated that licensure by endorsement in the act currently requires that individuals meet Pennsylvania's educational requirements and supervised clinical experience requirements which is not really licensure by reciprocity.

Chair Cardone referred to the Association of Social Work Boards Model Social Work Practice Act,

where they modified their Social Work Practice Act to include qualifications for licensure by endorsement and are recommending the states adopt a statement that only requires that individuals have submitted a written application and paid the fee as specified by the Board and presented proof to the Board of an active social work license in good standing.

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Acting Commissioner Johnson mentioned pending legislation in the House of Representatives that would streamline endorsement. He referred to HB 1172, where the Board would be required to grant either a temporary permit until the license is officially granted or grant a license to those with an active license, have no discipline or criminal history, and have paid the requisite fee.

Acting Commissioner Johnson stated that Arizona now grants a license immediately to any out-of-state applicant who is actively licensed in another state. He noted discussion around the country of how Arizona is going to deal with the issue of substantial equivalency for all of their Boards.

Dr. Jordal questioned the definition of substantial equivalency with the educational laws regarding endorsement.

25 Acting Commissioner Johnson stated that Arizona

essentially eliminated substantial equivalency as a factor or as an element in determination and is now the presumption of substantial equivalency by proof of licensure, an active standing, and lack of discipline.

Acting Commissioner Johnson noted Representative
Harry Readshaw to be the correspondent and
Representative David Hickernell as the primary sponsor
of HB 1172, which is moving as a bipartisan bill.

Ms. Wucinski addressed the Board's current standing delegation order. She noted that the Board is only automatically delegating lapsed license cases and continuing education cases. Ms. Wucinski suggested adding to the standing delegation order and including motions to deem facts admitted and petitions for appropriate relief where the Respondent has filed an answer. She suggested an update to the delegation order to reflect those additions.

Chair Cardone requested Ms. Wucinski to provide a draft reflecting additional items with the understanding that the Board has discretion.

Dr. Kraus questioned whether it is possible for the Board to receive data regarding cases and the length of the cases.

Ms. Wucinski noted that she will update the Board on how many cases she is delegating per month.

- 14 | associations that deals with regulatory Boards across
- 15 discipline, jurisdiction, and professions. She noted
- 16 FARB to be more suited for people who are legal versus
- 17 professional counselors.
- 18 Chair Cardone noted FARB to be a macro
- 19 organization for all of the national organizations,
- 20 like the Association of Social Work Boards and the
- 21 equivalence in the other professions and does not see
- 22 any reason to be a member but will research the issue
- 23 a little more.
- 24 Acting Commissioner Johnson also commented that
- 25 FARB is the macro role of the Board itself in how it

regulates and is good for administrative-type questions but will not delve into the finer aspects of each particular profession.

Dr. Jordal questioned whether there is an argument where boards that assume affiliation with a professional organization or accrediting body opens up a liability because of the assumption of endorsement and how it could open up a situation where state boards that basically adopt a professional body sort of standards are being challenged.

Acting Commissioner Johnson mentioned endorsement of a particular standard or scheme as the state Board's standard that has been endorsed by a third party, which he believes is a Commonwealth case.

Ms. Wucinski noted the need to amend the current regulations at Sections 49 Pa. Code 47.71, 48.71 and 49.71 which adopt the code of ethics and practice standards of each national organization. She stated that the NASW, the ACA and the AAMFT update their code of ethics and practice standards frequently. Ms.

21 Wucinski

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mentioned the importance of stating what year of the code of ethics and practice standards the Board adopts. She also stated that people cannot be prosecuted for something the Board has not adopted.

Ms. Wucinski mentioned needing a possible amendment to the Board's regulations at 49 Pa. Code 48.3(1) where the Board requires that a supervisor hold a license as an MFT and receive certification as an approved supervisor or supervisor—in—training by the American Association for Marriage and Family Therapy (AAMFT). Ms. Wucinski noted that the language may need to be changed to state "or an equivalent" to give supervisors more options instead of requiring certification from a private organization that charges a lot of money for that certification.

Chair Cardone noted this to be a constant cycle of revising the regulations in order to catch up when NASW changes their code of ethics and then the next year AMFT changes theirs. She suggested sticking to one year for a number of years because the revisions are substantive.

Dr. Corby requested approval to attend the AMFTRB Meeting September 18-19, 2019 in Minneapolis, MN. She also requested approval for Dr. Jordal to go as well.

10 | [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted a

11 recent meeting with chief counsel regarding the amount

12 of time spent on phone calls and emails. Ms. Wucinski

13 stated that she and Ms. Matter worked on updating the

14 FAQs and will be putting FAQs on the Board's website.

15 | She mentioned updating the FAQs due to Act 76 because

16 it is one of the main reasons people call.

17 Dr. Corby referred to a question regarding

18 | licensed marriage and family therapist (LMFT), where

19 it reads, "hold less than a 48 semester or 72 quarter

20 hours master's degree, am I eligible for licensure."

21 | She suggested getting rid of that paragraph and

22 replacing it with the next bolded paragraph.

23 Chair Cardone questioned whether it is

24 appropriate for the Board to advise people to contact

25 their professional organizations because most social

workers do not earn enough to have a private attorney on retainer.

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Ms. Wucinski stated that the Board should not direct individuals to the national organization, as it may be interpreted as the Board saying whatever that national organization says is the answer.

Acting Commissioner Johnson noted that organizations do not hold themselves financially culpable for giving wrong advice. He stated that an attorney is required by law and ethical responsibility to provide a reasonable competent opinion upon which a client can rely upon, which protects the person seeking advice. He stated that a supplementary opinion from an association does not hurt, although individuals cannot get their money back from an association if they do not get their license.

Acting Commissioner Johnson commented that the Board is ahead of the game regarding the website and updating the FAQs and will be a model conversation for the other Boards moving forward.

Chair Cardone thanked Ms. Wucinski and Ms. Matter for their work on the FAQs.

Dr. Corby referred to a question that read, "when may I begin my 3000 hours." Dr. Corby suggested changing this to "when may I begin counting or

accruing my 3000 hours." She also referred to question, "how many hours per week must I work in order for the supervised clinical experience to be accepted." She suggested changing it to "how many clinical hours per week must I work in order for the supervised clinical experience to be accepted."

Dr. Kraus referred to a section that needed clarity regarding licensed professional counselors (LPCs) where it read, "for every 40 hours of clinical experience you must have at least 1 hour of individual supervision and 1 hour of group supervision." He and Ms. Matter noted it to read, "for every 40 hours of clinical experience you may have at least 1 hour of individual supervision and 1 hour may be group supervision. "If working 20 hour per week, 1 week you may have 1 hour of individual and next week you may have 1 hour of group supervision."

Dr. Santiago referred to the question that read, "what are the qualifications for a supervisor to supervise the 3000 hours of supervised clinical experience" and suggested switching the paragraphs in the answer.

Dr. Corby referred to the question that read, "what duties must my supervised clinical experience contain," noting a section that read, "please note

- that the above 7 experiences should involve direct client contact." The remainder of the clinical experience must be related to work with clients. She questioned what "supervision of another marriage and family therapist related to practice" meant.
- Dr. Corby suggested removing that section. She also suggested removing "group or peer supervision related to practice."
 - Ms. Matter noted that they are also listed for professional counselors and clinical social workers, and they will be removed.

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- Acting Commissioner Johnson noted confusion under \$ 48.13(b)(1) of the regulation, where it reads, "at least one-half of the experience shall consist of providing services in one or more of the following areas." He questioned whether that is 750 hours or is it one-half of the experience?
 - Ms. Keisling suggested changing it to "at least 1,500 hours (one-half of 3000-hour clinical experience)."
 - Dr. Elberfeld suggested placing bullets for clarity in the answer section of the question that read, "how many hours per week must I work in order for supervised clinical experience to be accepted?"

 She also suggested changing "supervised work activity"

to "supervised clinical work activity."
