3 * * * 1 State Board of Social Workers, 2 3 Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors 4 5 September 1, 2020 * * * 6 7 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 8 with Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the 9 10 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 11 a number of matters that are currently pending before 12 the Board and to receive the advice of Counsel. The 13 Board returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 14 15 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 16 Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists, and Professional Counselors was held on 17 18 Tuesday, September 1, 2020. Joy E. Corby, Ph.D., 19 LMFT, Chair, called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. * * * 20 [Chair Corby welcomed Dr. Erika Evans. She announced 21 2.2 this was Ms. Cardone's last meeting and thanked her 23 for all of her hard work and service on the Board.] * * * 24 25 Introduction

[Chair Corby requested Board members and the public 1 2 introduce themselves.] * * * 3 4 [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the meeting was being recorded, and those who remain on 5 6 the line were giving their consent to being recorded.] 7 * * * 8 Report of Board Prosecutorial Division 9 [Heather J. McCarthy, Esquire, Board Prosecution 10 Liaison, welcomed new Board member, Dr. Erika Evans. 11 She also stated it had been a pleasure to work with 12 Ms. Cardone. She presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 16-69-00574.1 13 * * * 14 15 Report of Board Counsel 16 [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 17 executive session from 9:00 a.m. until 10:30 a.m., 18 where the Board discussed one Consent Agreement and 19 agenda items 4 through 16. She also noted the 20 Bachelor of Social Work license regulations are 21 currently in effect, which were published as final on 22 August 29, 2020.] 23 * * * 24 Report of Board Chairperson - No Report 25 * * *

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1 [Renee J. Cardone, MSW, LCSW, commented that serving 2 on the Board had been one of the highlights of her 3 professional career. She thanked everyone for being 4 great colleagues, noting it had been a pleasure to 5 serve with the Board.

6 Dr. Corby again thanked Ms. Cardone for all she7 had done.

8 Ms. Cardone addressed practice monitors relating 9 to proposed consent agreements, noting prior 10 discussion on the importance of supervision and 11 credentials in supervision. She questioned how the 12 Board would assess whether someone was appropriate to 13 supervise licensees.

Ms. Wucinski explained that most Boards defer to the prosecution division, who look for licensees in good standing with the Board. She commented that the Board has relied on the prosecution division approving practice monitors. However, the Board can choose a certain process and relay that to the prosecution division.

Ms. McCarthy noted the issue does not come up very often with the Board, which is why there had not been more of a procedure in place. She explained the procedure and offered to rewrite those to the Board's preference.

6 Ms. Wucinski stated that the practice monitor 1 2 does not have to rise to the standard of a clinical 3 supervisor, noting most Boards only look for whether 4 the individual has licensure in good standing. She mentioned that the whole idea of someone looking over 5 6 or checking someone's work is to make sure prior 7 disciplinary issues are not continuing to occur. Ms. Keisling recommended avoiding placing the 8 Board in a position where they are delaying resolution 9 10 of issues because of the need to make a decision on 11 the monitor, which would slow the processes. 12 Ms. Wucinski stated that the prosecution division 13 takes the responsibility off the Board by looking at 14 the curriculum vitae (CV) to ensure the person is an 15 acceptable practice monitor and suggested the Board 16 should continue that process. 17 Chair Corby commented that the Board does not 18 want to add any restrictions to slow the process, 19 noting that counsel would be able to approve the best 20 candidate.] 21 * * * 22 Report of Commissioner 23 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of 24 Professional and Occupational Affairs, thanked the 25 Board for their hard work over the past several

months. He welcomed Dr. Evans and formally 1 2 congratulated her on the appointment to the Board. He 3 described the Board as a magnanimous group of 4 individuals who are deeply committed to the work and 5 obligation of protecting the public and providing 6 information to the regulated community, members of the 7 public, stakeholders, and colleagues in the legislature with regard to maintaining high standards 8 9 in the profession. Commissioner Johnson wished Ms. Cardone the best 10 11 and thanked her for the extraordinary influence she 12 left during her time on the Board. He thanked 13 everyone for all their work on behalf of all of the citizens of the commonwealth and offered thoughts and 14

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15 prayers to frontline workers. He also thanked Ms. 16 Matter, Ms. Wucinski, staff at the bureau, and the 17 prosecutorial counsel who continue to process 18 applications and answer questions to folks in the 19 community.]

25 Correspondence

8 [Sandra E. Matter, Board Administrator, noted 1 2 correspondence from Janine Mariscotti, MSW, LCSW, 3 Assistant Professor at La Salle University, requesting 4 the Board to permit individuals in their final 5 semester in the MSW program to be able to sit for the 6 exam while their school is in candidacy. She 7 commented that there would be a lot of extra 8 administrative work. 9 Dr. Jordal stated the Board may not have the 10 regulations or infrastructure to support the request. 11 Dr. Kraus commented that the responsibility belongs to the institution of higher education and not 12 the state. 13 Dr. Santiago mentioned that responsibility should 14 15 be on the program and not on the Board. Ms. Wucinski requested the Board provide a 16 response, clarifying that there is no provisional 17 license for the students. She also noted the answer 18 19 would be "no" as to whether students in an 20 unaccredited program could take the Association of 21 Social Work Boards (ASWB) Licensed Social Worker (LSW) 2.2 Exam during their last semester of the unaccredited 23 Master of Social Work (MSW) program.

24 Commissioner Johnson expressed concern of the 25 Board wading into advisory opinions. He noted the

administrative burden placed on the Board and understood there will be limitations in the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) to put these folks in a holding pattern. He requested Ms. Matter explain how requests were handled in the past procedurally.

Ms. Matter explained the process.

Commissioner Johnson noted the importance of 8 9 being clear that the Board is not advising the 10 institution to act in a certain way. He stated the 11 Board could not prohibit them from offering this test 12 but that the Board cannot condition any guarantees 13 based on the passage of the examination because the 14 Board does not know what is going to happen within the 15 next four years.

16 Chair Corby stated that the requirement of having 17 graduated from an accredited program in order to take 18 the test or apply for licensure had not been met.

Ms. Wucinski and Ms. Matter will work together on drafting a response.]
