It was noted that at the AMFTRB there was discussion regarding how to assess competency of a supervisor, that many states determine it by licensure. It was further noted that per the ACS Credential the majority of those who have the licensure are social workers. There was further discussion regarding supportive data related to what makes a competent supervisor. It was stated that 17 states recognize the approved clinical supervisor credential from NBCC, CCE. It was stated the regulations Ms. Montgomery has will be sent to the Board for review, after which a meeting will be held regarding the language prior to the next Board meeting on November 22, 2019, at 8:30 a.m. A separate committee meeting would then be held regarding the supervisory requirements.

Dr. Corby and Dr. Jordal attended the recent AMFTRB (Association for Marriage and Family Therapy Regulatory Board) conference and reported on some of the topics of discussion. Dr. Corby learned that it was mentioned that the Institute for Justice was taking on cases for free dealing with deregulation matters. Dr. Corby noted how to assess competency of supervisor and tele therapy was also discussed. Counsel noted there are currently several therapy

bills and would provide that information to Board

Dr. Corby also learned that VA providers do not have to be licensed in different states. She reported that trainings are being held to help understand licensure and supervision. She suggested that the Board receive training in the matter. It was noted

that other Boards are holding conferences where
members can interact with potential applicants and
licensees, as well as educational institutions. Dr.
Corby suggested that this board look into doing
similar things. Some discussion ensued with agreement
that further discussion regarding these matters would

take place at a future meeting.

Dr. Corby emphasized the need for clear policy and standardized practices and guidelines for denying licenses. She also commented that Boards were encouraged to make sure that actual discussions during meetings be included in the minutes. Dr. Corby reported that for the AMFTRB licensure examination, the test centers would be changing back to Prometric Testing and that examination questions would be reduced from 200 questions to 180 questions. Dr. Corby clarified that codes given to examinees is their permanent code for every time the examination is taken.

Dr. Corby noted the AMFTRB decided years ago that a person who fails the exam three times in a year cannot take the exam for another 12 months. States are encouraged to make regulations regarding that.]
