Renee J. Cardone, MSW, LCSW, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:35 a.m. 11 \* \* \* 12 13 [Chair Cardone requested that the Board, Board staff, 14 and audience members introduce themselves for the 15 record.] \* \* \* 16 17 [Amy K. Keisling, LCSW, and Kurt L. Kraus, LPC, exited 18 the meeting at 9:37 a.m. for recusal purposes.] \* \* \* 19 20 Report of Prosecutorial Division 21 [Amanda Wojciechowski, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 22 presented a Consent Agreement for Case No. 19-69-23 008560.1 \* \* \* 24 25 [Amy K. Keisling, LCSW, and Kurt L. Kraus, LPC, re-

entered the meeting at 9:38 a.m.] 1 \* \* \* 2 3 [Heather J. McCarthy, Esquire, Board Prosecution 4 Liaison, on behalf of Tara Wikhian, Esquire, Board 5 Prosecutor, presented a Consent Agreement for Case No. 6 14-69-05131 and Case No 18-69-001869.] \* \* \* 7 8 Report of Board Counsel 9 [Dana Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted items 10 for discussion during Executive Session. She noted 11 hearings scheduled for 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m.] \* \* \* 12 13 Report of Board Chairperson 14 [Renee J. Cardone, MSW, LCSW, Chair, reported she will 15 be attending the Association of Social Work Boards 16 (ASWB) meeting in Orlando, Florida, November 7 - 9, 17 2019.1 \* \* \* 18 19 Report from Other Board Members 20 [Renee J. Cardone, MSW, LCSW, Chair, noted prior 21 discussion regarding the possibility of conducting 2.2 education sessions for candidates for licensure and 23 current licensees. These education sessions would 24 answer questions regarding the practices and authority 25 of the Board.

Ms. Wucinski suggested that Ms. McCarthy encourage 1 2 the students to attend Board meetings in her 3 presentations at the schools. Dr. Corby discussed the 4 importance of explaining the regulations to students. 5 Johanna Byrd, ACSW, IOM, CAE, Executive Director, 6 National Association of Social Workers, agreed with 7 approaching different student groups and professional organizations for Board presentations. 8

9 Chair Cardone discussed dealing with the costs of 10 such presentations. Acting Commissioner Johnson noted 11 past presentations of the Board that were not well 12 attended. Chair Cardone clarified that the 13 presentations being discussed would be performed by a few Board members, not the whole Board. Acting 14 15 Commissioner Johnson explained the costs to the Board 16 would be similar to approving participation of a Board 17 member to a conference. He discussed conducting 18 presentations at regional meetings.

Dr. Kraus suggested creating a webinar that may be seen by anyone with internet access. There would be no transportation costs, and it would also eliminate an uncomfortable public forum. Chair Cardone reiterated the need for also live presentations. Ms. Byrd outlined the webinars provided by the National Association of Social Workers. She stated

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1 the details can be developed for live presentations.
2 Ms. Martin discussed gathering more interest for the
3 presentations by offering continuing education credits
4 to the different agencies.

Acting Commissioner Johnson noted that the content 5 of the material would not change whether the 6 7 presentation is via webinar or live. The Director of Governmental Affairs can reach out to various 8 stakeholders with contact information. Mr. Johnson 9 10 discussed the capability for broadcast streaming and 11 the archiving of that streaming for continued access. 12 He recapped the process for advertising these 13 presentations. Dr. Elberfeld suggested inviting the 14 members to view the setup of the videotaping. Mr. 15 Johnson outlined the crafting of the webinar 16 presentation.

17 Chair Cardone suggested videotaping one of the 18 Board meetings. The Board discussed developing a 19 format for a webinar for the Board's consideration. 20 Mr. Johnson explained that the Board Administrator 21 would work with him and the State's staff for the 22 development and videotaping of a webinar.

Chair Cardone inquired as to volunteers to serve on a committee to development the format for a webinar. Dr. Corby, Dr. Kraus, and Dr. Elberfeld

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volunteered to serve on the committee.] 1 2 CHAIR CARDONE: 3 So can we have a motion to create a committee to explore setting up a 4 5 webinar to educate the public about the 6 work of the Board? 7 MS. KEISLING: 8 So moved. 9 CHAIR CARDONE: 10 Second? 11 ACTING COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 12 Second. CHAIR CARDONE: 13 All those in favor? All those opposed? 14 15 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 16 17 Report of Commissioner 18 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 19 Professional and Occupational Affairs, updated the 20 Board on the upgrades to the streaming technology, modernizing the Board rooms, and analyzing the 21 22 utilization of the new technology. He discussed the 23 possibility for off-site candidate interviews. 24 Mr. Johnson reviewed changes in operational hours 25 for the Department of State buildings. Capitol Police

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Officers will be handling the onsite security. 1 Kiosks 2 and entrance to the buildings will be shut down at 3 4:00 p.m. Mr. Johnson outlined changes in protocol for entry into the buildings commencing on November 1, 4 5 State ID badges must be presented or visitor 2019. 6 credentials obtained for entry. Capitol Police will 7 be patrolling the facilities.

Chair Cardone thanked the Commissioner and staff 8 9 for their assistance with getting the Board's agenda 10 online. She discussed the inability to open agenda 11 documents. Acting Commissioner Johnson reviewed the steps of staff to troubleshoot and resolve similar 12 issues. He also discussed the procedure for updating 13 14 and changing passwords every 60 days, as well as the 15 security processes.] \* \* \* 16 17 [K. Chair 21 Cardone suggested placing announcements regarding 22 conforming to the scope of practice on the Board's 23 website to address the matter. Ms. Wucinski asked for direction from the Board 2.4 25 in responding to the correspondence, possibly taking

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the correspondence under advisement or drafting 1 2 regulations to address ESA. Dr. Santiago discussed different positions on ESA. She suggested considering 3 4 the guidelines of the Council on Social Work 5 Education's (CSWE) Minority Fellowship Program (MFP), 6 as well as the counselors, psychologists and medical 7 practitioners. There is no consensus on the 8 quidelines for ESA.
