3 \* \* \* 1 2 State Board of Social Workers, 3 Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors 4 December 11, 2018 5 \* \* \* 6 7 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 8 Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family 9 Therapists, and Professional Counselors was held on 10 Tuesday, December 11, 2018. Renee J. Cardone, MSW, 11 LCSW, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:43 a.m. \* \* \* 12 13 Approval of Minutes of the October 30, 2018 meeting CHAIR CARDONE: 14 15 I would like to ask for approval of the 16 draft minutes or any revisions to the 17 minutes. 18 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 19 CHAIR CARDONE: 20 Other questions or additions? Can we 21 have a motion to approve the minutes? 22 MS. PAINTER: 23 So moved. 2.4 DR. JORDAL: 25 Second.

CHAIR CARDONE: All those in favor? All those opposed? [The motion carried. Dr. Osundeko, Dr. Elberfeld, and Mr. Gallick abstained from voting on the minutes.] \* \* \* Report of Board Prosecutorial Division [Heather J. McCarthy, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 15-69-14643.1 \* \* \* [Tara J. Smith, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 18-69-008393.] \* \* \* Report of Board Counsel [C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted a Motion to Deem Facts Admitted for discussion in Executive Session.] \* \* \* Report of Regulatory Board Counsel [Cynthia K. Montgomery, Esquire, Deputy Chief Counsel for the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, discussed the Proposed Preamble and Annex to the General Revisions regulation (16A-6923), which had been approved by the Board in 2015. She also noted the passage of the Suicide Prevention Continuing Sargent's Court Reporting Service, Inc.

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1 Education Act and its effect on the Board.

2	Ms. Montgomery noted the policy changes made by
3	the Board. Ms. Matter and she reviewed and updated
4	the draft regulation. Ms. Montgomery informed the
5	Board of her monthly meetings with the Office of
6	General Counsel and the Governor's Policy Office to
7	work on eliminating burdensome regulations.

8 Ms. Montgomery defined HIPAA as the Health 9 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act and 10 discussed the associated rules and regulations, 11 including HIPAA privacy and security rules. She 12 discussed changes to the definition of supervisee in 13 § 47.1. She also noted that Ms. Matter suggested that 14 the definition of the word "year" be added.

15 Ms. Montgomery reviewed § 47.1a, Qualifications for Supervisors, with the addition "of individuals 16 pursuing a clinical social work license" to clarify 17 the Board's intent on the matter. She further 18 19 explained, to be a supervisor, an individual must hold 20 a current license as a clinical social worker in the 21 state where the supervisee's experience is occurring 2.2 and have 5 years of experience within the last 10 23 years or hold a current license in a related field in 24 the state where the supervisee's experience is 25 occurring.

Ms. Montgomery stated § 47.12, Qualifications for Licensure, had been updated to the fact that paper applications are no longer accepted and individuals must submit an application for licensure and supporting documents on forms and in the format required by the Board through the Pennsylvania Licensing System.

Ms. Montgomery addressed § 47.12c, Licensed 8 9 Clinical Social Worker, regarding supervised clinical 10 experience, including direct client services and 11 whether the service has to be in person or not. She 12 suggested leaving the language as direct client 13 services, which is open for interpretation, and for 14 the Board to consider undertaking a more global 15 regulation on the question of teletherapy, both active 16 practitioners and those doing the hours of clinical 17 experience. The Board decided to leave language as direct client services. 18

Ms. Montgomery further commented that this proposed rulemaking would be published for public comment and then from educators and from the associations.

Ms. Montgomery noted § 47.12c, which addresses
Electronic Supervision, whereby a supervisor cannot
provide supervision of the clinical experience to more

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1 than 6 supervisees.

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2	Chair Cardone questioned the importance regarding			
3	group supervision being concurrent with individual			
4	supervision. Dr. Corby explained the difference			
5	between group supervision and individual supervision,			
6	which must be done concurrently.			
7	Claudia J. Dewane, D.Ed., LCSW, BCD, Associate			
8	Professor, College of Health Professionals and Social			
9	Work, Temple University, stated the original			
10	regulation did not require the concurrency. Dr.			
11	Dewane did not see any benefit with supervision being			
12	concurrent, noting the financial burden on individuals			
13	to pay for group and individual supervision			
14	simultaneously.			
15	Ms. Montgomery noted a general consensus of the			
16	Board to delete the example but to leave in the			
17	language that group supervision must be done			
18	concurrently.			
19	The Board discussed changes to § 47.12d,			
20	Standards for Supervisors, and §§ 47.12e and 49.13a			
21	regarding Electronic Supervision.			
22	Ms. Montgomery addressed § 49.15, noting the			
23	deletion of language regarding exemption from			
24	licensure examination.			
25	The Board discussed § 49.32, continuing education			

8 requirements for biennial renewal, with the addition 1 of at least 1 clock hour to be in the assessment, 2 3 treatment, or management of suicide risks. Ms. Montgomery discussed § 49.33, acceptable 4 5 continuing education courses and programs. The Board 6 decided to include and clarify online courses, as well 7 as provide a clarification of a synchronous webinar, 8 in which the participant is able to interact with the 9 instructor in realtime. 10 Ms. Montgomery discussed § 49.35 regarding 11 standards for courses and programs, which changes the 12 minimum duration of a course from 2 hours to 1 hour, 13 and clarifying that the Board will not accept partial credit for a course. 14 15 Ms. Montgomery addressed § 49.36 regarding 16 preapproved providers of continuing education courses 17 and programs for professional counselors. She 18 referred to the paragraph to clarify that entities may 19 sponsor or cosponsor but may not approve continuing 20 education courses or programs. Johanna Byrd, ACWS, IOM, CAE, Executive Director, 21 22 National Association of Social Workers, Pennsylvania 23 Chapter, stated the National Association of Social 24 Workers (NASW) is one of the groups that would be 25 authorized to approve, noting the difference as to

1 whether outside people can be approved. She further 2 explained NASW's approval program to work with other 3 organizations to approve their continuing education 4 (CE) events, which is outside of the organization but 5 provides the approval for CE recipients.

6 Ms. Montgomery explained that "the following are 7 approved providers" meant that these entities all had 8 to submit the course information and the regulations 9 would be changed to recognize the providers that 10 approve CE courses, programs, and workshops of other 11 organizations.

Ms. Martin suggested that "the following entities may sponsor or cosponsor but may not approve" needed to be clarified in § 49.36.

15 Chair Cardone commented that the word "approve"16 is problematic, misleading, and too vague.

Ms. Montgomery will reword § 49.36 for the Board's review.

Ms. Montgomery addressed § 49.37 concerning other sources of continuing education regarding accrual of clock hours. Dr. Corby suggested providing clarification for individuals that they can receive 15 continuing education credits with 1 course. Dr. Corby also suggested changing the language from "offering a course to teaching a course." Chair Cardone agreed

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10 with clarifying the language.] 1 \* \* \* 2 3 [Kurt L. Kraus, Ed.D., NCC, ACS, LPC, exited the 4 meeting at 12:22 p.m.] \* \* \* 5 6 [Ms. Montgomery suggested wording that a writing 7 needed to be published during the biennial period for which the credit is claimed. The Board agreed to 8 9 changing language to the "current period or preceding 10 period." 11 Dr. Elberfeld, to clarify § 49.37a(2), suggested adding per biennium where it refers to a course in 12 13 social work or a related field for a regionally 14 accredited college or university that is credit-15 bearing per biennium. Dr. Corby suggested stating, "May accrue up to 15 of the clock hours required per 16 17 biennium" and utilizing the same language in § 49.37a(4) to be consistent. 18 19 Ms. Montgomery stated that § 47.37, reporting by 20 licensee of hours spent in continuing education; continuing education audit and enforcement, just adds 21 22 the requirements for the course provider to identify 23 whether the course is in person, synchronous webinar, 24 home study, or online. 25 Ms. Montgomery noted that the only change in

§ 47.39, Exemption and Waiver, is to require an 1 2 individual requesting an extension or waiver of the CE 3 requirements to submit their requests at least 30 days 4 prior to the biennial renewal deadline.] \* \* \* 5 6 [Kurt L. Kraus, Ed.D., NCC, ACS, LPC, reentered the 7 meeting at 12:27 p.m.] \* \* \* 8 9 [Ms. Montgomery noted that comparable changes were 10 made in §§ 48.13(a) and 49.13(a), which incorporated 11 the change made in Act 76 for marriage and family therapists and professional counselors, that clinical 12 13 supervision must be after a Master's Degree is 14 granted. 15 Ms. Montgomery commented that when the 16 regulations were drafted, there was only Chapter 47, which included social work, clinical social workers, 17 18 marriage and family therapists, professional 19 counselors and then added bachelor social workers. 20 She noted that marriage and family therapists were 21 given Chapter 48 and professional counselors, Chapter 2.2 49.1 23 \* \* \* 24 [Jeanne Elberfeld, M.D., LSW, exited the meeting at 25 12:30 p.m.]

12 \* \* \* 1 [Ms. Montgomery stated that not all of the provisions 2 3 for Chapter 47 were copied over into Chapter 48 and 4 Chapter 49 and were just copying over the sections 5 allowing marriage and family therapists and 6 professional counselors to form multipurpose 7 professional corporations with other licensed professions and to use fictitious names.] 8 9 \* \* \* 10 [Jeanne Elberfeld, M.D., LSW, reentered the meeting at 11 12:34 p.m.] \* \* \* 12 13 [Ms. Montgomery commented that most Boards develop a 14 newsletter article for regulation changes or post a 15 notice on their website. She stated this proposed rulemaking would be published in the bulletin for 16 17 public comment. The Board can put notices on the 18 website or do an email blast with the Pennsylvania 19 Licensing System (PALS) on the regulation becomes 20 final. 21 Ms. Guilfoyle commented that whenever there is a 22 change in the law or the regulations, prosecution 23 allows a grace period and nobody will be prosecuted 24 the first time for not following a change. 25 Dr. Corby questioned § 49.2 regarding educational

requirements for professional counselors, stating that 1 2 there was no provision for a certain number of direct 3 contact hours. Ms. Montgomery will revise § 49.2, educational requirements, to state a minimum of 240 4 hours of supervised direct client contact with 5 6 individuals, couples, and families.] \* \* \* 7 8 [The Board recessed from 12:46 p.m. until 12:58 p.m.] 9 \* \* \* 10 Appointment - Office of General Counsel Mediation 11 Program [Bridget K. Guilfoyle, Esquire, Board Prosecution 12 13 Liaison, discussed the process for cases to be brought 14 before the Board through a consent agreement or a 15 proposed adjudication from the Hearing Examiner's 16 Office. She explained that attempts are made to 17 settle the case between the prosecution office and 18 either the respondent or the respondent's counsel. 19 She stated many times the prosecution is not 20 successful in getting any type of agreement between 21 the two parties. 22 Ms. Guilfoyle stated the mediation program would 23 involve the prosecutor assigned to the case, the 24 licensee, and the licensee's counsel meeting with a 25 neutral mediator individually, although sometimes

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1 together. She further detailed the mediation process.
2 She noted that the mediation program has been in
3 effect for all Commonwealth agencies since 2002, which
4 was an Executive Order under Governor Schweiker.

5 Ms. Guilfoyle noted that Chief Counsel chose this Board and the State Board of Psychology to try the 6 7 program first, which will decrease the use of expert services that is costly to the Board. 8 She stated the 9 Office of General Counsel has a long list of trained 10 mediators from the Dickinson School of Law or 11 comparable programs. She explained that there would 12 be no cost to either party other than the time that it takes for the Board to review the matter. 13

14 Ms. Guilfoyle stated that the program is 15 voluntary and explained how mediation would affect 16 unrepresented individuals. She anticipates that the 17 mediation process would move cases along faster and 18 avoid appeals. She further discussed the Board's role 19 in the mediation process. She is hopeful that at some 20 point in the future, Boards would have the ability to order a case into the mediation program. 21

Ms. Guilfoyle addressed a Screening Committee of one, where the person could go to mediation and be able to identify the importance of each issue. She requested the Board's support regarding the mediation

program, noting that the job of a mediator is to 1 2 facilitate and come to a common ground, not to 3 advocate or act as an attorney.] CHAIR CARDONE: 4 5 Unless there are other questions, I am 6 going to ask that someone make a motion 7 that we endorse utilizing mediation where the prosecutors think appropriate. 8 9 DR. JORDAL: 10 So moved. 11 DR. KRAUS: 12 Second. CHAIR CARDONE: 13 14 All those in favor? All those opposed? 15 Abstentions? 16 [The motion carried unanimously.] \* \* \* 17 18 Report of Board Chair 19 [Renee Cardone, MSW, LCSW, Chair, noted her attendance 20 at the Association of Social Work Boards (ASWB) 21 Meeting, where the ASWB continues to push forward the 22 issue of mobility. 23 Chair Cardone questioned the requirements for the 2.4 Board to move forward with mobility. Mr. Fritz stated 25 that the only self-imposed barrier the Board would

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1 have is the Board only grants reciprocal licenses to 2 people coming from states whose licensing requirements 3 are similar or stricter than Pennsylvania and the 4 requirement to allow Pennsylvania to have reciprocity 5 in their state.

6 Chair Cardone commented that mobility is good,7 and Pennsylvania must bring down the barriers.

8 Dr. Corby stated that there was no reason why 9 Pennsylvania could not amend the licensure by 10 endorsement.

11 Chair Cardone referred to the Model Social Work 12 Practice Act, which essentially gives the state 13 language, for the Board's review. Chair Cardone 14 questioned the Board's next step if the Board agreed 15 to put the Model Social Work Practice Act into effect. 16 Mr. Fritz recommended that the Board lobby the 17 legislature and/or the association.

Chair Cardone stated that this matter will be 18 19 revisited again after reviewing whether a new law is 20 needed or if there is some way to incorporate it into 21 Ms. Montgomery's material.] \* \* \* 2.2 23 Report of Commissioner - No Report \* \* \* 24 25 Report of Board Administrator
