MS. WUCINSKI:

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Agenda item 6 is listed as a vote to ratify Act 53 of 2020, our list of criminal offenses. This was on our agenda at the October 13 meeting. We had a full discussion with the Commissioner, discussing the crimes of violence, sexual crimes, and crimes related to the profession.

The Board discussed and agreed to add additional crimes to the list, which I did add following the Board meeting.

I emailed those to the Board members and received responses back, the majority of which was to approve it as amended. I have it on here today to have a vote to ratify this list so the Commissioner could then publish.

CHAIR CORBY:

May I have a motion, please?

[Ms. McCarthy expressed a concern regarding sexual offenses, where social work licensees are not considered, according to case law, health care practitioners or practitioners of the healing arts and requested sexual offenses be categorized as directly

related to the profession. She also requested violent crimes be added to the list of crimes directly related to the practice of social work.

Ms. Wucinski noted prior discussion at the last Board meeting and her review of sexual offenses and violent crimes directly related to the profession.

She reminded Board members that even if there was not a rebuttable presumption, if an applicant comes before the Board with a conviction for a sexual offense related to the profession, that would not bar the Commonwealth from moving forward or the Board denying the application.

Dr. Santiago questioned whether there were any drawbacks to not having the wording "directly related to the profession."

Ms. McCarthy explained that it would benefit the Commonwealth to have the presumption if an offense is on the list and would benefit the licensee to have the presumption that it was not directly related if it was not on the list.

Chair Corby commented that Act 53 will change § 48.12, § 47.12, and § 49.12, where the Board is to consider specific offenses and not good moral character and moral turpitude.

Ms. Wucinski stated Act 53 will replace moral

character, and the Board is not supposed to determine
whether an individual is a good person in their
private life but focus on whether the individual is
fit to hold a license and whether they have committed
a crime related to the profession.

Dr. Jordal questioned whether any unintended consequences may be perceived when case law is established to support all professions, including social work as a healing art.

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Ms. Wucinski expressed a concern with cases being overturned when defending the Board and their decisions in front of the Commonwealth Court when asked how the crime is related to the profession.

Dr. Kraus also expressed a concern with shifting the burden of proof that automatically eliminates the potential for an individual to have been rehabilitated and did not want to add barriers or create a list that was prohibitive.

Commissioner Johnson reminded everyone that the lists are not exclusionary, and the Board would still review all convictions. He explained that the issue was the level of work needed to make the case against the individual and whether the Board wanted to shift that burden to the individual or the Commonwealth.

   Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous
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   [Dana M. Wucinski, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed
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an email from Board members voicing a concern 1 2 regarding the teletherapy waiver during the declared 3 state of emergency. She addressed concerns with 4 teletherapy regarding the abandonment of clients if 5 the waiver abruptly end. She noted a good expectation 6 that the ability to provide teletherapy is not something that will abruptly end and that it would extend at least through the declared state of emergency. It is on the radar of the Department's 10 policy office and will be further reviewed towards the 11 end of the emergency declaration to determine the best 12 course of action.

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Marc Farrell, Deputy Policy Director, Department of State, commented that the waivers granted to date to prevent people from being cut off from care and losing continuity of treatment would carry through the entire pandemic and beyond. He noted a telehealth group working to get some common-sense legislation passed and a mental health group working on getting insurance companies to cover the same as physical health. He expects the COVID waiver to soon be renewed for another 90 days and probably for several more after that.

Dr. Jordal noted being in support of continuing the extension for telehealth but would be more

comfortable with a clear expiration date.

Ms. Wucinski reported the telehealth waiver to be one of the earliest waivers and believed it could be amended if necessary.]

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6 Report of Board Chair

[Joy E. Corby, Ph.D., LMFT, Chair, addressed her and Dr. Jordal's attendance at the Association of Marriage & Family Therapy Regulatory Boards (AMFTRB) Conference in October. She reported on a reduction in the number of questions on the licensing exam showing positive results with an increase in the pass rates. She noted AMFTRB was now capable of providing online live proctoring exams in the future. AMFTRB also reported that the exam was up to the new role delineation study that would be done in the near future. She noted AMFTRB also provided a matrix for sanctions of crimes.
