CONSENT AGREEMENT AND ORDER

The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Bureau of Charitable Organizations ("Bureau") and Grey 2K USA, Inc., ("Respondent") stipulate as follows in settlement of the above-captioned case:

JURISDICTION

- 1. This matter is before the Secretary of the Commonwealth ("Secretary") pursuant to the Solicitation of Funds for Charitable Purposes Act ("the Act"), Act of December 19, 1990, P.L. 1200, No. 202, as amended ("Act"), 10 P.S. §§ 162.1 et. seq.
- 2. At all relevant and material times, Respondent conducted business in Pennsylvania as a charitable organization, as defined by the Act.
- 3. At all relevant and material times, Respondent did not hold a registration to solicit charitable contributions within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 4. At all relevant and material times, Respondent was not exempt from registration or excluded from the requirements of the Act.

STIPULATED FACTS

- 5. Respondent's last known mailing address is P.O. Box 442117, Somerville, MA 02114.
- 6. Respondent solicits charitable contributions in Pennsylvania through direct mail and the internet.
- 7. July 5, 2011, the Bureau sent via certified mail, a request for information including but not limited to the total number of Pennsylvania residents that contributed to Respondent's organization since Respondent first solicited in the Commonwealth, as well as the total amount of contributions received from Pennsylvania residents since Respondent first solicited in the Commonwealth.
 - 8. Respondent mailed a response to the Commonwealth's request on July 8, 2011.
- 9. Respondent's response indicated that Respondent had solicited charitable contributions from Pennsylvania residents periodically since 2001, and received contributions from 791 Pennsylvania residents totaling at least \$98,620.00.

AGREED VIOLATIONS

10. Respondent admits and agrees that by engaging in the foregoing activities it repeatedly violated the Act at, 10 P.S. §162.15(a)(1), by and through 10 P.S. §162.5, by soliciting charitable contributions in Pennsylvania without being properly registered.

PROPOSED ORDER

- 11. The parties, intending to be legally bound, agree to the issuance of the following Order in settlement of this matter:
 - a. Respondent repeatedly violated the Act at 10 P.S. §162.15(a)(1), by and through 10 P.S. §162.5, by soliciting charitable contributions in Pennsylvania without

first being registered.

ADMINISTRATIVE FINE

- b. An ADMINISTRATIVE FINE of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) is levied upon Respondent. Respondent shall tender the sum of ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00) in four installment payments. All payments shall be paid by certified check, cashier's check, attorney's check or U.S. Postal money order made payable to the "Commonwealth of Pennsylvania." Respondent agrees that all payments shall only be made by one of the methods indicated above and shall not be made by uncertified personal or corporate check. The Administrative fine shall be paid as follows:
 - i. Respondent shall tender the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) along with the signed Consent Agreement.
 - ii. Respondent shall make the second payment of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) on or before November 15, 2011.
 - iii. Respondent shall make the third payment of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) on or before January 15, 2012.
 - iv. Respondent shall make a fourth and final payment of two thousand five hundred dollars (\$2,500.00) on or before March 15, 2012.

FAILURE TO MAKE PAYMENTS

c. In the event that Respondent becomes more than thirty (30) days late in making a payment as scheduled the entire remaining administrative fine (i.e. \$10,000.00 minus total payments made) shall become immediately due and payable. Respondent acknowledges that if Respondent fails to make timely payments under this Consent Agreement and the entire remaining administrative fine becomes due and payable, the collection of this administrative fine may be referred to the Office of Attorney General for collection proceedings.

CASE SETTLED AND DISCONTINUED

Order adopting this Consent Agreement and the Respondent's successful completion of the requirements of this Order. However, nothing in this Consent Agreement and Order shall preclude the Prosecuting Attorney for the Bureau from filing charges or the Secretary from imposing disciplinary or corrective measures for violations or facts not contained in this Consent Agreement and Order.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF NOTICE AND WAIVER OF HEARING

13. Respondent waives the filing of an Order to Show Cause in this matter. Respondent knowingly and voluntarily waives the right to an administrative hearing in this matter, and to the following rights related to that hearing: to be represented by counsel at the hearing; to present witnesses and testimony in defense or in mitigation of any sanction that may be imposed for a violation; to cross-examine witnesses and to challenge evidence presented by the Bureau; to present legal arguments by means of a brief; and to take an appeal from any final adverse decision.

AGREEMENT NOT BINDING ON OTHER PARTIES

14. This Consent Agreement is between the Bureau and Respondent only. It does not bind any other governmental or administrative entity of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, including any other bureau within the Department of State. Except as otherwise noted, this Agreement is to have no legal effect if a) the Office of General Counsel expresses an objection to the Agreement's form or legality and/or b) unless and until the Secretary issues the stipulated Order.

EFFECT OF SECRETARY'S REJECTION

15. Should the Secretary not approve this Consent Agreement, presentation to and consideration of this Consent Agreement and other documents and matters by the Secretary shall not prejudice the Secretary from further participation in the adjudication of this matter. This paragraph is binding on the participants even if the Secretary does not approve this Consent Agreement.

ENTIRE AGREEMENT

16. This Agreement contains the whole agreement between the parties; provided, however, that the captions printed in the various provisions of this agreement are for ease of reading only and are not to be interpreted as forming any part of this agreement. There are no other terms, obligations, covenants, representations, statements or conditions, or otherwise, of any kind whatsoever, concerning this Agreement.

AGREEMENT DOES NOT PREVENT REFERRAL TO OTHER AGENCIES

17. The parties acknowledge that other federal, state, and/or local agencies may have jurisdiction over the activities of, or representations made by, Respondent and its officers, directors, agents, employees or independent contractors. Nothing in this Consent Agreement or

the Order based upon this Consent Agreement shall preclude representatives of the Bureau from referring any information or data produced as a result of this matter to any federal, state, or local agency or governmental unit having jurisdiction over the activities of Respondent or any officer, director, agent, employee or independent contractor of the Respondent.

VERIFICATION OF FACTS AND STATEMENTS

18. Respondent verifies that the facts and statements set forth in this Agreement are true and correct to the best of Respondent's knowledge, information and belief. Respondent understands that statements in this Agreement are made subject to the criminal penalties of 18 Pa.C.S. §4904 relating to unsworn falsification to authorities.
