Gerard Halloran, D.C., Chair, called the meeting 10 to order at 9:03 a.m. Roll call was taken.] \* \* \* 11 Approval of Minutes of January 16, 2020. 12 CHAIR HALLORAN: 1.3 14 Has everyone had a chance to look at the 15 Minutes from the last meeting. reviewed those Minutes, and I do not see 16 anything wrong. 20 Report of Board Chair

[J. Gerard Halloran, D.C., Chair, noted the 21

22 Pennsylvania State Board thanked the chiropractic

community for adapting chiropractic offices to run 23

24 under guidelines set out by the Governor's Office and

25 the Pennsylvania State Chief Medical Office, Dr. Rachel Levine. Dr. Halloran indicated chiropractic offices were allowed to remain open during the COVID-19 crisis. He noted the State Board wished to acknowledge all chiropractors who helped their patients and conducted themselves properly within the Pennsylvania State guidelines for operating their offices.

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Dr. Halloran reminded all that the State Board of Chiropractic was a quasi-judicial board and not a legislative board. He noted the appropriate way to communicate was by an email that could be shared by 12 Board Counsel and the Board Commissioner, as well as kept as a record. He commented on recent allegations of unauthorized communication between Pennsylvania Chiropractic Board state members and officers of certain chiropractic organizations for the purpose of making secret decisions, which was not true. noted, as an example, he was asked at the beginning of the COVID crisis to participate in a conference call with one of those chiropractic agencies and refused noting there must be a separation.

Dr. Halloran cautioned all fellow chiropractors about the use of social media. He noted, as an example, regarding the issue of animal chiropractic in the State of Pennsylvania, the Veterinary Board was

clear that animal chiropractor must be done legally within the state under the direct supervision of an attending veterinarian.

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He urged chiropractors to review how their practices are advertised to the public and to assure compliance with the legal, ethical and regulatory requirements of operating a chiropractic practice.

Dr. Halloran requested that chiropractors not use the Pennsylvania State Board as a vehicle to disagree with another member of the chiropractic community. He indicated the Pennsylvania State Board would not be reviewing the day-to-day operations of every chiropractor and assumed that every chiropractor would obey the rules set out by the Governor and Dr. Rachel Levine in the handling of necessary chiropractic patients.

Telemedicine was noted to be approved during the COVID crisis, which allows chiropractors to remotely view home care instructions, activities of daily living, nutritional advice, and exercise instructions.

Dr. Halloran asked all chiropractors to assume for now that 24 hours of State Board approved remote education and child abuse mandated training should be completed by the August 31, 2020 deadline. The Commissioner will inform the Board if an extension is

1 granted.

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Chair Halloran noted, since Nicole Brock left the Board, he took over the Probable Cause Committee and was hopeful that Merry Woods would be able to assume the position.

He lastly noted, despite COVID-19, the annual financial report should be sent in as mandated by the Governor's Office.

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  provide up-to-date information regarding these
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matters.

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In answer to another question concerning licensure extension, Chair Halloran indicated, per Acting Commissioner Johnson, no decision had been made to extend licensing until about six weeks out. The possibilities have not been discussed. There was further discussion regarding the matter.

Chair Halloran noted the Board would work on making sure the minutes of all Board meetings were updated.

It was noted the Governor asked the Board to weigh in on what chiropractic capabilities were with regard to the COVID-19 crisis. The Board did answer the questions, which were provided to the Governor's Office for review.

Mark Farrell, Deputy Policy Director, Pennsylvania Department of State, commented that on May 6 an Executive Order that addressed that issue was signed by the Governor. He noted a portion of that order expanded the scope of practice of dentists, surgeons, athletic trainers, chiropractors, and podiatrists to allow extra responsibilities delegated by an MD or DO during the COVID emergency crisis. This information would be made available to chiropractic organizations or associations, if requested. It was suggested the

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1 information be placed on the Board's website also.
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       Acting Commissioner Johnson commented this Order
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   did not change how patients access their
   chiropractors. For the purpose related to COVID,
  whether administration of tests or treatment, the
  Order is to allow that limited scope of treatment that
  normally would not be in the scope of practice.
  Acting Commissioner Johnson also commented that he had
   wanted to imply earlier there would be some type of
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  delay. Additional information would be available
   through the normal course of communications.
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       A question by Alison Benedetto, D.C., President of
   the PCA, related whether it would be allowable to
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   share updates with the members. Mr. Suter explained
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   that it was an open meeting, the Minutes are recorded,
