- 12 Report of Board Counsel
- 13 [Kenneth J. Suter, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted items
- $14 \mid 4$  and 5 for discussion during executive session.
- Mr. Suter provided an overview of the Sunshine
- 16 Act, noting the basic essence of the act as the sun
- 17 | appearing on what is done as a Board and what the
- 18 Board is not doing in the dark or in secret.
- 19 Mr. Suter stated consent agreements, personnel
- 20 issues, and legal advice of counsel are discussed in
- 21 executive session. He commented that all other
- 22 | matters must take place in public. Mr. Suter is the
- 23 Board's resource and contact regarding any questions
- 24 or concerns.
- 25 Mr. Suter reviewed the recusal guidelines. He

also addressed mandatory recusal. Mr. Suter advised the Board to not consider external information or research upon making a determination on a matter.

Mr. Suter addressed the Commonwealth Court opinion, where the device used by Dr. Lawrence Bennett was not scientific or legitimate. He commented that the Board should be proud of the work and thanked Mr. Maloney, who presented the argument in that case.]

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10 Report of Board Chair

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[Joseph Gerard Halloran, D.C., Chair, addressed the Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards Meeting in San Diego, CA, May 1-5, 2019. He discussed the Federal Sports Medicine Licensure Clarity Act

16 commented that many states state this is a violation

17 of their sovereignty to regulate who is entitled to

regarding licensure issues and portability. He

18 practice any sort of medicine in their state and a

19 practitioner following the guidelines of this federal

20 law may still have legal troubles if they practice

21 without state permission.

Chair Halloran addressed states that have legalized cannabis for medical purposes only, noting that the states will probably not have any federal repercussions, but providers who engage in state legal

cannabis may have some liability if the federal government seeks to keep it criminal.

Chair Halloran stated it is not recommended by the Federation of Chiropractic Licensing Boards at this time to recommend the 0.3% tetrahydrocannabinol (THC) from hemp, which is still considered illegal by the federal government.

Administration (FDA) is insisting on additional studies before reaching conclusions on cannabidiol (CBD) oil being sold commercially out of a chiropractic practice or any other commercial venue. He commented that the issue will need more study by the Board before safely coming up with guidelines for chiropractors who wish to have CBD oil sales out of their offices in this state.

Mr. Suter referred to the Code of Federal
Regulations (CFR) regarding CBD oil. He noted
receiving questions from chiropractors asking if they
can legally use CBD oil, noting that he cannot give
them an answer and believes it is a dangerous issue
for the Board to address as a whole because it is
illegal at the federal level. He also noted it to be
illegal under state law because it is classified as a
Schedule I drug under the Federal Food, Drug, and

Cosmetic Act.

Chair Halloran mentioned that Professor Marianne
Jennings from Arizona State University spoke about
regulatory ethics, where making sure not to cross the
line into politics and firmly separate the Board from
political influence, trade associations, and lobbyists
was emphasized.

Chair Halloran addressed criminal background checks, noting that Pennsylvania does criminal background checks only on new applicants.

Mr. Suter explained that there is a statute that requires individuals to report criminal convictions, and the prosecution office is using a reporting system and does not believe it is necessary with renewal.

Mr. Jarabeck mentioned the Pennsylvania Justice Network (JNET), which is a reporting system that comes directly through the unified judicial system reporting arrests in 67 counties in Pennsylvania. He emphasized the system is Pennsylvania state and county courts, and no data is received from federal courts.

Ms. Roberts noted that criminal history record checks are required for reactivations.

Chair Halloran mentioned a candidate to replace Dr. Khoury and having a review committee to help the Governor's Office vet candidates.

Mr. Suter commented that the Board could have a regulatory committee that works separate and apart from the Board but could not adopt a draft or approve what happens. He checks on backgrounds, but the dynamics and politics involved with that and whether or not the Governor's Office would welcome input could be answered by Acting Commissioner Johnson.

Chair Halloran noted discussion with Dr. Carl
Cleveland from the Cleveland Chiropractic College
concerning preceptorship. He is in the process of
getting preceptorship information from all of the
chiropractic colleges and will share this information
at the next Board meeting. He noted that it is
essential for the Chiropractic State Board to lead on
this issue and start appropriate regulations after
gathering the information to evaluate this issue and
develop rules to guide licensees, clinics, or even a
college program.

Chair Halloran referred to a proposed letter from the State Board of Chiropractic to the State Board of Veterinary Medicine, requesting a joint meeting concerning animal chiropractic. He noted the need to have communication on both sides for mutually acceptable regulations on this issue.
