- 10 | interns to lay hands on a patient and practice
- 11 techniques in Pennsylvania. Only that section of the
- 12 Act would be amended.
- 13 Mr. Maloney discussed recommended changes in the
- 14 language to certify that the student would have an
- 15 internship or externship under the supervision of a
- 16 licensed chiropractor. He noted further discussion
- 17 | regarding the matter would occur during Executive
- 18 | Session.

- 19 Ed Nielsen, MHS, Executive Vice President,
- 20 Pennsylvania Chiropractic Association, was invited to
- 21 address the Board on the matter. Mr. Nielsen stated
- 22 | the idea was to clarify and reestablish the education
- 23 language. Mr. Nielsen noted support from sources
- 24 including New York Chiropractic College (NYCC), the
- 25 Medical Director of the Winter Games for the U.S.

- 1 Olympics Committee, and the American Chiropractic
- 2 Association, all of which will be introduced into the
- 3 record once the hearings commence on House Bill 1737,
- 4 | which he noted is sponsored by Representative
- 5 Ravenstahl.
- He also mentioned a companion bill in the Senate sponsored by Senator Reschenthaler.
- 8 Mr. Nielsen noted the delegation issue has yet to
- 9 be resolved. He noted concerns with regard to opening
- 10 up Act 188. There was discussion regarding the Cavoto
- 11 appeal case.
- Dr. Khoury noted the University of Pittsburgh
- 13 Physical Therapy Department was in collaboration with
- 14 the School of Chiropractic.

- 16 Institutes of Health (NIH) grant was given to the
