Barrett, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a 16 17 Regulatory Status Report on the S-Drive for Board's 18 review, noting there has not been much movement since 19 the last meeting. He mentioned that the massage 20 therapy in a salon regulation would be moving along 21 as proposed very shortly. He noted he would then start on the 120-square foot regulation just to make 22 23 the regulations conform to the actual law. 24 Mr. Barrett addressed House Bill 1014 regarding 25 mobile units. He mentioned there is also a companion

bill regarding barbering, noting the two statutes are
 basically identical other than the word cosmetology
 and barber being exchanged.

Mr. Barrett explained that the bill would allow mobile units to be licensed as salons by the Board but must be at least 24 feet in length and comply with the health and safety regulations established by the Board. He stated the bill was introduced before but did not move and is back in the Professional Licensure Committee.

Mr. Barrett addressed House Bill 591 regarding 12 natural hair braiding.

Mr. Hinsey stated it should be labeled as removing barriers in cosmetology. He noted the bill had been submitted to create a section for blow dry styling related to shampooing, treating, styling of hair, hair pieces, and wigs and establishes a section on eyelash extensions, threading, and makeup applications.

20 Mr. Hinsey mentioned that each of those sections 21 are defined, as well as natural hair braiding, as 22 services that are distinct from cosmetology and a 23 person would not need to be licensed. He noted the 24 definition of makeup application does not include 25 permanent makeup or tattooing and someone solely

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engaging in those practices would not need to be licensed. He explained that it also exempts anyone who provides those types of services from obtaining a salon or facility license to perform the services and would allow them to work in a salon otherwise being licensed.

7 Mr. Hinsey addressed House Bill 328 regarding 8 eliminating the prohibition on booth rentals and 9 essentially takes any booth rental word or site to a 10 booth rental out of the Cosmetology Law.

Mr. Barrett commented that they are all still 11 12 perspective bills and are with the House Professional 13 Licensure Committee but would inform the Board of any 14 movement in the future. He encouraged anyone who 15 would like to make any comments to reach out to their 16 local representatives because the Board has no 17 control over what is enacted through the General 18 Assembly and advised Board members to do so not as a member of the Board.] 19 * * * 20 21 Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations 22 Annual Budget Presentation 23 [Michelle Witmer, Fiscal Management Specialist, 24 Bureau of Finance and Operations, Department of 25 State, presented the annual budget for the State

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Board of Cosmetology. She addressed licensee counts from renewals, noting the Board has a renewal period each year with the larger renewal in January of odd years. She referred to FY20-21 and FY22-23, showing a slight decrease in the license count but reported an increase of 505 licenses as of this morning, giving a total license count of 125,745.

8 Ms. Witmer addressed revenue, noting 89 percent 9 of revenue is from renewals, 6 percent from 10 application fees, and 5 percent from other 11 categories.

Ms. Witmer reported a combined biennial total for the last two fiscal years of \$10,245,555.12 in revenue. She mentioned the Board had a renewal increase go into effect in FY22-23 and would start seeing changes to license fees.

Ms. Witmer addressed expenses, including direct charges, timesheet-based charges, and distribution. She noted the Board was around \$5.4 million in FY21-22 and \$4.3 million as of May 10 and the Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) is anticipating the budget finish the year at \$5,825,000.

23 Ms. Witmer noted BFO is projecting the Board 24 would be coming back into the black in FY25-26 due to 25 renewal and application fee increases this year. She

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mentioned the increase is incremental and would affect FY22-23 through FY25-26, noting the Board is currently showing a final balance of \$20,604.59.] * * * Adjournment CHAIR O'NEILL: We will adjourn our meeting for today. The next meeting is scheduled for July 31. We will see everyone then. Thank you. * * * [There being no further business, the State Board of Cosmetology Meeting adjourned at 11:39 a.m.] * * *
