- 1 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief
 2 Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided a summary of
 3 the prosecution division's caseload during 2021.
- Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 2,333

 cases were opened in 2021, which an increase from 2020

 at 2,128 for the State Board of Cosmetology. She

 reported closing 2,074 cases in 2021 and 1,204 cases

 in 2020 and thanked prosecutors and counsel for all of

 their work in 2021.
 - Ms. DeLaurentis noted 2,194 cases remained open for the Board as of January 1, 2022, which could be spanning different years and could be in various stages.

- Ms. DeLaurentis discussed enforcement actions, noting 355 cases resulted in discipline in 2021 with 28 fines, 269 Act 48 fines or citations, 51 suspensions, 1 automatic suspension, 7 reprimands, 2 voluntary surrenders, and 15 probationary cases. She also reported 500 warning letters in 2021, which was up from 245 in 2020.
- Ms. DeLaurentis addressed COVID-related cases, noting that one complaint may result in more than one case being opened. She reported 1,223 cases were opened regarding COVID complaints in 2020 with 478 of those cases for the State Board of Cosmetology. She

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reported a significant decrease in COVID-related
complaints in 2021, mostly for business-related boards
but an increase in healthcare-related boards with 543
COVID-related cases and 83 of those for the Board.
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Ms. DeLaurentis noted a record number of cases opened last year and thanked the administrative assistants for processing so many files. She reported 18,363 cases were opened in 2021, which is an increase from 2020 at 13,394.

Ms. DeLaurentis reported 15,994 cases were closed in 2021 and 13,274 in 2020. She noted 15,141 open cases as of January 1, 2022.]

20 biennial basis. She reported a license count in FY17-

22 | 130,610. She mentioned that the numbers may fluctuate

23 based on the amount of renewals.

Ms. Richards noted the total biennial revenue with

25 | 95.81% of revenue coming from renewals and

applications. She commented that revenue is brought in from other categories, but the Board cannot count on it because it is not consistent.

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Ms. Richards addressed the two main categories of Board expenses, administrative and legal costs. She stated expenses are incurred through direct charges, timesheet-based costs, and license-based costs. She noted expenses for FY19-20, FY20-21, and expenses as of February 23, 2022. She reported on a recent increase in expenses. She noted the budget for FY21-22, 2022.

Ms. Richards reviewed revenues and expenses, noting the projected remaining balance. She mentioned that the Board had a renewal fee and application fee increase that started in January 2022, noting the projected balance for FY24-25.

Ms. Richards noted Board member expenses in FY19-20, FY20-21 of, and the budget for FY21-22 and the actual expenses as of February 23, 2022. She stated the \$15,000 budget was adequate for FY21-22 and has been transferred over to fiscal year FY22-23.

Ms. Richards reminded the Board that funds not spent is returned to the restricted account for the Board's use at a later time.

   of the regulations or the statute regarding a specific
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question.

Ms. Sacavage and the Board's staff would evaluate her question to determine if a general answer could be provided without giving a legal interpretation of the statue and regulations. She also pointed her toward the Cosmetology Act and regulations on the Board's website.

Kayla Parrish, American Made Nails, requested additional information regarding the lowest space requirement.

Ms. Sacavage stated the requirements are 180 square feet for a cosmetology license, and the Board has the discretion to grant a variance it finds reasonable. She noted that there is no number of square footage the Board is required to adhere to at this time in the statute and regulations.

Ms. Parrish commented that even for just one person, no employees, just herself on her own that it is not sufficient for just manicures. She referred to Chapter 49 Pa. Code § 7.76, where prior to September 15, 1976, about 120 square feet was proven to be sufficient at one point in time, and asked why that space was not sufficient now for one person.

Ms. Sacavage explained that the regulations have changed since 1976 with input from the profession

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regarding what is necessary to maintain a safe
sanitary space, and the Board must adhere to the
current regulations, not the prior one.
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Ms. Parrish commented that it is giving people false hope on how low the Board will go on square footage, because it is in the regulation and should be removed.

Ms. Sacavage stated the regulations require 180 square feet for one licensee in a nail technician salon and an additional amount of square footage for each additional licensee.

Ms. Parrish suggested that there should be a distinction for just manicures and no pedicures.]
