1 Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) in May to notify 2 licensees through email that their actual license has 3 expired.] * * * 4 5 Report of Department of Health - No Report * * * 6 7 Report of Committee on Health-Related Professionals -8 No Report 9 * * * 10 Report of Committee on Legislation/Policy Development 11 and Review - No Report * * * 12 13 Report of Committee on Licensure Qualifications - No 14 Report 15 * * * 16 Report of Board Chair 17 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, Chair, again 18 recognized March as Women's History Month, noting the 19 theme for International Women's Day on March 8 is 20 Embrace Equity. He stated the application process to 21 residency had been the largest match ever in the 22 United States. He referred to a publication on 23 February 16 regarding states with the most medical 24 students enrolled in medical school, where 25 Pennsylvania ranked 4th, New York 1st, Texas 2nd,

1 California 3rd, and Illinois 5th.

Chair Woodland reported over 5,728 students are enrolled in medical school, noting the importance of the physician workforce and moving forward.

5 Chair Woodland stated the well-being of 6 physicians and providers in Pennsylvania is the key 7 issue for many organizations nationally, noting the 8 American Medical Association (AMA) put forth a 9 recovery plan, along with the National Academy of 10 Medicine.

Chair Woodland noted prior Board discussion 11 12 concerning trying to turn the paradigm of mental 13 health inside out and not making it as much of an 14 issue for medical licensure but as an issue of just 15 health and well-being in general. He noted the Board 16 decided to have a presentation at a future Board 17 meeting and would provide Ms. Wray with the 18 information once a presenter is confirmed. Chair Woodland mentioned that the National 19 20 Academy of Medicine published a plan for health 21 workforce well-being that included creating positive 22 work and learning environments, investing in

23 assessment and research looking at well-being,

24 supporting mental health, addressing regulatory and

25 policy barriers, using effective technology, adopting

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1 well-being as an institutional value for every health 2 care facility, and maintaining a diverse and 3 inclusive health care workforce.

4 Chair Woodland addressed work concerning 5 artificial intelligence and how it may impact training for the future as well as medical licensure 6 7 applications. He referred to a publication in the Journal of the American Medical Association (JAMA) by 8 9 the Federation of State Medical Boards (FSMB) 10 highlighting their work on artificial intelligence 11 and how it may impact the educational process all the 12 way to licensure.

13 Chair Woodland again noted the match is on March 14 17 and provided the match results from last year for 15 comparison.

16 Chair Woodland also provided the National 17 Commission on Certification of Physician Assistants 18 (NCCPA) release of the 2021 Statistical Profile of 19 Board-Certified Physician Assistants (PAs) by State 20 and reported Pennsylvania is one of the top employers 21 of PAs in the country.

Chair Woodland addressed FSMB's Annual Meeting, noting the Pennsylvania State Board of Medicine would be presenting a poster abstract on remote and hybrid access and how that has impacted Board member

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attendance, efficiency in the Board meetings, 1 2 productivity, and access for all in different ways. 3 Chair Woodland noted the National Board of 4 Medical Examiners (NBME) is announcing new officers 5 and members elected to its boards. He mentioned the 6 election to be a historic moment for the NBME Meeting 7 with the election of Dr. Reena Karani as the first 8 woman of color to serve as the chair in the 9 organization's 108-year history. 10 Mr. Dillon commented that she is a wonderful choice and noted being excited about the historic 11 12 event.] 13 * * * 14 Appointment - Physician Assistant Program Update 15 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed 16 Chair Woodland of miscommunication between her, the 17 former Board administrator, and Ms. Lammando 18 regarding today's presentation. She offered to 19 communicate with Ms. Lammando and Ms. Wray for a 20 presentation to occur at the April Board meeting. 21 Chair Woodland welcomed Nichole Wray as an interim administrator for the Board.] 22 23 * * * 24 Report of Board Administrator 25 [Nichole Wray, Board Administrator, informed Board

members that they would be receiving correspondence 1 2 electronically and through the mail for the annual 3 Financial Disclosure Statement. She informed the Board members to file with the State Ethics 4 5 Commission under the State Ethics Act as well as through the Office of Administration under the 6 7 governor's Code of Conduct. She mentioned that the 8 deadline is May 1 and recommended Board members file 9 those forms online, noting the information would be 10 saved for the following year and offered to provide 11 those links. 12 Chair Woodland informed Ms. Wray that many of the 13 Board members already filed and asked her to check on 14 anyone who had not completed the forms.] 15 * * * 16 Board Meeting Dates 17 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, Chair, noted 18 the Board approved and voted on the 2023 Board 19 meeting dates, and the 2024 Board meeting dates are 20 also listed for next year.] * * * 21 22 Miscellaneous - Budget - Fee Waiver 23 [Shana M. Walter, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed 24 the budget fee waiver, noting prior Board discussion 25 regarding the Board of Medicine's surplus. She

stated any discussion concerning the fee waiver would 1 2 be tabled until the next renewal period on December 3 31, 2024, but the Board could reassess the surplus at 4 the end of the year to see if any further action 5 would need to be taken regarding the fee waiver.] * * * 6 7 Miscellaneous - FSMB Requests Comments on Draft 8 Reports 9 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, Chair, asked 10 Dr. Ripchinski to summarize any highlights he might 11 have from the FSMB Report. 12 Dr. Ripchinski had nothing new to report but 13 offered to look for the comments, noting the target 14 was the May FSMB Meeting. 15 Chair Woodland commented that he would have some 16 updates at the April meeting.] * * * 17 18 New Business 19 [Mark B. Woodland, M.S., M.D., FACOG, Chair, 20 addressed vacancies for MDs, nurse midwife, and 21 public member. He mentioned the Board is still 22 collecting curricula vitae (CVs) and encouraged 23 anyone who knows someone who may be interested to 24 forward those to the Board. He stated Acting 25 Commissioner Claggett reported progress but a slow

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application process with the change in the 1 2 administration.] 3 * * * 4 Adjournment 5 CHAIR WOODLAND: 6 I need a motion to adjourn. 7 DR. YEALY: 8 I move to adjourn. 9 MR.
