Ms. Howard commented that public support was 1 2 helpful, noting Dr. Johnson has been working on 3 getting the word out. She stated unvaccinated people are getting sick but 99 percent of vaccinated people 4 5 are not requiring hospitalization. 6 Dr. Yealy stated the Board of Medicine has strong 7 and enthusiastic support for vaccination and appropriate mitigation measures.] 9 10 Report of Committee on Health-Related 11 Professionals [Walter A. Eisenhauer, PA-C, referred to a recent 12 13 email thread regarding requests for an increased 14 number of work agreements at a large Philadelphia 15 facility that was overwhelmingly positive but was 16 uncertain of the status. Mr. Dillon addressed a request from Dr. Woodland to touch base on some movement in the area of accrediting of medical schools. He reported a recent decision was made by the Liaison Committee on Medical Education (LCME) which would result in no longer accrediting Canadian medical schools in 2025. He commented that the accrediting process will be taken over solely by the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Schools, which is the Canadian counterpart.

Mr. Dillon stated the decision would impact qualification requirements, and if it ends up being implemented in four years, Canadian medical school graduates who are applying for licensure in Pennsylvania will probably have to take a different pathway that already exist.

Dr. Yealy commented that it would be a potential process change but not a fundamental change in how those particular applicants make it through

Ms. Walter noted she and Ms. Wucinski have been asked to provide a bill analysis and have received comments from members of the Board of Medicine. She mentioned submitting that through the appropriate channels and will keep the Board updated if it moves.

Dr. Yealy commented that the spirit of the proposed legislation is supported and the opportunities are mostly in nomenclature.

Dr. Yealy addressed opportunities for active duty service members and their spouse regarding licensure. He noted it is not within the purview of the Board of Medicine to create any particular rules, regulations, or fee structure but that the Board is supportive of diminishing or removing fee requirements for people who are serving the country actively and their spouses.]
