She suggested that while both the Board and the POA work on a list, that a newsletter be published at the beginning of the year indicating some of the changes to the Practice Act and request that responses be sent to the Board. There was discussion as to whether or not to include the Department of Health in a decision regarding this matter.

Chairperson Chubb was in favor of Dr. Boyer and Dr. Godfrey working with Counsel to have additions to the list without having the Board give final approval for certain medications.

Counsel suggested that a motion be made to delegate authority for Dr. Godfrey and Dr. Boyer to come up with additions to the list and to host a committee meeting to vote on it in public session.

10 referred Board members to Item No. 8 the Contact Lens

11 Rule Amendments for review.

Dr. Wilcox noted the fine for not following the

13 contacts lens rule is \$43,500 and was not listed on

14 the website. Ms. O'Malley will edit the website to

16 Dr. Urbanski noted a second attachment under Item

17 No. 6 on the Report of Board Counsel as an email from

18 Joseph A. Ricci, Esquire, Executive Director,

19 | Pennsylvania Optometric Association requesting clarity

20 on the DEA registrations which was not addressed.

21 Mr. Ricci commented that many doctors dropped DEA

22 certifications when the opioid drugs and derivatives

23 were removed from the formulary because of the

24 reclassification of those drugs from Schedule III to

25 | Schedule II. He stated, since Act 99 had become law

and the opioid drugs that were reclassified were again allowed to be included on the optometric formulary, the concern by members was if an applicant sought a new DEA license, would the applicant be required to have opioid education prior to the renewal of licenses in this license cycle.

Mr. Ricci opined that Act 99 had not become law until after the licensure cycle closed and, therefore, if a member did not hold a current DEA license, there was no requirement for opioid education.

Ms. O'Malley explained that there was not a mechanism after a renewal cycle to have some kind of checkbox to know whether or not the appropriate people obtained appropriate continuing education. Mr. Ricci explained it would not work in that manner. There was further discussion.]

[Chairperson Chubb stated there would be discussion regarding sponsorship of requests that the State Board has received regarding potential licensees asking for sponsorships through the State Board. She stated a number of requests had been received from nonlicensed people seeking licensure in Pennsylvania or sponsorship to obtain licensure in Pennsylvania versus

12 Appointment - Act 53 of 2020

13 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of

14 Professional and Occupational Affairs, had discussion

15 with regard to Act 53 which was signed into law this

16 past June and becomes effective the end of this year

17 which reforms the way that criminal history is used in

18 the determination of licensure. He referred to it as

19 | a modernization of the Criminal History Records

20 Information Act (CHRIA).

21 Commissioner Johnson requested the Board's

22 approval of a list prepared by Board Counsel O'Malley

23 and Deputy Chief Counsel Montgomery so that he can

24 move forward with publication before the effective

25 date of the legislation at the end of the year.]

8 discussion with regard to Act 53 of 2020. She

9 indicated that the Commissioner has the requirement to

10 | publish a notice of the availability of this list by

11 | the December 27 deadline. Ms. Montgomery provided an

12 explanation of the statute and had further discussion

13 of the provisions set forth in Act 53. She noted that

14 after going through the regulatory process there would

15 be public comment and then the matter would be

16 | finalized as final rulemaking within two years.

17 Ms. Montgomery explained that the list could be

18 used for three distinct purposes, including

19 preparation of preliminary determinations as to

20 whether a criminal history may be an impediment to

21 licensure, determining which criminal convictions may

22 result in disciplinary action and determining whether

23 the criminal conviction may result in refusing to

24 issue a license.

25 Ms. Montgomery further explained that individuals

who are convicted of offenses enumerated on the list are presumed to pose a risk to the public. That a crime not on the list would mean the burden would then shift to the Commonwealth to demonstrate why the crime does pose such a risk. Board members had questions.

Commissioner Johnson reiterated for the record that as Counsel has clearly articulated, nothing on the list is a definite preclusion to licensure and something that can't be considered by the Board.
