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* * * 1 2 Report of Prosecutorial Division - No Report 3 Report of Board Counsel 4 5 [Jacqueline Wolfgang, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred 6 the Board to the opioid education notice and verification for review. She discussed updates with regard to the Achieving Better Care by Monitoring All 8 Prescriptions (ABC-MAP) licensure certification. 10 Ms. Wolfgang also discussed therapeutic and 11 glaucoma licensure certification, as well as 12 continuing education for opioids and pain management 13 for practices prescribing or dispensing opioids. 14 Ms. Wolfgang questioned the Board as to whether 15 the 2 hours of opioid education should be attributed to the 6 hours or to attribute the 2 hours to the 16 17 other 24 hours.1 DR. HAIRE: 18 19 I would make a motion that we include 20 these hours in the 24 and be separate 21 from the other therapeutic requirements. 22 CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI: 23 Is there a second?

I would second that.

DR. OLSON:

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CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI:

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Any further discussion on the motion? (The Board further discussed the motion.)

CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI:

So the motion before us is to not include the opioid education in the 6 hours of therapeutic but to count it with the other 24 CE requirements for optometrists. We'll call the question. All those in favor of the motion, signify by saying aye. Opposed? Any abstentions?

[The motion carried unanimously.]

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[Ms. Wolfgang noted the pending legislation, Senate Bill 758, introduced on June 14, 2017 mirrors House Bill 706, which the Board discussed during the May 2017 Board meeting. She further noted that both bills propose to amend the Medical Practice Act by providing a definition of ophthalmic surgery.

Ms. Wolfgang highlighted provisions in Senate Bill 780, the Telemedicine Act, which define telemedicine and outline the providers of telemedicine under the Healthcare Facilities Act. She noted a clarity regarding insurance company reimbursements for

7 telemedicine. 1 2 Ms. Wolfgang discussed the draft General 3 Delegation Order. She explained the circumstances for the Board to delegate matters to a Hearing Examiner.] 4 5 CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI: I'd like to make a motion that our Board 6 accept the General Order of Delegation. Is there a second? 8 CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI: 10 Is there a second? 11 DR. CHUBB: 12 Second. CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI: 13 14 Second Dr. Chubb. Is there any 15 discussion on the motion? Hearing none. 16 We'll call the question. All those in 17 favor, signify by saying aye. Opposed? 18 Any abstentions? 19 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 20 21 Report of Board Chairperson 22 [Chairperson Urbanski welcomed new Board members, Dr. 23 Jeffrey Becker and Dr. Gerry Olson. Both provided a 24 brief summary of their professional backgrounds. 25 Chairperson Urbanski referred to his letter to

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Rachel Levine, Acting Secretary of Health, requesting approval of cetirizine ophthalmic solution that was recently FDA approved for the treatment of ocular allergy associated with allergic conjunctivitis.]

CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI:

Are there any questions on the request?

Otherwise, I would entertain a motion to send this letter to the Secretary for approval of this new medication.

10 DR. BECKER:

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I make that motion.

14 CHAIRPERSON URBANSKI:

Any discussion? Hearing none. All those in favor of the motion, signify by saying aye. Opposed? Any abstentions?

[The motion carried unanimously.]

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[Chairperson Urbanski referred to the Association of Regulatory Boards of Optometry (ARBO) report for further discussion. He and Dr. Haire attended a recent ARBO meeting that focused on regulations in a changing environment.

Chairperson Urbanski noted that Dale Atkinson,

Counsel for ARBO, discussed regulations and new technologies for telemedicine practice.

Chairperson Urbanski updated the Board on the OE TRACKER method. He requested that the Commissioner or Deputy Commissioner update the Board on the PALS system in the near future.

The Chair noted discussion with regard to a survey on the performance of the injections component of the testing by the national board. Mr. Urbanski indicated that Dr. Jill Bryant has taken over as the Interim Executive Director of the National Board of Examiners in Optometry.

Legal challenges were discussed as noted by
Attorney Atkinson, including a group known as the
Institute for Justice which is challenging boards as
barriers to commerce.

Chair Urbanski noted a discussion with regard to boards keeping accurate records and minutes of board activities to value the board's existence. Statutes were addressed relating to reserve board monies being placed into the general fund.

There was discussion regarding the State of
Florida licensure requirements. Chairperson Urbanski
questioned whether the State Board of Optometry's
website was compliant with the Federal law which

mandates that websites be accessible by handicapped individuals. He stated the code review process, decorative contact lenses, Accreditation Council for Continuing Medical Education (ACCME) and CME credit changes, licensure mobility and reciprocity were also discussed at the meeting.

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Luanne Chubb, O.D., an auditor for (COPE), the Council on Optometric Practitioner Education, discussed the auditing process as it concerns continuing education courses.

Chairperson Urbanski discussed existing state-by-state laws and regulations regarding Telehealth.

Chairperson Urbanski announced Dr. Jeff Yunker from South Dakota and Dr. Bobst from Ohio as the recently elected ARBO Board members. He noted Senator Boozman, an optometrist and speaker at the meeting, discussed healthcare reform in congress.

Chairperson Urbanski discussed a resolution passed that ARBO would continue working with stakeholders, AOA, ASCO, and the Academy of Optometry to develop an ACCME-like accreditation process. He stated a second resolution offered a memorandum of understanding to those organizations. He also noted presentations by Alcon and Johnson & Johnson compliance officers with

regards to compliance with educational grants, sponsorships, and charitable donations from industries.

Chairperson Urbanski discussed Open Payments, which started in 2013, that all payments, sponsorship, and anything of value must be reported to the federal government. He noted the website cms.gov/openpayments. He also noted Board consolidation in other states, background checks, Allergan's dry-eye device, and optometric education programs.

Chairperson Urbanski discussed the battle between AOA and ARBO for control of education approval. He stated COPE is the most organized process currently in place.]

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17 Report of Regulatory Counsel

[Jacqueline Wolfgang, Esquire, provided a status report on matters before the Board. She discussed the update on the Annex and two general revisions to reflect the adopted definition of contact lenses.

Ms. Wolfgang also updated the Preamble. She noted the proposed regulatory package is pending with the regulatory council. Ms. Wolfgang suggested Board members review the overview of the regulatory

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       Ms. Wolfgang noted the Board moved forward on the
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   CE requirements. She mentioned the information can be
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   found in prior agendas and on the website.
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       Chairperson Urbanski contacted the Pennsylvania
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   College of Optometry at Salus University regarding the
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   shorter time frame to obtain the opioid CE. He noted
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   students received the approved CE as part of their
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   didactic training under pharmacology at PCO but is
   awaiting assurance of the applicability of the
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   training to the new graduates.
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       Chairperson Urbanski discussed House Bill 706, a
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companion bill to Senate Bill 758.]

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1 New Business

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[Chairperson Urbanski discussed the Probable CauseCommittee and the need for a replacement for Dr.

Diecidue to assist Dr. Chubb. He also mentioned the

5 Regulations and Legislative Committee that Dr.

Diecidue was a member of with Dr. Haire. He noted the Education Committee responsible for requests and approval of education.

Chairperson Urbanski appointed Dr. Olson to the Probable Cause Committee and Dr. Becker to the Education Committee.

Chairperson Urbanski addressed concerns regarding telemedicine and optometry.

Ms. Wolfgang informed the Board that the Medical Board entered into an Interstate Medical Licensure Compact. The Board adopted the prevailing standards for licensure and affirmed that the practice of medicine occurs where the patient is located at the time of the physician-patient encounter.

Ms. Wolfgang discussed her concerns requiring an in-person exam, which is not telemedicine and is standard practice. She advised caution when including specific language of in-person exam in moving forward with the regulations.

Dr. Haire stated the basic fundamental principle

should be to protect the safety and well-being of consumers, while not limiting access to care or technology.

Dr. Becker questioned the definition of telemedicine as talking to patients over the phone, on the weekend, consulting, and deciding to prescribe medications or treatment.

Chairperson Urbanski stated optometry does not have a definition and noted Senate Bill 780.

Ms. Wolfgang noted exceptions to Senate Bill 780, one of which is consultation by a healthcare practitioner with another healthcare practitioner who has an ongoing practitioner-patient relationship with the individual that was established through an inperson or appropriate virtual examination and agrees to supervise the individual's care.

Chairperson Urbanski expressed his concerns from a practitioner health protection standpoint are the prescription of contact lenses without evaluating that lens on the eye of the patient or refilling a contact lens prescription with some type of online app technology.

Chairperson Urbanski commented that technologies are performing a refraction using some type of auto refractor downloaded from a computer screen to assess

visual acuity. He suggested, from a healthcare provider standpoint, this gives the public a false sense of security of a proper eye exam and that everything is good when, in fact, an eye health assessment or examination, as well as glaucoma testing, was not performed.

Mr. Ricci stated POA does not have any legislative initiatives addressing telehealth. He stated the legislative initiatives of focus for POA are the handicapped placard bill, the vision care benefits bill, and updating of the scope of practice act.

Mr. Ricci offered to provide information to the POA Board and Legislative Affairs Committee for their consideration in order to become more engaged in telemedicine.]
