Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, noted her 19 attendance at the Pennsylvania Physical Therapy 20 Association (PPTA) Board of Directors Meeting on 21 October 23, where she presented an update of the 22 Board's activity over the past year. 2.3 Chair Potter also noted her participation in the 24 Delegate Assembly and elections of the federation. 25 She announced being elected Secretary of the

Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy and the need to elect a new PT Compact Commission delegate.

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Chair Potter informed everyone that Krista Wolfe was recognized with a service award by the Federation and congratulated and thanked her for her service.

Chair Potter addressed her attendance at the Physical Therapy Compact Commission Meeting this year. She noted being excited to attend because it is the first year Pennsylvania officially had a delegate to the PT Compact Commission.

Chair Potter stated the Commission elected individuals to the Executive Board, including Kathy Arney, Chair; Charlotte Martin, Secretary/Treasurer; Jennifer Aglubat, Executive Board at Large; David Harris, Executive Board at Large; and Judd Warren, Executive Board at Large.

Chair Potter reported growth with currently 34 member jurisdictions being part of the PT Compact Commission. She mentioned their attempts to promote and market that compact privileges are available for states issuing them.

Chair Potter stated an outside consultant group recommended the PT Compact Commission have a marketing task force to assist with marketing efforts to help people understand what it means to have compact

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privileges and are currently putting together the task force that was approved at the PT Compact Commission Meeting.

Chair Potter commented that she would have to
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step down from her position as a PT Compact Commission delegate because of her position with the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy. She noted the need to elect a new delegate who will serve until the next annual meeting, and Gerri Grzybek offered to fill that role as the delegate.]

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Chair Potter mentioned also being appointed to the PT Compact Compliance Committee but had to resign from that committee.

Chair Potter informed Board members of an FSBPT Regulatory Workshop and encouraged everyone to attend that virtual workshop. She noted the workshop will be held if they have 35 registrants and FSBPT will be making a decision in mid-December.]

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14 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations

15 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided a

16 Status of Regulations Report for the Board's review.

17 He noted receiving a reply from Regulatory Counsel on

18 November 16, 2021, being happy with the structure of

19 the Annex regarding Proposed Regulation 16A-6522,

20 which concerns early examination, CE for clinical

21 instruction and participation in FSBPT's Alternate

22 | Approval Pathway (AAP).

Mr. Davis has to amend the Preamble and

24 Regulatory Analysis Form (RAF) to match changes in the

25 Annex. He noted there was a good chance of reporting

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1 at the next meeting that the package had been passed
2 off to the Office of General Counsel (OGC) and Office
3 of Attorney General.

Mr. Davis mentioned prior Board discussion at the last few meetings regarding the PT Compact Commission and what must happen to begin issuing Compact privileges. He again noted the hang up was the FBI background check issue that would most likely require a legislative change.

Mr. Davis noted Senate Bill 930 was introduced and referred to the Consumer Protection & Professional Licensure Committee on November 5, 2021. He mentioned having discussions with someone from the Pennsylvania State Police (PSP) who is the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) liaison.

Mr. Davis wrote a report and passed it to the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA), noting the Commissioner's Office had been made aware of what language in SB 930 may need additional attention. He informed everyone that Senate Bill 930 was available publically on the General Assembly website.]

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1 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of
2 Professional and Occupational Affairs, noted he did
3 not have a formal report but offered to answer any
4 Board member questions.

Chair Potter asked Commissioner Johnson if there was anything further to report about the request for proposal (RFP) related to continuing education.

Commissioner Johnson stated the request for information (RFI) recently closed and a number of responses were being reviewed internally. He noted the next step would be an RFP that they are hoping to launch in early January and have a vendor and an application by the end of Q1 of 2022.

Dr. Campbell asked Commissioner Johnson if he had any feedback regarding the five open Board positions.

Commissioner Johnson commented that the

Department raised that issue to the Governor's Office.

He addressed difficulties finding public members and encouraged Board members to reach out to any colleagues that may not be directly involved in the profession who may be willing to serve in the public member capacity. He noted it to be a vital check and balance with regard to making sure the Board is transparent and having a multisided discussion on issues.

Commissioner Johnson informed the Board that the staff in the Office of Intergovernmental Affairs were reviewing credentials. He noted the Department was in the process of vetting the candidates that they send and then it is back to the Governor's Office where the negotiation happens with the General Assembly about the process of confirmation. He welcomed submissions, noting they can be sent directly to him or Ms. Roberts.

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Chair Potter agreed that it was a challenge to find public members and asked whether there are any currently in the pipeline.

Commissioner Johnson did not know the ratio of public and professional submissions at this time but offered to provide the information at the next meeting.

Ms. Grzybek asked Commissioner Johnson whether there has been any progress regarding legislative action concerning the continuation of virtual meetings.

Commissioner Johnson noted the current virtual platform has been extended to March 31, 2022, and the General Assembly is actively discussing making many of the regulatory suspensions permanent. He noted active discussion about providing a hybrid solution with both

an in-person component and streaming or virtual 1 2 component for those unable to attend but is unaware of 3 the status of that legislation. He noted it is safe to say that everyone should expect the integration of 4 5 that technology to be a permanent part of Board 6 logistics and Board functions.]

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8 Report of Committees

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[Geraldine M. Grzybek, PT, GCS, Secretary, thanked the Board for the opportunity to serve as the Board delegate to the FSBPT Delegate Assembly Meeting. She congratulated Chair Potter on her election as

Ms. Grzybek noted Ruggie Canizares of Oregon was reelected to a second term as treasurer and Ellen Donald of Florida was elected to be the Director. She noted the Board has a liaison to their jurisdiction and thinks that may or may not change and is probably in the works. She mentioned Ron Barredo of Tennessee was elected as a Nominating Committee member, and Michelle Sigmund-Gaines was elected to the Council of Board Administrators Chair.

Ms. Grzybek informed the Board of open positions as the president, vice president, and one member of the Nominating Committee for anyone interested who

currently sits on a member Board and has been the Chair or currently involved in Federation activities.

Ms. Grzybek thanked Krista Wolfe for her service to FSBPT and congratulated her on receiving an Outstanding Service Award, notably for her being Co-Chairperson of the PTE Exam Development Committee as well as a significant contributor to the for National Physical Therapy Examination (NPTE) video and graphics library. She mentioned that there is a video of all award recipients on YouTube.

Ms. Grzybek addressed motions voted upon by the Delegate Assembly. She noted Motion #1 updated the bylaws and passed, so all elections will be held online. She stated the purpose of FSBPT and the roles of the delegates were clarified across the leadership forum, where the annual meeting, and the Delegate Assembly and submission of reports annually without a specific requirement to be reported in conjunction with a specific meeting all moved.

Ms. Grzybek noted Motion #2 was the adoption of areas of focus and included examinations, membership, states' rights, state responsibilities and professional standards, education, leadership, and organization on financial stability.
