* * * 1 2 State Board of Physical Therapy 3 July 21, 2022 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, 6 at 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into Executive Session 7 with Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations 8 9 and to receive advice of counsel on matters upon 10 which the Board would later vote. The Board 11 commenced open session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Physical Therapy was held on Thursday, July 15 21, 2022. * * * 16 Official Call to Order 17 18 [Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, officially called the meeting to order at 10:31 a.m.] 19 20 * * * 21 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 22 meeting was being recorded, and those who continued 23 to participate were giving their consent to be 24 recorded. 25 Mr. Davis also informed everyone that the Board

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met in Executive Session prior to the meeting for the 1 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations 2 and to receive advice of counsel on matters upon 3 which the Board would later vote.] 4 * * * 5 6 Roll Call 7 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Chair 8 Potter.1 9 * * * 10 Approval of minutes of the May 6, 2022 meeting CHAIR POTTER: 11 12 The first item on the agenda is the 13 approval of the minutes. 14 Are there any additions or 15 corrections to the minutes of May 6, 2022? 16 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 17 CHAIR POTTER: 18 19 Are there any other additions or 20 corrections to the minutes? Hearing 21 none. 22 Is there a motion to approve the 23 minutes as corrected? 24 MS. GRZYBEK: 25 So moved.

5 1 MR. ROBB: 2 Second. 3 CHAIR POTTER: 4 It has been moved and seconded to adopt 5 the minutes as corrected. We'll do a 6 roll call vote. 7 8 Potter, aye; Claggett, aye; Campbell, 9 aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb, aye; Werner, 10 ave; Wolfe, ave. 11 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 12 Report of Board Prosecution 13 14 [Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, noted the 15 Board waived the presentation of the consent 16 agreements.] * * * 17 18 Appointment - Emily Longenecker for 3rd Attempt 19 at NPTE 20 [Emily Longenecker presented to the Board to request 21 a third attempt to take the National Physical Therapy 22 Examination. She noted having a strong effort to 23 finish with a better result than the last two times, 24 including spending more time preparing and utilizing 25 a study plan.

Dr. Campbell expressed concern with Ms.
Longenecker achieving a lower score on her second
attempt as compared to her first attempt and asked
how she prepared for the second attempt.

5 Ms. Longenecker commented that the second attempt 6 was a little rushed compared to the first attempt 7 because the first attempt was right after graduating 8 college and then experienced anxiety with the second 9 attempt but is now taking medication.

Dr. Campbell asked what study resources Ms.
Longenecker is utilizing related to practice exams.

Ms. Longenecker will be purchasing the Practice Ram and Assessment Tools (PEAT), purchased the PT Final Exam, and is utilizing Scorebuilders.

Dr. Campbell recommended Ms. Longenecker do a question analysis. She noted PEAT has a study mode that will tell her not only what the right answer is and why but will tell her why the wrong answers are wrong. She stated all NPTE questions are linked back to textbooks and encouraged her to use textbooks more than class notes.

22 Chair Potter requested Ms. Longenecker explain 23 how she would approach the multiple areas and divide 24 study time.

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Ms. Longenecker commented that many of the study

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plans were based on exams, and she would be working 1 2 on her weaknesses. 3 Chair Potter informed Ms. Longenecker that the 4 Board administrator would get back to her with their 5 decision.] * * * 6 7 Report of Board Prosecution 8 MR. DAVIS: 9 Number 2 on the Board's agenda, based 10 on the Board's discussions in Executive 11 Session, I believe the chair would 12 accept a motion to approve the Consent 13 Agreement in the following matter: Case No. 21-65-015552. 14 15 Is there a motion? 16 MS. GRZYBEK: So moved. 17 DR. CAMPBELL: 18 19 Second. 20 MR. DAVIS: 21 Is there any further discussion on the 22 motion? 23 CHAIR POTTER: 24 It's been moved and seconded to accept 25 the Consent Agreement and Order in this

DAVIS: 12 Number 3 on the Board's agenda, based 13 on the Board's discussions in Executive Session, I believe the chair would 14 15 accept a motion to approve the Consent 16 Agreement in the following matter: 17 Case No. 22-65-004016. Board member 18 Campbell is recused from this matter. 19 MS. GRZYBEK: 20 So moved. 21 MR. ROBB: 2.2 Second. 23 CHAIR POTTER: 24 It's been moved and seconded to approve 25 the Consent Agreement and Order in this

9 case. We will do a roll call vote. 1 2 3 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 4 aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb, aye; Werner, 5 aye; Wolfe, aye. 6 [The motion carried. Sandra Campbell recused herself 7 from deliberations and voting on the motion.] * * * 8 9 MR. DAVIS: 10 Number 4 on the Board's agenda is a VRP 11 Agreement, based on the Board's 12 discussions in Executive Session, I 13 believe the chair would entertain a motion to adopt the Consent Agreement 14 at Case No. 22-65-009628. 15 16 CHAIR POTTER: 17 Is there a motion? MS. GRZYBEK: 18 19 So moved. 20 MR. ROBB: 21 Second. 22 CHAIR POTTER: 23 It's been moved and seconded. Any 24 further discussion? We will do a roll 25 call.

1 2 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 3 aye; Campbell, aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb, 4 aye; Werner, aye; Wolfe, aye. 5 [The motion carried unanimously. For the record, the 6 licensee's name has been withheld because he is 7 entering into the Voluntary Recovery Program. His 8 participation in that program will remain 9 confidential provided that he abides by the terms and conditions of the program.] 10 * * * 11 Report of Board Counsel - Adjudication and Order 12 13 MR. DAVIS: Number 7 on the Board's agenda is a 14 15 case the Board dealt with a little bit 16 earlier in regard to a Motion to Deem 17 Facts Admitted. Now we have a Final Order before the Board, and the Board 18 reviewed it in Executive Session. 19 20 Based on the Board's discussions 21 in Executive Session, I believe the 2.2 chair would accept a motion to approve 23 as final the Draft Adjudication and 24 Order in the following matter: 25 Commonwealth BPOA v. Jason Talley, PT,

11 Case No. 19-65-006566. 1 2 CHAIR POTTER: 3 Is there a motion? MS. GRZYBEK: 4 5 So moved. 6 MR. ROBB: 7 Second. 8 CHAIR POTTER: 9 It's been moved and seconded to adopt 10 the Adjudication and Order in this 11 case. Any further discussion? Roll 12 call vote. 13 14 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 15 aye; Campbell, recuse; Grzybek, aye; 16 Robb, aye; Werner, aye; Wolfe, aye. 17 [The motion carried. Sandra Campbell recused herself 18 from deliberations and voting on the motion.] * * * 19 Report of Board Counsel - Applications 20 21 MR. DAVIS: 22 Number 8 on the Board's agenda is the 23 Application of Mark Williams. The 24 Board reviewed this in Executive 25 Session, and prepared a motion.

In the Matter of the Application 1 2 for Certification by Endorsement as a 3 Physical Therapist Assistant of Mark 4 Williams, based on the Board's 5 discussions in Executive Session, I 6 believe the chair would accept a motion 7 to initially approve the Application. 8 If the Applicant agrees to the terms of 9 the Probationary Order, counsel shall 10 be authorized to issue a PTA 11 Certificate on probation to Mark 12 Williams. CHAIR POTTER: 13 14 Is there a motion? 15 MS. GRZYBEK: 16 So moved. 17 DR. CAMPBELL: Second. 18 19 CHAIR POTTER: 20 It's been moved and seconded. Any 21 further discussion? If not, we'll do the roll call vote. 22 23 24 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 25 aye; Campbell, aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb,

13 1 aye; Werner, aye; Wolfe, aye. 2 [The motion carried unanimously.] 3 * * * MR. DAVIS: 4 5 Number 9 on the Board's agenda is an 6 Application that was reviewed by the 7 Board, the Application of Christian 8 Luna. 9 In the Matter of the Application 10 for Licensure by Endorsement as a Physical Therapist of Christian Luna, 11 based on the Board's discussions in 12 13 Executive Session, I believe the chair 14 would accept a motion approving the 15 Application. 16 CHAIR POTTER: 17 Is there a motion? MS. GRZYBEK: 18 So moved. 19 20 DR. CAMPBELL: 21 Second. 22 CHAIR POTTER: 23 The motion has been moved and seconded. 24 Any further discussion? We'll do the 25 roll call vote.

1 2 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 3 aye; Campbell, aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb, aye; Werner, aye; Wolfe, aye. 4 5 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 6 7 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations 8 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to 9 the status of regulations. He referred to 16A-6522 10 regarding licensure by endorsement under Act 41, 11 noting it is complete and with Senior Regulatory 12 Counsel for review. 13 Mr. Davis noted 16A-6523 regarding early exam and 14 continuing education (CE) for clinical education is 15 also complete and with Senior Regulatory Counsel for 16 review. 17 Mr. Davis addressed correspondence received from the House and Senate Professional Licensure 18 19 Committees concerning Act 41. He noted that each of 20 the 29 licensing boards at BPOA received a letter in June 2022 urging prompt promulgation of regulations 21 2.2 to implement licensure under Act 41, licensure by 23 endorsement. 24 Mr. Davis stated the Commissioner's Office 25 drafted a response letter on behalf of all 29 boards

informing the respective Chairs that the absence of 1 2 fully promulgated final regulations has not impacted 3 the board's ability to implement Act 41 and hundreds 4 of licenses by endorsement have been issued under Act 5 41. He mentioned the letter also noted that the 6 Physical Therapy Board's regulatory package has been 7 completed, formally voted on, and approved by the State Board of Physical Therapy. 8

9 Chair Potter thanked Acting Commissioner Claggett10 for responding to the concerns raised.

11 Mr. Davis addressed 16A-6519 regarding the proposed annex for distance continuing education (CE) 12 13 and student practice of physical therapy. He 14 mentioned there is currently no "cap" on the amount 15 of distance continuing education hours that physical 16 therapists or PTAs can obtain, and the proposed regulation is based on Act 100 of 2021, and it is 17 18 intended to clarify the Board's position on distance 19 continuing education.

20 Mr. Davis provided a draft annex last time which 21 mirrored the language already found in the regulation 22 that relates to direct access physical therapy. He 23 noted that Senior Regulatory Counsel suggested he 24 utilize the language of Act 100 instead of utilizing 25 the current language, and he amended the proposed

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annex to add the definition for "distance education" 1 2 as it appears in Act 100. Ms. Grzybek requested clarification as to whether 3 all of the CE could be online for the next licensing 4 5 period since licensees would be renewing starting in 6 the fall because licenses expire December 31, 2022. Ms. Roberts informed Ms. Grzybek that all of the 7 8 CE could be online. Mr. Davis informed Board members that he would 9 10 continue drafting the preamble and Regulatory 11 Analysis Form (RAF) and is hoping to have that 12 available for the next meeting.] * * * 13 14 Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous 15 [Thomas M. Davis, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed Senate Bill 1160 regarding athletic trainers. 16 He informed Board members that amended SB 1160 proposes 17 to amend the definition of "physically active 18 19 person." He noted the prior version of SB 1160 said, 20 "An individual who participates in organized, 21 individual, or team sports, athletic games, or 22 recreation sport activity." 23 Mr. Davis explained that the bill would change 24 the definition of "physically active person" to "an 25 individual who engages in an activity that may be

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associated with any injury, disorder, or medical 1 condition which requires a level of strength, 2 3 endurance, flexibility, range of motion, speed, or 4 agility or could result from exercise, sports, 5 recreation, wellness, or employment." 6 Mr. Davis suggested anyone who wants to comment 7 regarding the pending legislation to contact a 8 professional organization that represents their 9 interest or a local representative. 10 Mr. Davis referred to Senate Bill 485 regarding dry needling, where there was a complete rewrite of 11 12 the bill which, unlike the last draft, would no longer remove the term "certificates of 13 14 authorization," so everything with regard to 15 certificates of authorization would remain the same. 16 He stated it would still add a definition for dry 17 needling and adds the practice of dry needling to the 18 definition of physical therapy. 19 Mr. Davis mentioned the new amendments propose to 20 add conditions that a practitioner must first meet 21 before providing dry needling and provided a summary. 22 He stated newest version of the bill would allow the 23 Board input and empower the Board to promulgate 2.4 additional requirements the Board deems necessary. 25 Mr. Davis also suggested anyone with questions to

contact the professional organization that represents 1 2 their interest or a local representative.] * * * 3 4 Appointment - Sierra Clabaugh for 3rd Attempt 5 at NPTE 6 [Sierra Clabaugh presented to the Board to request a 7 third attempt to take the National Physical Therapy 8 Examination. She addressed her first and second 9 attempts, noting she now has a mentor and has made 10 flashcards rather than buying ones from Scorebuilders 11 because writing the information down helps her retain 12 things better. 13 Dr. Campbell addressed Ms. Clabaugh's schedule 14 and encouraged her to touch material on a regular 15 basis to truly learn it and be able to utilize it effectively. She suggested Ms. Clabaugh make 16 17 modifications based on how she does on the practice 18 tests for strengths and weaknesses. She encouraged 19 her to do an analysis afterwards as far as what 20 questions were answered correctly and why, and to 21 look at the wrong answer and determine how to do 22 things differently moving forward. She noted to 23 remember NPTE questions come from textbooks; not 24 notes.

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Chair Potter informed Ms. Clabaugh that the Board

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would consider her request, and the Board 1 2 administrator would provide a decision later today.] * * * 3 4 MR. DAVIS: 5 Now that the Board has heard from the 6 two individuals, Emily Longenecker and 7 Sierra Clabaugh, does any Board member wish to reenter into Executive Session 8 9 to further discuss the request? 10 Hearing nothing. Based on the Board's discussions 11 12 in Executive Session, I believe the 13 Board chair would accept a motion 14 approving the requests of the following 15 individuals for permission to take the 16 National Physical Therapy Exam a third 17 time of Emily Longenecker and Sierra 18 Clabaugh. 19 CHAIR POTTER: 20 Is there a motion? 21 MS. GRZYBEK: 2.2 So moved. 23 DR. CAMPBELL: 24 Second. 25 CHAIR POTTER:

The motion has been moved and seconded. 1 2 Roll call vote. 3 4 Potter, aye; Commissioner Claggett, 5 aye; Campbell, aye; Grzybek, aye; Robb, 6 aye; Werner, aye; Wolfe, aye. 7 [The motion carried unanimously.] 8 * * * 9 Report of Board Chair 10 [Cynthia L. Potter, PT, DPT, Chairperson, reminded 11 everyone that the Leadership Issues Forum will be 12 starting this weekend for the Federation of State 13 Board of Physical Therapy. She noted Gerri Grzybek 14 is the Board's delegate and Michelle Roberts would 15 also be attending the forum. She suggested everyone 16 present any questions or feedback before Saturday.] * * * 17 18 Report of Acting Commissioner 19 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 20 Professional and Occupational Affairs, notified 21 everyone of in-person Board member training on 22 October 24, 2022, in Harrisburg. He mentioned that 23 some of the items include the role of Board counsel 24 and prosecution and Board member travel. He noted 25 the training is mandatory for public members but also

encouraged professional members to attend. 1 2 Dr. Campbell asked whether there were any 3 updates regarding moving forward with the PT Compact. 4 Mr. Davis has not had any recent discussions 5 regarding the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) 6 background check issue. He could not offer any 7 updates.] * * * 8 9 Report of Board Administrator 10 [Michelle Roberts, Board Administrator, noted the 11 proposed 2023 meeting dates for the Board's review.] * * * 12 Miscellaneous 13 14 [Geraldine M. Grzybek, PT, GCS, Secretary, informed 15 Board members that she participated in a Federation 16 of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) Candidate 17 Forum and FSBPT would be electing a president, vice 18 president, and a nominating committee member at the 19 annual meeting in October 2022. 20 Ms. Grzybek noted candidate statements could be 21 found on the FSBPT website and encouraged fellow 2.2 Board members to indicate how they would like her to 23 vote on their behalf before the September meeting.] * * * 24 25 Adjournment
