- 1 but there would be additional responsibilities that
- 2 | would fall upon the Board if it were to become law.
- 3 He noted responsibilities would include keeping track
- 4 of how many prescribing psychologists there are,
- 5 possibly creating mechanisms for applying to become a
- 6 prescribing psychologist, creating template
- 7 application forms to help verify people have met
- 8 criteria, and likely manage disciplinary actions of
- 9 prescribing psychologists.
- Dr. Ragusea stated the Board would also forward
- 11 information about who has prescriptive authority in
- 12 | the state to the Board of Pharmacy. He mentioned the
- 13 | Board of Pharmacy has not been involved in discussions
- 14 about the legislation. He noted the need to notify
- 15 the State Board if there is any termination,
- 16 suspension, or reinstatement of someone's prescriptive
- 17 | authority license.
- 18 Dr. Ragusea stated PPA would like to have
- 19 prescribing psychologists on the licensing board and
- 20 have them be part of the rulemaking process if the
- 21 bill passes. He noted the importance of prescribing
- 22 psychologists to be assertive because physicians will
- 23 sometimes try to dominate the rulemaking stages and
- 24 dictate things.
- 25 Chair Spayd requested information regarding

states that currently have prescriptive privileges and if there had been any history of disciplinary action.

Dr. Ragusea reported prescribing psychologists have existed for about 30 years, starting with the Department of Defense Psychopharmacology Demonstration Project back in the 1990s. He noted Louisiana, New Mexico, Illinois, Idaho, and Iowa permit prescribing psychologists. He mentioned other locations where prescribing psychologists can practice medicine is for the military, on Indian reservations, and other certain public health sites if they have a license in a state that permits it.

Dr. Ragusea reported that there have only been about 250 prescribing psychologists because of a lot of hoops and obstacles, noting the numbers could increase by reducing barriers.

Dr. Ragusea mentioned that disciplinary action has been a little unclear, but in terms of official disciplinary actions by state boards, there had been only a couple and a small percentage over 30 years of practice. He noted that malpractice rates had not increased much in states where prescribing is legal, but could expect to pay \$75 to \$100 extra in their insurance.

Dr. Ragusea commented that part of the plan is to

- 1 | introduce a companion bill to the Senate next year.
- 2 He stated the continuing education requirement in the
- 3 bill would be in addition to the 30 they already get
- 4 as psychologists and monitoring of that would be part
- 5 of the Board's responsibility.
- 6 Mr. Ragusea suggested the Board think about
- 7 approving practicum sites because one of the major
- 8 obstacles to becoming a prescriber is that it is very
- 9 difficult to find people to train someone and provide
- 10 residency supervised hours required in the bill. He
- 11 | mentioned that Illinois has a system for formally
- 12 approving practicum sites and is something to
- 13 | consider.
- Dr. McAleer commented that the law states the
- 15 Board would be required to approve a national exam for
- 16 practice of psychopharmacology by a psychologist for
- 17 | prescribing and asked how many exams currently exist.
- 18 He also asked whether anything would be in the next
- 19 version of the bill that modifies the nursing law
- 20 because there is nothing in there that gives
- 21 psychologists the ability to order nurses to do
- 22 | anything.
- Dr. Ragusea stated there is one exam and did not
- 24 think there was any plan to modify the nursing law,
- 25 | noting there would be a lot of pushback from

physicians.

Dr. DonGiovanni commented that medical societies were pretty much antagonistic to the proposed laws in other states regarding prescriptive authority and asked how medical societies in Pennsylvania view this.

Dr. Ragusea stated the medical societies are being intentionally reserved and waiting to see how much support they get in the House and Senate and then would weigh in. He mentioned medical societies may be open to negotiate because the American Medical Association (AMA) did not oppose the bill in Illinois, so the AMA could probably get behind the bill in Pennsylvania too.

Ms. Miley commented that Dr. Ragusea's presentation was informative, and PPA was not seeking any direction from the Board at this time. She stated the Board does not speak on legislation, which would come from the Department and the administration, and any support would be determined at a higher level than the Board.

Chair Spayd asked whether the additional exam CE would be permitted by medical doctors or whether it has to be a prescribing psychologist.

Dr. Ragusea explained that the continuing education was not specified in the bill, so the

1 continuing education could be from any source but has
2 to be relevant to the practice of a prescribing
3 psychologist.

Mr. Giunta referred to the conditional certificate section in House Bill 2607 and asked whether the supervision by a physician continues after the license or certificate is granted or just during the conditional certificate.

Dr. Ragusea explained that a provider who is fully licensed as a prescriber would be allowed to prescribe independently but, as indicated in the bill, also be expected to do so in collaboration with the patient's primary care provider.

Mr. Giunta requested information regarding who would be monitoring a conditional prescribing psychologist. He also asked whether there was any adoption for prescribing guidelines and whether the bill affords the Board any regulation-making ability on the type of guidelines that would be necessary to be implemented.

Dr. Ragusea stated that monitoring is not in the bill and is something that would need to be discussed and determined. He noted the American Psychological Association has published guidelines for the practice of psychopharmacology that applies to prescribing

psychologists and non-prescribing psychologists for direction. He mentioned the Board could collaborate with other states to find out more about how they do things.

Mr. Giunta asked whether prescribing psychologists would have to check the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program routinely before giving a prescription to make sure the patient-client is not doctor shopping. He stated the prescribing psychologists would have to register with the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and asked whether there has there been any collaboration or contact with the DEA on how that would work.

Dr. Ragusea noted that PPA would support

Prescription Drug Monitoring Program checks. He

stated PPA has not been in touch with the DEA on that

issue and believed that part of the bill originally

comes from the model bill published by the American

Psychological Association (APA) and approved by APA

attorneys.

Chair Spayd commented that the primary responsibility of the Board should this go through would be to approve practicum sites, approve the exam, track additional CEs, and include a prescribing psychologist on their Board.
