Joseph Tarantino, Chair, Industry Member, officially called the meeting to order. The Pledge of 8 Allegiance was recited. A roll call was taken. 9 * * * 10 Approval of Minutes of December 12, 2018 meeting. 11 CHAIR TARANTINO: 12 13 Can I get a motion to approve the draft minutes of December 12th? 14 15 MR. FERRARA: 16 So moved, Ferrara. 17 MS. RUBIN: Second. 18 19 CHAIR TARANTINO: 20 Motion by Ferrara, seconded by Rubin. 21 All in favor say aye. Any opposed? 22 [The motion carried unanimously.] 23 * * * 24 Report of Prosecutorial Division 25 [Ray Michalowski, Esquire, Commission Prosecution

1 Liaison, on behalf of Caroline Bailey, Esquire, 2 Commission Prosecutor, presented the Consent Agreement 3 for File No. 16-56-12111.] * * * 4 [Ray Michalowski, Esquire, Commission Prosecution 5 6 Liaison, on behalf of Glenn Masser, Esquire, 7 Commission Prosecutor, presented the Consent Agreement for File No. 17-56-04395.] 8 * * * 9 10 Report of Commission Counsel [Juan A. Ruiz, Esquire, Commission Counsel, noted 11 12 matters for discussion during Executive Session. 13 Mr. Ruiz requested the Commission to vote to adopt 14 the Broker Price Opinion (BPO) Annex.] 15 MR. [Mr. Ruiz discussed the Advertising (16A-5616) 1 2 regulation. He stated the Commission adopted the 3 Preamble and Annex in December of 2015, but then the regulation was put on hold. The Administration has 4 requested the Commission to move the regulation 5 forward. 6 7 Mr. Ruiz noted the regulation amends § 35.305, relating to business name on advertisements, and 8 § 35.309, relating to team advertising. He reviewed 9 10 the rewording of the last sentence regarding the size of the name and telephone number of the broker.] 11 * * * 12 13 Report of Commission Chairperson 14 [Chair Tarantino thanked Alexis Barbieri for being 15 Chair this year.] * * * 16 17 Report of Commissioner - No Report * * * 18 19 Report of Commission Administrator 20 [Kristen Linsenbach, Commission Administrator, presented financial disclosure forms. She requested 21 22 the Commissioners to file online and offered to answer 23 questions.] * * * 24 25 Appointment - BFO 2019 Budget Presentation

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1 [Kimberly Adams, Chief of Fiscal Management, Bureau of 2 Finance and Revenue, introduced herself and Shannon Boop, also of the Bureau, to the Commissioners. 3 She provided information on the Commission's licensed 4 5 population with 56,044 license renewals in 2018. 6 Ms. Adams referred to the revenue source category 7 breakdown. She noted that biennially 94.1 of revenue from renewals and applications. 8 Ms. Adams explained expenses occur from a direct 9 expense, time sheets, and a license-based fee. 10 She 11 also reviewed administrative and legal costs. 12 Ms. Adams noted that the Commission's licensed 13 population reflected a healthy growth. 14 Ms. Adams presented Commission member 15 expenditures. She noted that the 2017-2018 budget was 16 adequate, and the same budget will be used for the 2019-2020 Fiscal Year. 17 18 Ms. Adams provided an expenditure chart for Commission review. 19 20 Chair Tarantino questioned the ability of the Commission to make changes to Commission member 21 22 expenses. Ms. Adams advised that the Commission 23 should contact the Fiscal Management Division.] * * * 24 25 Appointment - Bill McFalls from PAR

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[William McFalls, Jr., President, Pennsylvania 1 2 Association of Realtors (PAR), explained that PAR was 3 awaiting a new strategic plan. He noted PAR's goal to expand its relationship with the Commission and the 4 5 BPOA. 6 Mr. McFalls discussed issues with the Pennsylvania 7 Licensing System (PALS) and noted that the Association still fields questions and complaints about the 8 system. He noted problems with obtaining licenses and 9 10 investigating and processing complaints. He suggested 11 that the PAR Bureau and Commission have more open 12 discussions to resolve issues and improve the PALS 13 process. 14 Chair Tarantino noted that he, too, has been 15 waiting for a license since October. He agreed with 16 the importance of having discussion and Commissioners' 17 input. 18 Ms. Cestra encouraged all to contact their 19 legislators.] 20 * * * [The Commission recessed from 11:34 a.m. until 11:39 21 22 a.m.] 23 * * * 24 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 25 11:39 a.m. the Commission entered into Executive

As I mentioned 13 before, back in 2015, the Commission had 14 reached out to the public on the 15 advertising regulation. And April 22nd, 16 2015, you guys voted to send out an 17 exposure draft. We did that. We received a number of comments. Back 18 19 December 2015, you voted to adopt the 20 Preamble and Annex dealing with those 21 comments and to promulgate. The 22 Commission had unofficially withheld that 23 regulation. I'm asking now does the 24 Commission wish to move forward with that 25 regulation? Is there a motion to

12 continue the promulgation of that 1 2 regulation? MS. RUBIN: 3 So moved, Rubin. 4 5 CHAIR TARANTINO: 6 Second. 7 MR. FERRARA: 8 Ferrara. CHAIR TARANTINO: 9 10 All in favor say aye. Any opposed? 11 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 12 13 VEAC Committee 14 [Ms. Rubin presented an outline for the fundamentals 15 course.] 16 MS. RUBIN: We're asking for a motion for the 17 Commission to review that outline and 18 19 within the next ten days, let us know of 20 any questions. And for Anthony DeLuca, we provisionally denied, as we did not see 13 14 that his experience was equivalent to 15 three years of a real estate licensee. 16 Motion to approve that? 17 [The Commission members determined that the committee will make a blanket motion of all recommendations.] 18 19 MS. RUBIN: 20 For the broker exam for Catherine Tresco, we preliminarily denied. Catherine has 21 22 not demonstrated the qualifications 23 needed to sit for the exam. Jay Kamin we 24 preliminarily denied as Jay does not meet 25 the three-year requirement. Joshua

Reibstein we preliminarily denied as Joshua has not demonstrated the required experience. And Michael Barnes we also preliminarily denied as Michael does not meet the course requirements.

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And then in terms of the courses listed there, we have approved all of those - I apologize. That's not true. So let me go through this. We have a course approval for Building Your Valuation Toolbox and Defensible Workfile. We approved the course Commercial Mastermind on Real Estate Syndication. We approved the course Fundamentals of Income Property Appraisal. We approved the course Go Forth and Sin No More. And we approve the course How's That Working Out for You.

19For the online 30-hour broker20elective course Evaluation of Residential21Property, which is now being asked to22become a broker-required course, we have23asked for additional information so that24they can submit the details on their25outline, meaning the outline requirements

of the Valuation of Residential Property 1 2 course. 3 So those are our recommendations and we need a motion. 4 5 CHAIR TARANTINO: 6 Anne made a motion to approve 7 recommendations of the committee. 8 MS.
