23 prepared with a recent decrease of 40 to 59,705. She

24 also noted FY 2015-2016 at 51,891 with an increase in

Ms. Adams reviewed the biennial total revenue by source. She reviewed categories and actual revenue for FY 2017-2018 and FY 2018-2019, as well as the biennial total. She stated 96.2 percent of the revenue was from renewals and applications.

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Ms. Adams provided a categorical breakdown of expenses for FY 2017-2018 and FY 2018-2019 with a current budget for FY 2019-2020 and expenses as of January 24, 2020. She noted a recent increase in expenses. She mentioned expenses are incurred from direct-based charges, timesheet-based charges, and licensee-based charges. She stated the current budget was adequate.

Ms. Adams reviewed revenues and expenses, showing the bottom line FY 2019-2020 budget. She noted the licensee population growth and revenue exceeded the expenses.

Ms. Adams reviewed Commission member expenses, noting the current budget for FY 2019-2020 and expenses as of January 24, 2020, which recently increased. She mentioned budgeted figure was adequate and carried over for the FY 2020-2021 budget. She stated any excess not used would remain in the Commission's restricted account.

Mr. Tarantino questioned why the budget had

dropped, noting there was a time when the Commission had input on the budget. Ms. Adams explained that expenses had decreased, so the figure was dropped.

It was noted that the Commission was not able to attend conferences due to funds not being in the budget. Ms. Adams suggested letting the Commission administrator know if the Commission anticipated an increase in the expenses, and the figure would be increased.]

   year. She stated her goal this year was to update the
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rules and regulations. She mentioned an upcoming rules and regulations meeting to draft the updates.

Chair Rubin desired to provide a newsletter to licensees on a quarterly basis through email with updates on licensure changes, laws, and requirements in continuing education. She also wanted to provide information regarding disciplinary actions to remind licensees of the ramifications of wrongful conduct.

Mr. Ruiz explained the newsletter process, where he reviews and approves the articles. The articles are then sent to the Commission Administrator to be forwarded to the Commissioner's Office.

Deputy Commissioner Lambert noted there is a review process and then the information technology (IT) department distributes the newsletters to the licensees electronically.

Mr. Tarantino questioned whether a communications person or public relations person could write these articles every quarter since there was so much money in the budget.

Ms. Thomson mentioned that the local paper in Harrisburg publishes a list of disciplinary actions and interesting articles in the news that are relevant. She also noted the *Philadelphia Inquirer* publishes good stories and questioned whether it would

- be possible to obtain reprint rights with some of the
 budget money and include those articles in the
 newsletter.
- Mr. Ruiz stated most newsletter articles are
 usually written by Commission members, but it could be
 possible with the permission to print the information.
 He will review the matter for legality purposes.
 - Mr. Tarantino again mentioned having one person hired to work on the newsletters, possibly for all of the Boards and Commissions.
- Deputy Commissioner Lambert will discuss this
 with the press office and report back to the
 Commission at its next meeting.
 - Chair Rubin questioned when the first newsletter could be published. She mentioned an article written introducing herself and finding somebody to write an article regarding BPO regulations in plain language.

present on behalf of President Bill Festa. He commented that the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors (PAR) supports Chair Rubin's goals.

Mr. McFalls discussed PAR's recent meetings, which focused on a recent New York Newsday three-year investigation of the Long Island Real Estate

Community. He stated the report revealed widespread unequal treatment and offered to send the Commission a link to that report.

Mr. McFalls stated 93 agents underwent a testing process as a result of this investigation with 12 different real estate companies. The results were as follows: 19 percent of Asians received unfair treatment by real estate agents, 39 percent of Hispanics were treated unfairly, and nearly 49 percent of black homebuyers were subject to unfair treatment when compared to white homebuyers.

Mr. McFalls announced that the National Association of Realtors introduced a plan to protect fair housing rights that includes working with state associations regarding fair housing laws, launching a public service announcement campaign, integrating fair housing at all conferences, creating more robust fair housing education, and conducting a national study.

Mr. McFalls noted that PAR's Diversity Committee,

Legislative Committee, and Board of Directors strongly urge the Commission to make fair housing the mandatory education topic in the 2020 continuing education cycle to help stress the importance of fair housing and the critical role real estate agents play in assuring equal treatment to consumers in the home-buying and selling process.

Mr. McFalls stated PAR will be investigating other ways to continue educating realtors on fair housing. He noted Director of Enforcement Jinada Rochelle of the Pennsylvania Human Relations Committee indicated that actions would be taken from the testing that occurred in Lehigh at the end of last year. PAR will be in Philadelphia and surrounding areas in the future.

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Mr. McFalls offered PAR's assistance to ensure smooth renewal this year and offered to distribute information to members to avoid any of the pitfalls that occurred in the past.

Ms. Linsenbach stated the Commission will be developing a PALS renewal guide in conjunction with the Commissioner's Office and will provide information regarding the grace period and other renewal changes to PAR for distribution to members.

Mr. McFalls noted President Festa will continue

to make presentations and be a point of contact to assist with the good relationship between the Commission and PAR.

Chair Rubin extended the Commission's congratulations to Bill Festa on his presidency this year and looked forward to seeing him at the next meeting.]
