Glasser, Esquire, Commission Prosecutor, 13 presented the Consent Agreement for Case Nos. 22-56-14 002747, 22-56-006432, & 22-56-006431. 15 Ms. Cestra commented that the Consent Agreement 16 states that the respondent was using the name Sundell 17 Realty properly but did not include the name of the 18 broker and requested additional information regarding 19 their use of Sundell Realty. 20 Ms. Glasser explained that the salesperson was 21 using that as a team name. 22 Ms. Cestra noted that a team name should be the 23 person's name in the guidelines. 24 Ms. Glasser stated there was no mention in the 25 regulations or act on proper team names and believed

1 it had been corrected. The consent agreement within 2 its four corners can be considered. 3 Ms. Cestra commented that people could then 4 advertise a team. 5 Mr. Michalowski explained that the charges are 6 for what occurred at that time, and the mitigation 7 statement is for the Commission to determine whether 8 it is appropriate and does not preclude the 9 Commission from filing charges in the future. 10 Ms. Cestra commented that he was saying Sundell 11 Realty and was now going to say Sundell Home Sales 12 that is not a licensed entity. That is where it was 13 misleading and made it seemed to be related to real 14 estate if he was a licensee saying his name is 15 Sundell Home Sales. 16 Mr. Michalowski explained that the charges are 17 the result of the investigation. He noted the 18 mitigation is the respondent's statement of what they 19 are going to do going forward and does not mean the 20 Commission cannot prosecute again going forward. He 21 mentioned that mitigation is their attempt to tell 22 the Commission why the respondent should accept the 23 agreement and it is being included at the request of 24 the respondent. 25 Mr. Piccirilli asked whether the respondent is
