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3 * * * 1 2 State Real Estate Commission 3 April 17, 2018 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Real 6 Estate Commission was held on Tuesday, April 17, 2018. 7 Alexis L. Barbieri, Chair, Public Member, officially called the meeting to order at 11:14 a.m. A roll call 8 9 was taken. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. * * * 10 11 Approval of Minutes of the March 6, 2018 meeting 12 CHAIR BARBIERI: 13 The next item on the agenda is the 14 approval of the draft minutes of the 15 March 6, 2018 meeting. Do I have a 16 motion? 17 [The Commission discussed corrections to the minutes.] CHAIR BARBIERI: 18 19 Could I have a motion to approve the 20 minutes as corrected? 21 MS. RUBIN: 22 So moved. 23 MR. TARANTINO: 24 Second. 25 CHAIR BARBIERI:

All in favor? Any opposed? 1 2 [The motion carried. Vincent A. Galko, Jennifer A. 3 Thomson, and Joseph J. McGettigan abstained from 4 voting on the motion.] * * * 5 6 Report of Prosecutorial Division 7 [Ray Michalowski, Esquire, Commission Prosecution Liaison, noted no Consent Agreements to present. Mr. 8 Michalowski discussed continuing education cases from 9 10 the last renewal period. Ms. Linsenbach sent at least two notices out, and Mr. Masser was handling all of 11 12 the cases at this time. 13 Mr. Michalowski stated the CE warning letters 14 will contain information regarding the changes to the 15 whole system. 16 Mr. Michalowski noted recent appraisal training 17 for appraisers at Villanova. He informed the 18 commission that Mr. Fritsch will be attending the next 19 meeting in Pittsburgh in May, and Ms. Bailey will be 20 attending the meeting in Philadelphia in July. Ms. Cestra questioned the role of the 21 22 Prosecutorial Division and the participation of 23 managing brokers in investigations of claims. Mr. 24 Michalowski explained the roles of inspectors and 25 investigators.

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Mr. Michalowski stated the managing broker or the 1 2 broker of record should be interviewed to determine a 3 lack of supervision, which is prosecutable. He will 4 contact the Bureau of Enforcement and Investigation 5 (BEI) regarding the directives being followed.] * * * 6 7 Introduction of Audience Members 8 [Chair Barbieri requested the introduction of audience 9 members.1 10 * * * 11 Report of Commission Counsel [Juan A. Ruiz, Esquire, Commission Counsel, noted a 12 13 final Adjudication and Order added to the agenda at File No. 15-56-01738. 14 15 Mr. Ruiz noted a proposed Adjudication and Order 16 and two final Adjudication and Orders for discussion during Executive Session.] 17 * * * 18 Rules & Regulations Committee Report 19 20 [Armand Ferrara, Industry Member, noted the 21 committee's review of Sections 35.331 through 35.340. 22 The changes will be completed before the next 23 Harrisburg meeting.] 24 * * * 25 Report of Commission Chair

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1	[Chair Barbieri noted a letter from Mr. McGee
2	regarding the designation of mandatory courses for
3	discussion in Executive Session.
4	Mr. Tarantino questioned the status of PAR's teams
5	Presidential Advisory Group report. Michael McGee,
6	CAE, Chief Executive Officer, Pennsylvania Association
7	of Realtors (PAR), explained the plan to vet the
8	legislative issue internally and return to the
9	Commission with draft language for additional input.
10	Mr. McGee discussed the process for changing
11	statutes and regulations. He noted the current
12	statute does not have a definition of "teams", which
13	must be addressed legislatively before regulations can
14	be drafted specifically to outline the structure of
15	teams.
16	Mr. Tarantino offered the Commission's input and
17	support to PAR on the draft.
18	Mr. McGee also referenced the status of House
19	Bill 863, which includes 15 hours of additional
20	prelicensure requirements. Todd Umbenhauer, CRB, CRS,
21	GRI, President, PAR, stated legislatively, the Bill
22	recently went through second consideration, referred
23	to the Senate Appropriations Committee, and passed the
24	House. Mr. McGee noted that means two more votes, one
25	out of the Appropriations and one on the full Senate

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7 1 floor, and no amendments are expected.] * * * 2 3 Report of Commission Administrator 4 [Krista Linsenbach, Commission Administrator, updated 5 the commission on the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS). She addressed call wait times, extension of 6 7 processing times, and extra staff. Ms. Linsenbach stated the average on-line license 8 9 renewal was at 20-30 percent. 10 Mr. Ferrara discussed his attendance at the 11 Association of Real Estate License Law Officials 12 (ARELLO) Midyear Conference April 4-7, 2018, in New 13 Orleans. He also discussed technology for payment and 14 protection of the public. He addressed supervision, 15 lead-based paint laws, team legislation, and CE 16 credits. 17 Mr. Ferrara also informed the committee that the 18 next ARELLO Conference is in September. 19 Mr. Umbenhauer expressed his and PAR's pleasure 20 to see Mr. McGettigan back at the table. He also 21 discussed issues with licensees regarding agreements 2.2 of sale, which could be an area to consider for 23 continuing education. 24 Mr. Umbenhauer referred to House Bill 1981, which 25 introduces the First-Time Homebuyers Savings Account

Program in Pennsylvania. He stated the companion 1 2 bill, Senate Bill 1066, was expected to soon pass in 3 committee. He also noted that House Bill 1981 has 4 passed the House Urban Affairs Committee. 5 Mr. Umbenhauer addressed challenges for new 6 licensees, renewing licenses, licensees changing 7 brokerages, for those trying to open a new office, and approval of continuing education courses. 8 He stated 9 that Pennsylvania Association of Realtors (PAR) has 10 been communicating with Commissioner Harlow to keep 11 members apprised of the situation. 12 Mr. Umbenhauer stated the information is also 13 relayed to members through a daily blog entitled 14 JustListed as well as an email to brokers.] * * * 15 16 [The Commission recessed from 11:50 a.m. until 11:55 17 a.m.] * * * 18 19 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 20 11:55 a.m. the Commission entered into Executive 21 Session with Juan A.
