reported about 30 percent of real estate salespeople and 50 percent of real estate brokers have renewed.

Ms. Linsenbach addressed the increased volume of inquiries, including salespeople who have already put in their renewal but received an email that it did not go through because their employer has not successfully completed their renewal.

Ms. Linsenbach encouraged salespeople and associate brokers whose renewals did not go through to check with their employing broker to make sure their part was completed correctly. She explained that employing brokers are responsible for both the company license and the broker of record license if it is a corporation.

Ms. Linsenbach informed everyone that renewals expire on June 1 there is no grace period. She stated real estate brokerages, brokers of record, and company licenses will not be able to reactivate. She noted all broker corporation, limited liability company (LLC), or limited liability partnership (LLP) license and its related broker of record license will be directed to file an initial application if their license was not renewed.

Ms. Linsenbach stated broker sole-proprietor licenses will still be permitted to be reactivate as

Christopher Beadling, President, Pennsylvania
Association of Realtors, mentioned that most of his
remarks for today were centered on the letter PAR sent
to the Commission regarding the mandatory education
topic but has been resolved with the new motion. He

1 thanked the Commission for the change in the layout of
2 the mandatory course.

Mr. Beadling informed the Commission that the Pennsylvania Association of Realtors has also been hard at work getting the messages out to their 39,000 members that the broker of record and corporation must be renewed first, continuing education must be completed, and PALS must be used to renew their license.

Mr. Beadling stated PAR has a webpage specifically designed for members to check which continuing education is required depending on their license date and also helping them through PALS. He mentioned that the number of calls from members had decreased dramatically because of the information, and PAR will continue to keep the number of calls coming into the Commission as low as possible.

Mr. Beadling requested information regarding the status of the revisions to the general regulations and whether there is a timeline in place.

Mr. Ruiz noted there were some revisions that needed to be done, including the definition of "advertisement." He informed Mr. Beadling that he would be meeting with new counsel very shortly and would have counsel place at least the annex on the
