3 * * * 1 2 State Real Estate Commission 3 June 2, 2020 * * * 4 5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Real 6 Estate Commission was held on Tuesday, June 2, 2020. 7 Anne Rubin, Chair, Industry Member, officially called 8 the meeting to order at 9:08 a.m. Roll call was 9 taken. There was a moment of silence for the unrest 10 happening currently throughout the country. * * * 11 12 Approval of minutes of the April 28, 2020 meeting 13 CHAIR RUBIN: If I could have a motion for the 14 15 approval of the draft minutes? 16 MR. SEEBECK: 17 So moved. MR. PICCIRILLI: 18 19 Second. 20 CHAIR RUBIN: 21 Thank you. All in favor? Any opposed? 22 [The motion carried unanimously.] 23 * * * 24 Report of Prosecutorial Division 25 [Tiffany Raker, Esquire, Commission Prosecutor,

4 presented a Consent Agreement for File No. 18-56-1 2 002051 and 18-56-002050.1 * * * 3 4 Report of Commission Counsel 5 [Juan A. Ruiz, Esquire, Commission Counsel, noted a 6 Proposed Adjudication and Order and 11 Final 7 Adjudications and Orders for discussion during 8 Executive Session. He referred members to the Supreme Court Decision 9 10 in the Ladd vs. Real Estate Commission of the 11 Commonwealth of Pennsylvania case that reversed the 12 Commonwealth Court's decision that dismissed the case. The case was remanded back to the Commonwealth Court. 13 14 He provided a brief history of the case and noted 15 there would be further discussion regarding the matter during Executive Session. 16 17 Mr. Ruiz discussed developing an FAQ for the BPOs 18 to posting on the website to alleviate ongoing 19 questions. He noted, since the last meeting, a waiver 20 of the regulation was granted by the Governor to allow live streaming of courses.] 21 * * * 2.2 23 Report of Commission Chair 24 [Anne M. Rubin, Chair, Industry Member, thanked Acting 25 Commissioner Johnson for "getting done what needed to

be done in a quick way so schools could get online to 1 teach courses". Chair Rubin stated licenses were 2 3 being mailed to brokers' offices, which were closed 4 due to the emergency crisis and returned to the state. 5 She thanked Commissioner Johnson and Ms. Linsenbach 6 for figuring out administratively where to mail those 7 licenses other than the broker of record's main office 8 address.] 9 * * * 10 Commission Secretary Position Vacant - Election 11 [The Commission discussed nominations for the vacant 12 Commission Secretary position.] MR. MCGETTIGAN: 13 14 I'd like to make a motion that Armand 15 Ferrara take the Secretary's position on 16 the line officers. 17 CHAIR RUBIN: 18 Do we have a second? 19 MR. SEEBECK: 20 Second. 21 CHAIR RUBIN: All in favor? Any opposed? 22 23 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 24 25 {Chair Rubin voiced her appreciation that the

licensees were able to return to work.] 1 * * * 2 3 Report of Commission Administrator 4 [Krista Linsenbach, Commission Administrator, updated 5 the Commission on renewals, noting that if a license had not yet been renewed, the license expiration date 6 7 would be as of 5/31/2020 and would remain in an active status until renewal or August 29, 2020, the extension 8 9 of the renewal period. She noted 50 percent of 10 licensee renewals were already received. 11 She noted a waiver request for a broker's office 12 will be discussed during Executive Session.] * * * 13 14 Report of Acting Commissioner 15 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 16 Professional and Occupational Affairs, noted a 17 consistency and compliance with the rather extensive 18 CDC guidelines. He commended Commission Counsel, the 19 Commission Administrator, and others for working 20 quickly to make the administrative changes during this 21 COVID emergency. He noted also that investigations 2.2 continue during this time. There was further 23 discussion regarding these matters.] * * * 24 25 Report of Committees

Education/Examination 1 2 [Chair Rubin noted these matters would be discussed 3 during Executive Session.] * * * 4 5 Public Session [William Festa, President, Pennsylvania Association of 6 7 Realtors, addressed the Commission regarding distance 8 learning. He noted members of the Pennsylvania 9 Association of Realtors, local associations, and real 10 estate schools were grateful for the temporary 11 implementation of livestreaming continuing education 12 during the pandemic. He further noted the PAR would 13 like to encourage the Commission and BPOA to make this 14 change permanent. 15 Mr. Festa commented on the ability to livestream 16 classes and provide greater access for educational 17 opportunities to licensees across the state. Ηe 18 stated many emails and letters were sent to Governor 19 Wolf urging him to sign legislation ensuring that 20 housing was essential in Pennsylvania. 21 Mr. Festa noted the formation of a task force to 22 help licensees better navigate the licensing system. 23 He requested information regarding how complaints were 24 being handled, so the enforcement actions could be 25 better communicated to membership.

Mr. Festa thanked the Commission for the
 opportunity to be heard and made himself available for
 questions by Commission members.

4 Acting Commissioner Johnson stated the policy 5 regarding all of the waivers that were instituted during COVID have a transitional period naturally 6 7 built in for when the Governor decides to end the 8 emergency declaration. Those waivers would not just 9 abruptly be cut off. He further stated making some of 10 the temporary waivers permanent was being discussed. 11 He would not speculate where the process was going. 12 Mr. Johnson noted the Policy Office would be happy to sit down with the Association for further discussion 13 14 regarding the matter.

15 Chair Rubin opined, based on what Commissioner 16 Johnson stated, the Commission should be able to 17 maintain that waiver at least for this licensing 18 period. She further stated the rules and regulations 19 needed to be examined further in terms of education 20 for the future. Chair Rubin suggested PAR put out FAQ 21 information regarding the options for the complaint 22 process and the required information to file 23 anonymously.

24 Michael McGee, CAE, RCE, CEO, Pennsylvania
25 Association of Realtors, will discuss the matter

1 further with Communications and see what else can be 2 done to reinforce that message.

There was discussion whether or not PAR or the Commission should do FAQ information, or whether PAR should put the information together for approval or validation by the Commission. The matter would be discussed further during Executive Session.

Acting Commissioner Johnson explained the rules 9 foster participation by the public to better protect 10 the citizens. He suggested maybe not all of the 11 capabilities had been explored with regard to getting 12 the message out concerning filing a complaint. He 13 further noted the mechanics of filing a complaint were 14 within the purview of the Commission.

15 Mr. Tarantino inquired whether there were steps 16 on filing a complaint against a licensee on the 17 Commission's website. Ms. Linsenbach explained there 18 are no specific steps listed on the website, but there 19 was a link directing where to go to file a complaint. 20 Mr. Michalowski commented he and staff routinely 21 work with individuals or associations regarding 2.2 procedural matters. He indicated a hotline was 23 staffed for those wanting to make a complaint and 2.4 discussed some of the complaints received.]
