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State Real Estate Commission

July 10, 2018

The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Real Estate Commission was held on Tuesday, July 10, 2018.

Alexis L. Barbieri, Chair, Public Member, officially called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. Jennifer Thomson, Esquire, Attorney General Designee, was not present at the commencement of the meeting.

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Roll Call of Commissioners/Pledge of Allegiance
[The Commissioners introduced themselves to the public.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

Audience members introduced themselves to the Commission.

19 Public Session

20 [A question was asked regarding the necessity for an

21 additional 15 hours for licensure. It was explained

22 that a task force from the Pennsylvania Association of

23 Realtors determined that there was not enough

24 education prior to licensure. A legislative act was

25 recently passed requiring the additional hours.

There was reference to Act 75, HB 863, passed by the General Assembly and signed into law on June 29, 2108. An audience member noted changes in two areas, one which allows licensees to perform broker price opinions (BPOs) under certain circumstances and a second which increases prelicense education requirements for licensure.

There was a suggestion to keep the 60-hour prelicensure education condition with the requirement to require an additional 15 hours within nine months of licensure. The Governor's bill on the matter has an effective date of August 29, 2018. Audience members offered comments regarding training, licensure requirements in other states as well as comments and suggestions related to the additional 15-hour requirement. There was also discussion regarding agents being improperly trained.]

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[Jennifer Thomson, Esquire, Attorney General Designee, entered the meeting at 11:42 a.m.]

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[It was again noted the additional 15-hour requirement 23 would become effective August 29, 2018, eight days after the August 21, 2018 Commission meeting. requirement would pertain to an applicant initially

1 beginning education classes after that date. Renewing licensees will be grandfathered.

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There were suggestions made to expand the course requirement in subject matters including the fundamentals course, practice course, the agreement of sale and how not to practice law. There was discussion regarding DocuSigning or the use of electronic signatures. Virtual meetings and possibly a meeting held before the regularly scheduled Commission meeting were suggested.

There was a suggestion that VEAC be reconvened to review the best area to apply the additional 15-hour requirement. The agreement of sale was noted to be the top subject area to implement that requirement.

There was discussion regarding the complaint process. Mr. Ruiz explained the Commission can only rule on complaints brought before it after the filing of the complaint with the Professional Compliance Office and the Prosecution Division. Mr. Ruiz reminded anyone filing a complaint to not contact the Commissioners individually as that individual would need to be recused from discussion on that particular 23 matter.

Chair Barbieri thanked the audience members for their participation and interaction with the

Affairs for further discussion regarding Executive Order 2017-03. He stated the Order instructed himself 2 along with an Advisory Committee to gather data 3 concerning over-licensing and the need to modernize job licensing. The information was then presented to the Governor, the policy secretary, the Secretary of the Commonwealth, and all Boards.

Commissioner Harlow discussed the four classes of licensure recommended by the Governor to be eliminated, including cemetery brokers, cemetery salespeople, campground membership salespeople, and 12 the rental listing referral agent, all of which would require legislative change. He answered questions by Commission members regarding the Order as it relates to the Real Estate Commission and its committees.

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Commissioner Harlow suggested that Counsel provide an analysis of the legislation introduced in committee including the Commission's opinions. He noted hearings would most likely be held and testimony could be provided. Commissioner Harlow commented on the opportunity for the Commission to use this as a vehicle to accomplish its goals.

It was noted that the findings of the Advisory Committee can be found on the website, specifically the section dealing with the Real Estate Commission.

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Commissioner Harlow noted the receipt of a
