20	Mr. Yeager informed everyone that Pennie replaced	
21	HealthCare.gov by setting up a state-based health	
22	insurance marketplace and establishing a reinsurance	
23	program on November 1, 2020. He reported 1 in 20	
24	Pennsylvanians do not have quality health insurance	
25	and 36 percent of Pennie customers are over 55. He	

1 noted that Pennie helps serve the uninsured and those 2 who believe they cannot afford quality health 3 insurance.

Mr. Yeager stated individuals could shop the competitive marketplace and identify insurance products, noting 90 percent of current customers qualify for financial assistance from Pennie.

8 Mr. Yeager explained that Pennie, in addition to 9 retaining the financial assistance available through 10 the marketplace, has advanced premium tax credits and 11 cost-sharing reductions that help with copays, 12 deductibles, and coinsurance. He reported that 13 371,000 individuals have enrolled in Pennie and 14 1 out of 4 customers pays less than \$1 a day, 14 15 percent pay less than \$1 a month, and 40 percent pay 16 less than \$75 a month for quality health insurance. 17 Mr. Yeager informed everyone that the open enrollment period is from November 1 through January 18 19 15. He also noted a special enrollment period from 20 January 1 through December 31 every year for 21 qualifying life events, including loss of Medical 22 Assistance or the Children's Health Insurance Program 23 (CHIP), loss of employer-sponsored coverage, and 24 others.

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Mr. Yeager noted that Pennie has developed

pathways for people to connect with coverage, including the relationship with the Department of Human Services, where a qualifying life event was created for Pennsylvania residents who are at or below 150 percent of the federal poverty limit and otherwise not able to secure protection through Medical Assistance.

Yeager addressed a program called the Path to 8 9 Pennie, which is a partnership between Pennie and the 10 Pennsylvania Department of Revenue, to help uninsured 11 tax filers in Pennsylvania. He explained that Form 12 REV-1882 could be completed and attached to their 13 state tax return and then the Pennsylvania Department 14 of Revenue securely shares that individual's 15 information with Pennie.

16 Mr. Yeager discussed the ending of continuous 17 coverage for Medical Assistance. He mentioned about 18 500,000 to 600,000 individuals were continually 19 covered through Medical Assistance during the 20 pandemic, noting the Pennsylvania Department of Human 21 Services resumed the annual redetermination as of 22 April 1. He mentioned that Pennie is a viable option 23 for those who are no longer covered. 24 Mr. Yeager also discussed the no wrong door
