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6 [Michael McGee, CAE, Chief Executive Officer,

7 Pennsylvania Association of Realtors, offered remarks

B on behalf of Mr. Raad. He also commented on House

9 Bill 1849, noting it was introduced by Representative

10 Todd Polinchock and that PAR has been working closely

11 | with him to get that bill through the legislature to

12 allow livestream education.

Mr. McGee stated real estate licensees were able to earn continuing education credits through livestream education when the Department of State issued an emergency waiver during the pandemic, but the waiver is due to expire next week. He noted that

18 the proposed statutory change is in line with the

19 Commission's proposed revision to their general

20 regulations by amending the Real Estate Licensing and

21 Registration Act (RELRA).

Mr. McGee commented that PAR continues to hear from real estate schools, where licensees have embraced remote learning, and both the schools and

PAR was strongly advocating for the passage of House Bill 1849 and fully expect the Senate to consider it when they return to session next week.

Mr. McGee stated PAR anxiously awaits the distribution of the Commission's proposed changes to the regulations to all stakeholders. He mentioned that PAR notified local associations and leadership of the proposed changes and will work through their internal procedures to provide feedback on the suggested provisions.

Mr. McGee announced PAR recently launched a new brand identity. He commented that members have had to shift to respond to the changing needs of their clients, and PAR is responding to that change as well. He stated PAR's new brand reflects the association's ability to adapt, provide the foundation for realtors to build successful businesses, better serve their clients, and be strong members of their communities.

Mr. McGee stated PAR's new brand identity reinforces the value that their members have come to expect. He noted foundational services like their legal hotline, standard forms, and advocacy give realtors the tools to focus on their future while PAR helps them get there. He encouraged everyone to visit parealtors.org to see their new brand identity.]
