20 confirmation in the past. He also noted written

21 confirmation was received once real estate instructor

22 licenses were renewed and asked whether the written

23 | confirmation process has changed.

25 whether the Commission had a timeline for when the

- 1 revised regulations would be available for review.
- 2 He offered PAR staff and leadership team assistance 3 to keep the process moving forward.
- Mr. Beadling thanked Chairman Ferrara personally and on behalf of PAR for his service and great things he has done for PAR members and the real estate industry and wished him all the best.

- Ms. Linsenbach addressed Mr. Beadling's concerns regarding CE audits, stating that Commission regulations allow for an audit of continuing education for the renewal period with no timeline outlined in the regulations.
- Ms. Linsenbach noted there is a requirement for an individual licensee to retain their continuing education certificates for 4 years and provide those by a certain time frame and that schools must provide those for 10 years. She informed everyone that the Commission reserves the right to implement an audit at its discretion.
- Ms. Linsenbach addressed approvals, stating that the commonwealth is making a push toward a paper-free environment and has not been providing paper approval letters. She explained that schools have been asked to continue to monitor their Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) accounts to determine when they receive

1 an approval for an education provider or course, 2 instructor, or satellite location.

Ms. Linsenbach noted schools would continue to receive the 5 by 7 pink certificate after their renewal verifying their school has been renewed; but individual approval for courses, satellite locations, and instructors is only available online at this point. She informed everyone that there are no plans to go back to a paper-based mail services for approval but is hopeful to have the technology in the future to make it easier for people to find the school, course, etc.

Acting Commissioner Claggett asked whether they receive that approval now in an email.

Ms. Linsenbach stated they do not receive any notification that anything has been approved but would be happy to discuss that process.

Acting Commissioner Claggett commented that he would look into sending an email.

Mr. Jayman addressed Mr. Beadling's question regarding regulations, noting they are being reviewed. He mentioned coming onboard about four months ago as co-counsel and is under the current understanding that somebody else will be coming onboard shortly. He reported being in the process of
