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   Public Comment
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   [Al Perry, President, Pennsylvania Association of
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Realtors (PAR), provided an update regarding the housing market. He reported that most of their members continue to see a steady market with demand staying strong for homes. He addressed their preliminary report from July showing an increase in prices with the median sale price around \$226,000 compared to \$208,000 about a year ago.

Mr. Perry stated the inventory remains a challenge in most of the markets throughout the state and reported a decrease of 27 percent in July but down more than 70 percent compared to July 2018. He noted transactions are down more than 20 percent compared to this time last year due to the need for more housing units, along with higher interest rates.

Mr. Perry noted the chief economist at the National Association of Realtors, Lawrence Yun, estimated that underbuilding for over a decade has caused a shortage of about 5 million homes to meet demand. He also noted the most recent National Association of Realtors 2023 member profile showed that more than 30 percent of their realtors named lack of inventory as the most critical factor limiting potential clients from purchasing homes.

Mr. Perry addressed feedback from local association executives noting that individuals trying

to schedule their Real Estate Exams are experiencing significant delays. He asked whether the Commission was aware of the issue or whether Pearson VUE has a plan to address the delays.

Acting Commissioner Claggett requested a list of folks having difficulty scheduling the exam because the Commission was not aware of the issue.

Mr. Perry reported full classes from local associations for introductory courses for people interested in the real estate market as a career. He noted a drop in renewals but a steady flow of new licensees, so it has not caused much of an impact in membership.

Stephanie Johnston, KENARRI Real Estate Division, noted being a licensed real estate broker in New York, Pennsylvania, and Florida. She stated New York State is not reciprocating with Pennsylvania any longer and asked whether Pennsylvania would be doing any kind of waiver.

Ms. Johnston noted being a resident of
Pennsylvania living 4 miles to the New York State
border and mentioned that it was easier for her to
receive a broker's license in New York State to
reciprocate to Pennsylvania. She mentioned that
Pennsylvania touches six states and is only

reciprocating with Maryland. She asked whether the
Commission was considering a good neighbor waiver,
noting that Pennsylvania has the highest education
requirements to become a broker at 240, where
salespersons and brokers are almost doubling all the
other states.

Ms. Johnston addressed the difficulty of completing the education when only 90 hours are online for The CE Shop for a broker. She reported Florida has broken down their hours and requires 63 for a salesperson and 45 for renewal and 72 for brokers and 60 for renewal. She agreed that salespeople and brokers need to be educated but suggested the Commission look at the education requirements again or maybe waivers.

Ms. Cestra commented that Pennsylvania was very instrumental when reciprocity started in getting so many different states to be reciprocal. She noted that New York decided they did not want to be reciprocal anymore and New Jersey would not be reciprocal with anybody.

Chair Tarantino also noted PAR was very involved when Pennsylvania got reciprocity with many states but then they just fell by the wayside.

Ms. Johnston noted that Pennsylvania cannot

1 control other states but can control what happens in 2 Pennsylvania. She asked the Commission to look at 3 requirements and the way the education has to be 4 taken, especially for a broker in Pennsylvania, where 5 maybe they can offer a good neighbor waiver for 6 states that touch Pennsylvania. She agreed that all 7 of the states are different and everyone should be educated but suggested reducing the hours and help neighboring states.

Ms. Cestra mentioned that the Commission would look at the Association of Real Estate License Law Officials (ARELLO) because they keep records of different state regulations to see what could be changed, along with looking at neighboring states.

Acting Commissioner Claggett stated a good neighbor waiver has not been considered. He noted it is worth reviewing to compare broker requirements in other states to Pennsylvania. He also mentioned that it would be a good idea to reach out to Michael McDonald.]
