She informed Board members that the 5 recommended fees by the Bureau of Finance and Operations are being inserted and would be before the 6 7 Board for review at the July meeting. 8 Ms. Miley referred to the Act 41 Annex for 16A-9 6925. She noted the proposed fees by the Bureau of 10 Finance and Operations have been inserted and asked the Board Chair to entertain a motion to release an 11 12 exposure draft to interested parties and stakeholders 13 for comment.] 14 CHAIR SANTIAGO: 15 Can I get a first? MS. MOYER: 16 17 So moved. 18 MR. DECRISCIO: Second. 19 20 CHAIR SANTIAGO: 21 Is there any discussion, members? 11 1 Santiago, aye; Claggett, aye; Early, 2 aye; Martin, aye; Moyer, aye; 3 DeCriscio, aye. 4 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 5 6 Appointment - Department of Human Services 7 Presentation [Lexi Deisenroth, Executive Assistant/Communications 8 9 Coordinator, Office of Income Maintenance (OIM), 10 Department of Human Services, presented to the Board 11 to provide information regarding the unwinding of the 12 continuous coverage requirement, communications and 13 outreach strategy, and how everyone can help to keep 14 Pennsylvanians covered. 15 Alexis Fogarty, Communications Director, 16 Pennsylvania Department of Human Services, Office of Press & Communications, stated Congress passed a law 17 18 through the federal public health emergency in 2020 for states to receive additional Medicaid funding as 19 20 long as they maintained coverage for people enrolled 21 in Medicaid regardless of the actual status of their 22 eligibility and is known as the continuous coverage 23 requirement. 24 Ms. Fogarty noted that since March 2020, despite

25 the fact that they have been maintaining people and

1 their eligibility, Pennsylvania made the decision to 2 continue to send renewal paperwork for individuals 3 receiving Medicaid and the Children's Health 4 Insurance Program (CHIP). She stated no one was 5 disenrolled throughout the public health emergency 6 and people maintained their health coverage.

Ms. Fogarty reported approximately 3.6 million people were enrolled in Medicaid as of March 2023 with approximately 632,000 who provided information that were no longer eligible, along with an additional population of individuals that did not submit a renewal at all during that time.

13 Ms. Fogarty noted at the end of 2022 that 14 Congress passed the Consolidated Appropriations Act 15 of 2023 that separated the continuous coverage 16 requirement from the public health emergency, which 17 ended the continuous coverage on March 31, 2023. She 18 stated the Department of Human Services (DHS) resumed 19 the pre-pandemic renewal processing as of April 1 but 20 allow all individuals the opportunity to have their 21 eligibility reviewed over the course of a 12-month 22 period. She mentioned that DHS may be able to renew 23 eligibility electronically without contacting the 24 client before paperwork is issued to conduct a 25 renewal.

Ms. Fogarty addressed communications concerning 1 2 Medical Assistance (MA) and CHIP recipients, where 90 3 days before the renewal is concentrated on people 4 updating their contact information, 60 to 30 days 5 before the renewal informs individuals that the 6 packet would be arriving soon and provides 7 information and instructions on how to renew, and 30 8 days before the renewal the packet would be sent, 9 along with text messages. She noted that all of the 10 communications are available at

11 dhs.pa.gov/staycovered.

Ms. Fogarty addressed eligibility, including eligibility notices indicating whether someone is still eligible for Medicaid or CHIP, as well as appeal and how to go through reconsideration. She noted that information would be securely and automatically transferred to Pennie for anyone found ineligible.

Ms. Fogarty reported that individuals have 90 days after the closure of coverage to go through a reconsideration of coverage and not have to submit a whole new application and start the process over. She noted information would also be sent to Pennie for those who do not return the renewal. She mentioned that outreach between DHS and Pennie has

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been a real asset in making sure Pennsylvanians stay 1 2 covered. 3 Charles (Chachi) Angelo, Director of External 4 Affairs, Pennie, stated Pennie replaced 5 Healthcare.gov in 2020 and is now the official health 6 insurance marketplace in Pennsylvania. 7 Mr. Angelo explained that Pennie is primarily 8 working on two populations with Medicaid unwinding, 9 including those deemed ineligible and those who do 10 not respond to the renewal packet. He noted setting 11 up a new policy for auto eligibility, where 12 individuals are given a head start in the enrollment 13 process and basically just have to choose a plan and 14 enroll within 120 days, although encourage enrollment 15 within 60 days to avoid a gap in coverage. Mr. Angelo reported 50 percent of households are 16 paying less than \$50 a month and 20 percent are 17 18 paying less than \$1 a month. He noted that 19 individuals coming over from Medicaid are getting 20 almost fully subsidized coverage and encouraged 21 everyone to relay that message. 22 Mr. Angelo stated Pennie also receives 23 information from DHS for individuals who do not 24 respond and contact them with a cobranded letter. Нe 25 stated Pennie, DHS, and CHIP all work on a no wrong

1 door policy to assist with the correct coverage even 2 for individuals who did not respond to their renewal 3 packet.

Mr. Angelo addressed infrastructure by helping individuals no matter their language in person, by phone, virtually, customer service line, and certified assistors and brokers at pennie.com/connect. He also encouraged everyone to recommend Pennie to those who may need health coverage.

11 Ms. Fogarty addressed the long-term advertising 12 campaign with Pennie and DHS through creative 13 resources in English and Spanish. She also mentioned 14 they would be working with a grassroots outreach 15 vendor for in-person outreach in different 16 communities. She encouraged everyone to visit their 17 website at dhs.pa.qov/staycovered for a number of 18 resources, including their communications toolkit and 19 helper portal. She mentioned that their helper 20 portal is a Listserv utilized solely for updates on 21 unwinding that includes sharing data and updates and 22 welcomed any support or partnership. She encouraged 23 everyone to share resources with their networks and 24 colleagues.]
