13 provided a report to Board members regarding her

14 attendance at the American Association of State

15 Counseling Boards Conference in February.

16 Chair Santiago addressed information concerning

17 | several states, noting Kentucky has licensed

18 professional counselors (LPCs) undergo 4000 hours of

19 | supervision, one state has eight full-time board

20 members through a contract, and Missouri State is

21 still at 48 credits and not substantial to

22 Pennsylvania requirements. She mentioned that some

23 states are reporting clinical supervision

24 jurisprudence exams or tutorials.

25 Chair Santiago stated the current biggest

- 1 complaints boards are facing across the United States
- 2 | include child custody complaints, boundary
- 3 | violations, and people lodging complaints about
- 4 telehealth delivery of services. She noted
- 5 exploitation of supervisees is also an issue, where
- 6 supervisors are charging fees upfront and then not
- 7 providing supervision to their supervisees.
- 8 Chair Santiago mentioned discussion concerning
- 9 supervision at the board level and what boards are
- 10 asking people to do. She reported the counseling
- 11 compact currently has 17 states. She addressed a
- 12 report from the American Association of State
- 13 | Counseling Boards (AASCB) affiliates, which include
- 14 | the American Counseling Association (ACA), who are
- 15 proud of the Medicare reimbursement for the
- 16 Association of Counselor Education and Supervision
- 17 (ACES). She mentioned that their national conference
- 18 | would be held in October 2024.
- 19 Chair Santiago announced the American Medical
- 20 Certification Association (AMCA) would be having
- 21 their annual conference in June. She noted Chi Sigma
- 22 | Iota is compiling data on supervisees and licensure
- 23 for over 400 programs. She reported that the
- 24 National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC) also
- 25 supported and celebrated the acceptance of the

Medicare omnibus and the mental health programs. She noted discussion concerning minority fellowship programs.

Chair Santiago informed Board members that the Masters in Psychology and Counseling Accreditation Council (MPCAC) discussed assessment of competence in graduates and how MPCAC is now in more than 23 states. She also noted Counselors for Social Justice discussed their recent undertaking of engaging in supervision research and diversity, equity, and inclusion initiatives.

Ms. Martin wanted to clarify that all of the information in Chair Santiago's report is specific to LPCs, although some of it may crossover to some of the other professional disciplines.

Chair Santiago explained that everyone at the meetings are LPC board members, LPC administrators, or LPC board counsel and discussion applies to professional counseling.]

[Sarah E. McNeill, Board Administrator, provided an overview of the Association of Social Work Boards update on the Social Work Interstate Compact. She stated the Social Work Interstate Compact offers important advantages to social workers who live and work in different states, plan to relocate, or hope to expand the services they offer.

Ms. McNeill mentioned that the individuals served by social workers would benefit from increased access to quality care. She noted the National Association of Social Workers (NASW) issued a statement on February 3 opposing the use of the one and only element in the professional licensure equation that offers common ground across all United States and Canadian jurisdictions, which is the competency examination.

Ms. McNeill noted their position is clear, where the compact would need to contain some measure of exam requirements consistent with the common

1 standards among states, and it is not feasible that

- 2 | the exam requirements would be wholly removed in a
- 3 | manner that would be consistent with NASW's position
- 4 as stated in its most recent press release. She
- 5 noted that ASWB is committed to supporting the
- 6 interstate compact as a valuable foundation for
- 7 cross-jurisdictional common ground benefiting their
- 8 members, the profession, and the public.

- 11 could be found at www.swcompact.org.]
