3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Social Workers, 3 Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors 4 November 30, 2021 5 * * * 6 7 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 9:30 a.m., the Board entered into Executive Session 8 with Jaime D. Black, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the 9 10 purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 11 a number of matters before the Board and to receive 12 advice of counsel. The Board entered into public 13 session at 11:31 a.m.] * * * 14 15 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 16 Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family 17 Therapists, and Professional Counselors was held on 18 Tuesday, November 30, 2021. Joy E. Corby, Ph.D., 19 LMFT, Chair, called the meeting to order at 11:31 a.m. * * * 20 21 [Chair Corby noted the meeting was being recorded, and 22 those who continued to participate were giving their 23 consent to be recorded.] * * * 24 25 Approval of minutes of the October 21, 2021 meeting

1 CHAIR CORBY: 2 I believe that corrections were sent to the Board administrator for the draft 3 4 minutes. 5 Do I hear a motion to accept the 6 minutes with the corrections? 7 DR. JORDAL: 8 So moved. 9 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 10 Second. CHAIR CORBY: 11 12 All in favor, raise your hand. Any 13 opposed? Abstentions? Recusals? 14 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 15 Introduction of Board Members 16 [Chair Corby requested Board members introduce 17 18 themselves.] * * * 19 20 Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations Annual Budget Presentation 21 22 [Shannon Boop, Fiscal Management Specialist 1, Bureau 23 of Finance and Operations, Department of State, 24 addressed the licensee population from a revenue 25 standpoint. She noted 28,882 licenses at the time of

1 the report, which increased this morning to 28,994.
2 She also noted from FY17-19, licenses increased by
3 2,270 with another increase of 3,640 from FY19-21.
4 She reported 9 licensed bachelor social workers at the
5 time of the report for FY21 with a recent increase to
6 11.

7 Ms. Boop addressed revenue by source. She noted 8 the biennial total. She stated 96% of revenue came 9 from renewals and applications.

Ms. Boop provided a categorical breakdown of expenses. She noted expenses for FY19-20, FY20-21, and the current FY21-22 budget and expenses as of November 15, 2021. She reported on the current expenses.

Ms. Boop reviewed revenues and expenses for the current fiscal year showing a negative balance. She noted going forward that the bottom line would continue to go further into the negative and the Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) would need to return to present a fee increase package at the next Board meeting.

Dr. Jordal requested more information regarding the increase in hearing expenses for FY21-22 and what portion was due to court record stenography compared to the hearing examiner's office.

Ms. Boop stated the Hearing Examiner's Office informed BFO of a large complex case for FY21-22. She noted the current stenographer costs for the current year and BFO's projected figure.

5 Ms. Boop provided a breakdown of Board member 6 expenses, noting FY19-20 and FY20-21, and the FY21-22 7 budget and FY21-22 expenses as of November 15, 2021. 8 She noted a recent increase in the expenses. She 9 noted the current budget to be adequate, which would 10 be carried over to FY22-23.

Ms. Boop noted that any excess revenue goes back into the restricted account for the Board's use.

13 Chair Corby commented that the Board was told at 14 another presentation that an increase was not 15 necessary because the Board would be adding on the 16 bachelor social work.

17 Amanda Richards, Acting Fiscal Chief, Bureau of 18 Finance and Operations, Department of State, explained 19 that BPO was told two years ago that the Board was 20 anticipating 100 licensees for bachelor social work, 21 but there were only 9 when the report was created. 2.2 She mentioned that more licensed bachelor social 23 workers will help to bring the revenue up. 24 Dr. Jordal asked whether any of the boards have 25 any type of fee structure where some licenses are more

affordable than others with regard to the application 1 fee or whether there a set fee across all boards. 2 3 Commissioner Johnson explained that all of the 4 boards are responsible for reviewing their expenses 5 and revenue and determining a fee structure based on 6 what BFO provides them on an annual basis. 2 acknowledged Ms. Matter's last meeting, noting her to 3 be an invaluable resource and thanked her for her 4 commitment and service.

5 Ms. Matter informed the Board that the new start 6 time for Executive Session for January and March 2022 7 would be from 9:00 a.m. until 11:00 a.m. She 8 mentioned that the Board can decide what time to start 9 the other Board meetings at the March meeting based on 10 whether they will be virtual or not.

11 Chair Corby asked Commissioner Johnson to provide 12 information regarding continuing virtual meetings and 13 whether there had been discussion about interpreting 14 what in person means for the boards whose statutes 15 require in person.

Commissioner Johnson informed the Board of 16 17 legislation that would provide for hybrid 18 presentations in addition to the in-person function, 19 where there would also a streaming component. Нe 20 stated the intent of the legislation is to capture all 21 of the public benefits recognized through the 22 pandemic, where meetings are now more transparent and 23 accessible to the public.

24 Commissioner Johnson stated, barring any changes 25 or superseding events, everyone would return to in-

1 person meetings on April 1, 2022, and still be allowed 2 to stream the meeting to individuals viewing through 3 the link.

Commissioner Johnson mentioned that the challenge 4 5 internally is making sure that all of the hardware and software matches the intent of the legislation, 6 7 whether that means transitioning to a slightly different application or going to a Teams application 8 9 to stream the meetings as opposed to Webex. He stated 10 the plan was to allow for streaming and the 11 continuation of meetings in the event that whether it 12 is commuting, weather or someone's inability to be 13 present.

14 Chair Corby asked whether there would be an 15 option to being in person because Board regulations 16 require four of the eight meetings to be in person and 17 whether the interpretation of physically present is 18 that going to be defined.

Commissioner Johnson believed the provisions would allow for the virtual presence to meet the quorum requirement but does not eliminate the conditions for physical presence. He also believed the legislators intended for this to not change the quorum requirements but provide greater flexibility in extenuating circumstances, where a Board member could

still participate even if they are not physically 1 2 present. He noted that the extenuating circumstances 3 would be up to the boards to determine. Ms. Painter requested an update regarding 4 5 additional Board members. Commissioner Johnson noted working with the 6 7 governor's office on vetting potential candidates and preparing an upcoming package. He mentioned that a 8 9 large number of the boards had their candidates vetted 10 but could not speak specifically to their Board. 11 Ms. Martin asked Commissioner Johnson whether he said the legislation passed regarding Board meetings 12 13 held online. 14 Commissioner Johnson noted it passed in one 15 chamber and believed it was still before the House.] * * * 16 17 Miscellaneous [Joy E. Corby, Ph.D., LMFT, Chair, referred to the 18 19 correspondence from the American Association of State 20 Counseling Boards (AASCB) regarding the Council for 21 Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational 22 Programs (CACREP) and the AASCB Annual Conference for 23 the Board's review. 24 Chair Corby opened the floor to Board members for 25 any comments they would like to make to Ms. Matter,

1 and the Board members expressed their appreciation of 2 her support to the Board members and constituents and 3 wished her the very best in her retirement.

Chair Corby expressed appreciation for her
patience, guidance, and wealth of knowledge to the
Board and wished her the best.

7 Ms. Matter noted that it had been a pleasure8 working with all of the Board members over the years.

9 Dr. Santiago addressed her attendance at the 10 AASCB Meeting a couple weeks ago regarding guidelines 11 and bylaws. She informed the Board that Matt Grayson 12 is the new executive director of AASCB and that AASCB 13 is moving from North Carolina to Kentucky.

14 Dr. Santiago mentioned AASCB has a new firm 15 called Council on Licensure, Enforcement, and 16 Regulation (CLEAR) Association Management. She stated 17 the AASCB has stepped back from the Center for 18 Credentialing & Education (CCE), which was supported 19 by the National Board for Certified Counselors (NBCC). 20 She noted the AASCB Annual Conference on February 8 21 and February 18.

Dr. Jordal reminded Board members that effective January 1 the Commission on Accreditation for Marriage and Family Therapy Education (COAMFTE) is transitioning to Standards Version 12.5. He stated

the principal impact related to licensure boards was 1 2 where programs would have the option to lower their 3 total clinical contact hours under the master's degree to potentially 300 if permitted by the state. 4 5 Dr. Jordal commented that Pennsylvania had a 6 minimum of 300 hours but other states with a minimum 7 of 500 hours may be affected in four or five years. He stated that they are reducing the total number of 8 9 required direct client contact hours under the 10 master's degree and thinks there is going to be 11 differences in the master's level total hours in a few years across applicants for licensure, which may come 12 13 up under endorsement. 14 Chair Corby added that their program has always 15 done 300 hours and that the change in Standard 12.5 is 16 all about competency. 17 Dr. Jordal stated that this aligns with the shift 18 within marriage and family therapist (MFT) education 19 to specify an outcome-based framework. He commented 20 that it would be interesting to watch overtime the 21 data that supports the total number of hours required 2.2 to be competent.] 23 * * * 24 [The Board recessed from 12:59 p.m. until 1:31 p.m.] 25 * * *
