Meet the New Board Chair: Dr. Carol Rose

Carol E. Rose, M.D. was elected by her fellow members of the Board of Medicine to a one-year term as Chair of the Board in January 2010. Dr. Rose has been a member of the Board since April 2006, after being nominated by **Governor Edward G. Rendell** and confirmed by the Pennsylvania Senate.

Dr. Rose is an Associate Professor of Anesthesiology at the University of Pittsburgh School of Medicine and is on the staff of UPMC-Presby. She is a 1978 graduate of the University of Miami Miller School of Medicine, and took her residency training at Mercy Hospital in Pittsburgh. She became board certified in 1983.

Her clinical interest is focused on the anesthetic care of patients receiving electroconvulsive therapy (ECT) at Western Psychiatric Institute and Clinic in Pittsburgh.

She is a past president of the Pennsylvania Medical Society, past president of the Pennsylvania Society of Anesthesiologists, and a former delegate to the American Medical Association and the American Society of Anesthesiologists.

At the Board of Medicine, Dr. Rose has been interested in the assessment and relicensure of physicians who wish to return to the practice of medicine after a significant absence from practice.

Dr. Rose wishes to share her appreciation of the wonderful work done by the immediate past chair of the board, **Dr. Ollice Bates**. Dr. Bates assured that all members of the Board of Medicine had ample opportunity to contribute their expertise to the smooth running of the business of the board. He was particularly cognizant of the members of the public who attended the meetings, and regularly sought their thoughtful input.
