Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, stated the 11 meeting of the State Board of Accountancy was being 12 held by teleconference pursuant to Governor Wolf's 13 March 16, 2020 waiver of the physical presence 14 requirement in Section 2.3(c) of the Certified Public 15 Accountant (CPA) Law.] * * * 16 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 17 18 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into executive session 19 with Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, to have 20 attorney-client consultations and for the purpose of 21 conducting quasi-judicial deliberations. The Board 22 returned to open session at 10:30 p.m.] 23 * * * 24 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 25 Board of Accountancy was held on Tuesday, April 20,

2021. Keri A. Ellis, CPA, Chair, welcomed everyone to 1 2 the meeting. 3 * * * Roll Call 4 5 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Mr. Rouse.] * * * 6 7 Approval of minutes of the January 20, 2021 meeting 8 CHATR ELLIS: 9 The first item on our agenda is approval 10 of the January 20, 2021 draft minutes. 11 [The Board discussed corrections to the minutes.] 12 CHAIR ELLIS: 13 Did anyone else have any comments on the 14 minutes? Hearing none. 15 I'd like to ask for a motion to approve the January 20, 2021 draft 16 minutes with revisions as noted. 17 MS. JENSIK: 18 19 So moved. 20 CHAIR ELLIS: 21 Do we have a second? 22 MR. OCKER: 23 Second. 24 CHAIR ELLIS: 25 All those in favor, say aye.

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[The motion carried. Sheri Risler abstained from 1 2 voting on the motion.] * * * 3 4 Report of Prosecutorial Division 5 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted two 6 abstentions for item 2 on the agenda for Case Nos. 19-7 55-002162 & 20-55-005827, where the Board would not 8 have sufficient affirmative votes. 9 Ms. Lucci would move the Consent Agreements to 10 the agenda for the May meeting with Tiffany Raker 11 present.] * * * 12 13 [Angela B. Lucci, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison, 14 presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 19-55-15 016613.] MR. ROUSE: 16 17 I believe the Board would entertain a 18 motion to adopt the Consent Agreement at 19 item 3 on the agenda at Case No. 19-55-20 016613. 21 Is there such a motion? 22 CHAIR ELLIS: 23 So moved. 24 MS. 8	[Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed		
9	the visit at the last meeting with Colleen Conrad of		
10	the National Association of State Boards of		
11	Accountancy (NASBA) who presented to the Board to		
12	discuss a number of issues, including CPA Evolution as		
13	well as remote testing.		
14	Mr. Rouse referred to the white paper and letter		
15	regarding remote testing, where NASBA is proposing a		
16	pilot program for CPAs throughout the nation and		
17	requested all state boards of accountancy to determine		
18	whether or not there were any impediments to		
19	participating in the remote testing program.		
20	Mr. Rouse informed the Board that the time and		
21	location for holding the examination shall be		
22	determined by the Board and may be changed from time		
23	to time under CPA Law Section 3.1(b). He also noted		
24	the examination may be administered in either written		
25	or computerized form and would not be an impediment to		

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7 participating in the pilot program.] 1 2 MR. ROUSE: I believe there is a motion to allow 3 Pennsylvania candidates to participate 4 5 in the NASBA pilot program from remote 6 testing and for this Board to accept the 7 scores of the pilot program. 8 Is there such a motion? 9 CHAIR ELLIS: 10 So moved. 11 MR. 6	noted Section 8.8(b) should be a standard for which	
7	the Board requires firm ownership changes.]

25	Report of Board Counsel - Miscellaneous	

1 [Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, read a
2 statement regarding a scam alert. He informed the
3 Board that the Bureau of Professional and Occupational
4 Affairs (BPOA) received reports that persons
5 pretending to be from one of the health-related boards
6 were contacting licensees by phone and mail about the
7 status of their licenses.

8 Mr. Rouse noted scammers were altering 9 information on caller ID to reflect as appearing to be 10 from the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania and threatening 11 license suspension for failure to act and falsely 12 claiming involvement with agencies such as the Federal 13 Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Drug Enforcement 14 Administration (DEA).

Mr. Rouse stated scammers are known to threaten license suspension for failure to provide personal information and provided reminders from BPOA concerning contact and personal information for licensees.

20 Mr. Rouse mentioned that those who are the 21 subject of an investigation or disciplinary action 22 would receive notice by certified mail and/or personal 23 service and provided with a contact name and phone 24 number. He informed everyone to contact their local 25 police department or the state police if they have

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been a victim of the scam.] 1 * * * 2 Report of Board Chair 3 4 [Keri A. Ellis, CPA, Chair, noted no changes to the 5 Pennsylvania Sunshine Act, Gift Ban Policy, and Board 6 committee assignments since the last Board meeting.] * * * 7 8 Review of Program Sponsor Applications 9 [Keri A. Ellis, CPA, Chair, noted two program sponsor applications.] 10 MR. ROUSE: 11 12 I believe there is a motion to defer the 13 vote on item 11, J. Martin and Associates LLC, and to hear that matter 14 15 at the next Board meeting. 16 Is there such a motion? MS. ERICSON: 17 18 I would like to make a motion to defer 19 No. 11. 20 MR. Ellis, CPA, Chair, noted the NASBA fee change 4 implementation letter reflecting the increases for 5 exam fees next year.] * * * 6 7 Miscellaneous - American Institute of Certified Public 8 Accountants [Keri A. Ellis, CPA, Chair, referred to the American 9 10 Institute of Certified Public Accountants (AICPA) 11 correspondence regarding an update on peer review. 12 She also noted the Small Business Administration 13 announced they have steps to improve the Paycheck 14 Protection Program (PPP) review process. * * * 15 16 Miscellaneous - National Association of State Boards 17 of Accountancy 18 [Keri A. Ellis, CPA, Chair, again noted the NASBA fee 19 letter at item 25. She addressed NASBA Q4 2020 20 candidate performance, noting 55,000 candidates sat 21 for the exam with a pass rate of 51%. She reported Q4 22 2020 overall statistics for Pennsylvania, showing 23 1,466 candidates sat for the exam with a pass rate of 24 48.33%. 25 Chair Ellis noted the NABSA Q4 candidate care

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report showed candidate issues were mostly pencil and 1 2 paper requests. She reported Pennsylvania's ranked 3 6th in the number of candidates, 6th in the number of 4 sections, 40th in pass rate, and 38th in average 5 score. She mentioned the NASBA CPA Exam international 6 expansion to Korea, Japan, and Asia regions.] * * * 7 8 Miscellaneous - Election of Officers MR. ROUSE: 9 10 Is there a motion to nominate a Board member for vice chair of the State Board 11 12 of Accountancy? 13 CHATR ELLIS: I'd like to make a motion to nominate 14 Sheri Risler for vice chair. 15 16 MR.
