Under the existing Order, the following matters that are retained by the Board for a hearing are cases involving applications under Section 4.2 would be the applications to sit for the CPA Exam.

Cases involving applications under
Section 9.2 of the CPA Law would be
petitions for reinstatement. Also
grounds for discipline under Section
9.1(a)(1), (2), (6), (14), and (16) and
any cases that have multiple grounds for
discipline but one of those grounds is a
ground that is retained by the Board.

The Board is aware that cases that
the Board has retained can be brought
before the Board on a case-by-case basis
to discuss whether or not those cases
