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Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Discussion

[Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed

11 16A-5516 regarding competence to supervise attest

12 services. He stated the CPA Law was amended on June

13 19, 2013, by eliminating the requirement that every

14 candidate must have at least 400 hours of experience

15 in attest activity in order to be licensed as a CPA.

Mr. Rouse referred to 49 Pa. Code § 11.23a, where the Board established competency requirements for licensees who supervise attest activity, which includes 400 hours of experience and at least 24 hours of continuing professional education (CPE) in the area of accounting, auditing, or attest during the 24 months immediately preceding issuance of the report.

Mr. Rouse noted the Board reviewed § 11.23a(a) as written and noticed the current language limits the applicability of the competency requirements to

licensees supervising and signing or authorizing another to sign an accountant's report for attest services.

Mr. Rouse commented that the Board proposes to amend § 11.23a(a) and (b) to clarify that a licensee who supervises, signs, or authorizes another to sign an accountant's report for attest services must meet the competency standards.

Mr. Rouse also noted the practical application of § 11.23a(b)(1)(i) produce the unintended burden of causing individuals, firms, and governmental agencies to adjust CPE schedules and implement new CPE tracking formats to ensure compliance with the requirement of having at least 24 hours of CPE in the area of accounting, auditing, or attests during the 24 months immediately preceding issuance of the report for attest services.

Mr. Rouse stated the Board believes that licensees can maintain competency by completing 12 hours of CPE in the calendar year preceding and 12 years during the calendar year the report is issued. He noted the Board proposes amending § 11.23a(b)(1)(i) to require 12 hours of CPE in the calendar year immediately preceding issuance of the report and 12 hours of CPE during the calendar year in which the

1 report is used.

2 Mr. Rouse referred to the proposed annex and 3 preamble for competence to supervise attest services.

4 He noted the matter was discussed in October 2018 but

5 did not see that the annex had been issued to the

6 stakeholders as an exposure draft or see a vote and

7 presented the annex and preamble for approval.]

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[Ronald K. Rouse, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed 2 3 16A-5517 regarding licensure by endorsement. 4 provided the proposed annex and preamble. He noted it 5 addressed how to be considered substantially 6 equivalent under licensure by endorsement, where someone would have to hold a CPA license from a jurisdiction that requires a baccalaureate or higher degree from a college or university accredited by an 10 accrediting agency nationally recognized by the United 11 States Department of Education or a college or 12 university approved by the Board.

Mr. Rouse stated the applicant would also have had to achieve a passing score on the Uniform

Certified Public Accountant Examination or other

Board-approved skills examination.

Mr. Rouse also noted the Board proposes to amend \$ 11.5a(a)(2) to require a demonstration of competency for licensure by endorsement. He mentioned that competency could be shown either by experience in practice of the profession, completion of continuing education, or achievement of a passing score on a Board-approved skills examination. He presented a copy of the preamble, which is the Board's discussion of why licensure by endorsement is necessary.]

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a group to research the possibility of eliminating quarterly testing windows by implementing continuous testing.
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Mr. Rouse stated that continuous testing was implemented on July 1, 2020. He mentioned that the regulation is to have Board regulations come in line with continuous testing to eliminate the testing window so candidates can take the CPA Exam every day that Prometric has a testing site available for the candidate to sit for the exam.]
