encouraged Board members to attend.] 1 2 3 Appointment - American Institute of Architects 4 Pennsylvania 5 [Amal Mahrouki, Director of Legislative Affairs, American Institute of Architects Pennsylvania, also 6 addressed the presentation with Mr. Michalowski for their entire membership on September 28, 2022, at 10 She mention having a Bureau of Professional and 10 Occupational Affairs (BPOA) overview for all of their 11 members to include an introduction of the 12 prosecutorial division, review of information on individual and firm licensure, review of the 13 14 application process, and review best practices. 15 Ms. Mahrouki noted looking forward to the 16 partnership and presentations. AIA should have 17 registration up shortly, along with being registered 18 for the American Institute of Architects Pennsylvania 19 (AIA) continuing education (CE). 2.0 Ms. Mahrouki noted AIA is currently reviewing the digital signature and seal regulations and is 21 22 currently with their counsel and Government Affairs 2.3 Committee. She mentioned AIA is currently finishing

up their review and would likely be sending a letter

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to IRRC.

Ms. Mahrouki informed Board members that AIA is preparing for the next legislative session by doing a legislative survey for all AIA members and other architects within the commonwealth and would like all architects to participate. She stated AIA was coming up with questions to ask on the legislative survey and sets the agenda for the next two-year legislative session.

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Ms. Mahrouki anticipated mandatory continuing education, building codes legislation, and legal reform to be priorities for the next legislative session. She also mentioned AIA is keeping an eye on specialization of the practice of architecture to see what is happening in other states.

Ms. Mahrouki stated AIA would entertain anything the Board would like to see as far as questions on the legislative survey.

President Roller commented that the Board has been looking at adopting continuing education because Pennsylvania remains one of three jurisdictions that does not require continuing education and inhibits their practitioners from working in other states.

Ms. McClenaghan mentioned that she would like to see the mechanics' lien addressed on the legislation survey and another Board member would like to have the

statute of repose completed.

Ms. Mahrouki informed Board members that AIA has
entered into proactive discussions with
representatives from the Interior Design Legislative
Coalition of Pennsylvania (IDLCPA), along the lines of
the legislative survey and mandatory continuing
education, to see if there is any common ground and if
they could come up with some frame of reference for
the next legislative session.

Ms. Mahrouki addressed a meeting with representatives from the Small Firms Roundtable regarding building codes, noting a request that the licensure Board consider including any building code updates or accessibility code updates in their newsletter.

President Roller informed Ms. Mahrouki that the Board typically issues a newsletter in June or July and offered to include code updates to next year's list of items.

Stephen M. Swarney, JD, Executive Director,
American Institute of Architects Pennsylvania,
informed Board members to check their email for events
coming up on their calendar featuring architects. He
noted a legal boot camp in the fall was in the process
of being finalized and everyone should soon receive

- details. He mentioned everything is in conjunction
  with AIA New York and AIA New Jersey and would feature
  legal issues relevant to everyone from solo practices
  to large firms.
- Mr. Swarney addressed the series, shaking up

  small cities, where they shine the spotlight on some

  of their smaller cities and how they are using

  architecture and good design to revitalize some of

  those cities. He mentioned their awards process

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3 Regulations/Statute

[Mary E. McClenaghan, RA, referred to § 9.46 regarding requirements for examination eligibility. She noted the new section § 9.46(a) states that candidates who hold a National Architectural Accrediting Board (NAAB)-accredited degree and have completed or are in the process of completing the Architectural Experience Program (AXP) may apply directly to NCARB to sit for the ARE. She expressed concern that it relinquishes

President Roller stated anybody who does not have a NAAB professional degree comes to the Board but asked what happens if somebody has a NAAB degree and completes the AXP as to whether the individual would come to the Board or simply apply to NCARB.

ARE request but being unsure as to how the rest were

Mr. Fritz also asked Ms. Li for the application process when the Board has an application for someone to take the exam and they have a NAAB degree as to whether they apply directly to NCARB to take the exam or still requires Board approval.

Amanda Li, Department of State, explained that

1 the individual would request their eligibility through
2 NCARB but the Board approves those.

Mr. Fritz commented that applicants apply to NCARB but still requires Board approval. He noted it makes it clear to applicants not to come to the Board first but to apply to NCARB first, where the Board administrator would then go into NCARB's list to see who applied, and then the Board approves or disapproves.

Mr. Fritz noted the addition of a sentence to read, "The request will then be reviewed by the Board." He mentioned it would clarify the issue of applicants thinking they had to come to the Board for approval before going to NCARB to apply.

Ms. McClenaghan referred to § 9.49a(f) regarding the adoption of AXP, where applicants who do not hold a degree from a NAAB-approved program must complete six years of practical experience and asked whether the word "continuous" should be added.

Mr. Fritz stated it would be at the Board's discretion to determine practical experience if it is long ago and broken up but mentioned that the Board would not necessarily say no to someone who takes a six-month break.]
