16 Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided a summary of

17 | the prosecution division's caseload during 2021.

18 Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 193 cases

19 were opened in 2021 for the State Architects Licensure

20 Board, which is up from 109 cases in 2020. She noted

21 closing 95 cases in 2021 and 119 in 2020. She

22 reported 146 open cases for the Board as of January 1,

23 2022.

Ms. DeLaurentis addressed enforcement actions,

25 noting 3 cases that resulted in discipline and 24

warning letters in 2021, which is a decrease from 37
in 2020.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted the prosecution division opened 1,223 COVID-related cases in 2020 with zero of those cases for the Board. She reported 543 COVID cases were opened in 2021 with zero of those cases for the Board.

Ms. DeLaurentis reported 18,363 cases were opened in 2021, which is up from 2020 at 13,394. She also reported closing 15,994 files for 2021 and 13,274 in 2020. She stated there was an increase in the cases but also an increase in the cases closed and credited staff for managing those cases.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted the total number of current cases for the office as of January 1, 2022, is 15,141. She thanked the Board and counsel for working with prosecution division.]

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19 Appointment - Bureau of Finance and Operations Annual
20 Budget Presentation

21 [Michelle Witmer, Bureau of Finance and Operations, 22 Department of State, informed the Board that the

23 Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) looks at the

24 licensee population on a biennial basis from a revenue

25 standpoint. She noted 9,891 licensees in FY17-18 with

an increased in FY19-20 to 10,119 and a decreased to 9,964 as of the date of the report in FY21-22. She reported the Board renews in June of odd years and just had a renewal this past June. She reported an increase of 16 licenses, bringing the total to 9,980 licensees.

Ms. Witmer addressed revenue by category for the biennial total, noting 98% of revenue is coming from renewals and applications. She noted the other 2% cannot be counted on as a consistent revenue source.

Ms. Witmer provided a categorical breakdown of expenses. She noted expenses incur through direct cost, timesheet-based cost, and licensee-based fees. She reported on the expenses in FY19-20, FY202-21 decreased, and the current year as of January 3, 2022 when the report was created. She mentioned a recent increase in expenses, noting the projected budget of expenses.

Ms. Witmer reviewed revenues and expenses for FY21-22, noting the anticipated ending balance. She mentioned projected expenses through FY24-25 continue to be lower than revenue and fiscally balanced.

Ms. Witmer reviewed Board member expenses, noting a breakdown of expenses by expense type. She provided an overview of actual expenses for FY19-20, FY20-21,

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   and as of the date of the report. She mentioned the
