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3 * * * 1 2 State Board of Auctioneer Examiners 3 May 9, 2022 * * * 4 5 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 6 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into executive Session 7 with Jason E. McMurry, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations and 8 9 to receive legal advice on matters that are currently pending before the Board. The Board returned to open 10 11 session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Auctioneer Examiners was held on Monday, 15 May 9, 2022. Nevin B. Rentzel, Chairman, Professional 16 Member, called the meeting to order at 10:39 a.m. * * * 17 Introduction of Board Members 18 19 [Chairman Rentzel requested an introduction of Board 20 members.1 21 * * * 22 Amendment to the Agenda 23 MR. MCMURRY: 24 We need to amend the agenda to include a 25 request for travel to the national

4 1 conference. I would ask for the chair to 2 3 entertain a motion at this time to 4 approve amending the agenda to include 5 discussion about sending a member of the 6 Board to the national conference in 7 July. 8 MR. TRACE: 9 So moved. 10 MR. MCMURRY: 11 Could I get a second? 12 ACTING COMMISSIONER CLAGGETT: 13 Second. MR. MCMURRY: 14 We'll do a roll call vote. 15 16 Nevin Rentzel, yes; Arion Claggett, aye; 17 18 Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald Rader, 19 aye; Daniel Trace, aye; Christopher Dey, 20 aye. 21 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 22 23 Approval of minutes of the January 10, 2022 meeting 24 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 25 First order of business is approval of

5 our minutes. Everyone has had those 1 distributed to them. I'd ask for a 2 3 motion to accept the minutes as 4 presented. MR. HOSTETTER: 5 So moved. 6 7 MR. TRACE: 8 Second. 9 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 10 The motion has been moved and seconded. We need a roll call for that as well. 11 12 13 Nevin Rentzel, aye; Arion Claggett, 14 abstain; Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald 15 Rader, approve; Daniel Trace, aye; 16 Christopher Dey, abstain. 17 Any discussion? The minutes are 18 approved. 19 [The motion carried. Arion Clagget and Christopher 20 Dey abstained from voting on the motion.] 21 * * * 22 Report of Prosecutorial Division 23 [J. Karl Geschwindt, Esquire, Board Prosecution 24 Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 25 19-64-011232 and Case Nos. 18-64-002562 & 18-64-

6 002561.] 1 2 MR. MCMURRY: 3 For Consent Agreement Case No. 19-64-011232, the chair would entertain a 4 5 motion to approve that Consent 6 Agreement. 7 MR. TRACE: I make the motion. 8 9 MR. MCMURRY: 10 Second? 11 MR. HOSTETTER: 12 Second. 13 MR. MCMURRY: 14 We'll do a roll call vote. 15 16 Nevin Rentzel, aye; Arion Claggett, aye; Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald Rader, 17 18 abstain; Daniel Trace, aye; Christopher 19 Dey, aye. 20 [The motion carried. Gerald Rader abstained from 21 voting on the motion. The Respondent's name is 22 Michael T. Wilson.] 23 * * * 24 MR. MCMURRY: 25 The chair would entertain a motion to

7 approve the Consent Agreement at Case 1 2 Nos. 18-64-002562 & 18-64-002561. 3 Do I have a motion to approve that 4 Consent Agreement? MR. TRACE: 5 6 So moved. 7 MR. HOSTETTER: 8 Second? 9 MS. KOCHER: 10 Nevin Rentzel, aye; Arion Claggett, aye; 11 Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald Rader, 12 abstain; Daniel Trace, aye; Christopher 13 Dey, aye. 14 [The motion carried. Gerald Rader abstained from 15 voting on the motion. The Respondent's name is Best 16 Buy Auctioneers and Joseph Benigno.] * * * 17 18 Report of Board Counsel 19 [Jason E. McMurry, Esquire, Board Counsel, provided an 20 update on Act 41 regarding licensure by endorsement 21 that was previously approved by the Board. He noted 22 the regulations would be published officially as 23 proposed on May 11 for public comment. 24 Mr. McMurry stated the auctioneer fee regulation 25 has already gone through the process and would be

returned to the Board for approval of the final 1 2 version based on any comments and then get those to 3 the public and approved.] * * * 4 5 Report of Board Chairman - No Report * * * 6 7 Report of Acting Commissioner 8 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, informed Board 9 10 members that the department is currently in the 11 process of replacing the Pennsylvania Licensing System 12 (PALS) and should have the new system identified and 13 in place by the end of 2023.] 14 * * * 15 Report of Board Administrator [Terrie Kocher, Board Administrator, requested 16 17 approval of the proposed 2023 Board meeting dates.] 18 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 19 Would someone make a motion? 20 MR. TRACE: 21 So moved. 2.2 MR. HOSTETTER: 23 Second. 24 MS. KOCHER: 25 Nevin Rentzel, aye; Arion Claggett, aye;

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9 Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald Rader, 1 aye; Daniel Trace, aye; Christopher Dey, 2 3 aye. 4 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 5 6 [Sherman E. Hostetter Jr., Professional Member, 7 requested the Board make a decision regarding reciprocity and what they are going to offer to other 8 9 states. 10 Mr. Hostetter also requested having someone from 11 the financial division return to the Board to explain 12 all of the figures at a previous meeting and how the 13 process works to better understand how the Board is billed. 14 Mr. Hostetter addressed work on class B schools, 15 where it has been approved in the license, but they do 16 17 not have the specifics. He requested getting the 18 application and outline of requirements for class B 19 schools from Mr. Suter for the next meeting. 20 Chairman Rentzel requested Ms. Kocher have 21 someone from finance attend the July meeting to 22 clarify how they came up with those figures. Не 23 suggested having a work session in September to 24 clarify things within their regulations as far as 25 which states have reciprocity with Pennsylvania to

streamline the process so applications could be
approved or disapproved quickly.

Chairman Rentzel noted the need to entertain more information concerning criteria for acceptance of class B schools and having a framework, so any class B schools would be able to apply and know what they are teaching would be accepted by Pennsylvania or not. He requested it be placed on the September agenda.

9 Ms. Kocher stated there are regulations in place 10 for reciprocity, and the new law did not negate 11 reciprocity in any way. She noted that individual 12 agreements with other states basically went away, but 13 there are still qualifications in place to apply by 14 reciprocity. She requested further explanation so 15 everyone is on the same page.

16 Mr. McMurry explained that Act 41 was passed and changed reciprocity by recognizing licensure by 17 18 endorsement. He noted that reciprocity is just a 19 different way of looking at it to make licensure more 20 uniform and streamlined in relation to other states 21 and jurisdictions. He further explained that 22 reciprocity is only in regard to other states within 23 the United States, but Act 41 expands out and away 24 from having a formalized written agreement with a 25 particular state as long as their requirements are

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substantially equivalent to Pennsylvania. 1 2 Ms. Kocher commented that the law opens it up for 3 more people to be able to apply by reciprocity. She 4 stated, once the applications are received and 5 reviewed, they go to counsel to ensure requirements 6 are met with the other state, and then the 7 applications come before the Board. 8 Mr. Hostetter asked how the Board would thank 9 Heather Troutman and Kalonji Johnson for their 10 service. 11 Ms. Kocher informed the Board that she personally 12 thanked Heather Troutman for her service through an email that included Board members but is not aware of 13 another mechanism. 14 15 Acting Commissioner Claggett commented that there 16 is not a mechanism other than a phone call or email.] * * * 17 18 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 19 Do I hear a motion to approve travel 20 expense to the national convention in 21 July? 2.2 MR. RADER: 23 So moved. 24 MR. TRACE: 25 Second.

1 MS. KOCHER: 2 I think we need a roll call vote on 3 that. 4 5 Nevin Rentzel, aye; Arion Claggett, aye; Sherman Hostetter, aye; Gerald Rader, 6 7 aye; Daniel Trace, aye; Christopher Dey, 8 aye. 9 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 10 11 [Board members congratulated Sherman Hostetter on his position as president of the National Auctioneers 12 13 Association starting in July.] * * * 14 15 Adjournment 16 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 17 Do I hear a motion to adjourn? MR. HOSTETTER: 18 19 So moved. 20 MR. TRACE: 21 Second. 22 CHAIRMAN RENTZEL: 23 All in favor, give their consent by 24 saying aye. Opposed, the same. 25 [The motion carried unanimously.]
