Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations on 8 9 matters listed under the Report of Board Counsel and 10 Report of Prosecution. The Board returned to open 11 session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State Board of Barber Examiners was held on Monday, August 15, 14 15 2022. Dominic A. Muniz, Chairman, Professional 16 Member, called the meeting to order at 10:31 a.m. * * * 17 18 Pledge of Allegiance 19 [The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.] 20 * * * 21 Roll Call/Introduction of Attendees 22 [Sparkle Thompson, Board Administrator, provided a 23 roll call of Board members and introduction of 24 attendees.] 25 * * *

Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted the 1 2 meeting was being recorded, and those who continued to 3 participate were giving their consent to be recorded. 4 Mr. Kriner informed everyone that the Board met 5 in Executive Session to have attorney-client 6 consultation and for the purpose of conducting quasi-7 judicial deliberations prior to the Board meeting.] 8 * * * 9 Approval of minutes of the June 27, 2022 meeting 10 CHAIRMAN MUNIZ: 11 May I have a motion for approval of 12 minutes of June 27, 2022? [The motion carried unanimously.] 1 * * * 2 Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Discussion 3 4 [Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, noted 16A-429 5 general revisions are still being drafted. 6 Mr. Kriner informed Board members that 16A-4212 7 regarding licensure by endorsement under Act 41 was 8 provided to senior regulatory counsel for review and 9 the Board would probably be voting on 16A-4212 at the 10 next meeting. 11 Chairman Muniz reminded everyone that Act 41 is licensure by endorsement, which accepts licensees into 12 13 Pennsylvania with certain regulations. He stated out-14 of-state barbers have an opportunity to receive a 15 license in Pennsylvania without being reciprocal with 16 other states. He noted that there is reciprocity with 17 other states, but Act 41 allows the Board to accept 18 licenses from other states even though the applicant 19 does not have reciprocity with other states. 20 Mr. Kriner informed Board members of a letter 21 sent to all boards regarding moving the regulation 2.2 forward. He stated the regulation opens avenues and 23 other opportunities for licensees from other states to 2.4 receive a license in Pennsylvania.] * * * 25

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Report of Board Counsel - Hearing Examiner Proposal 1 2 MR. KRINER: 3 The Hearing Examiner's Proposal at number 11 for Case No. 19-42-008887 has 4 5 been tabled until next meeting. * * * 6 7 Report of Board Counsel - Discussion [Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, informed 8 everyone that the Application Committee was discussed 9 10 during Executive Session and notified the public the 11 Application Committee consists of Dominic Muniz, Burr 12 Edsall, and Charles Seright.] * * * 13 14 Report of Board Chair 15 [Dominic A. Muniz, Chairman, Professional Member, 16 announced that he and Burr Edsall would be attending 17 the National Association of Barber Boards of America 18 (NABBA) Conference on September 18, 2022, in Atlanta, 19 GA. He mentioned the conference provides an 20 opportunity to discuss different laws being passed in 21 other states and bring ideas to the barber industry. 2.2 Chairman Muniz informed everybody of the NABBA 23 LAB, where barbers and Board members could further 24 their education in the barbering industry or as Board 25 members in general and encouraged everyone to join the

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NABBA LAB to take advantage of further education.] 1 * * * 2 3 Report of Acting Commissioner 4 [Arion R. Claggett, Acting Commissioner, Bureau of 5 Professional and Occupational Affairs, notified 6 everyone of in-person Board member training on October 7 24, 2022, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. in Harrisburg. Нe noted the training is mandatory for public members but 8 also encouraged professional members to attend. 9 Ηe 10 noted topics would include the role of prosecution and 11 Board counsel.] * * * 12 Report of Board Administrator - No Report 13 14 * * * 15 Public Session 16 [John Christopher, 1st Vice President, National 17 Association of Barber Boards of America, also 18 addressed the 95th NABBA Conference in September and 19 informed everyone that he would be sworn in as the 20 next NABBA president in September. He will be 21 bringing the 2023 conference to Hershey, PA, and asked 2.2 for the Board's support. He mentioned speaking with 23 the Dauphin County Tourism Board about receiving a 24 grant to make sure people who attend the conference 25 have places to go and things to see.

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Mr. Christopher stated NABBA was also working with other states to develop national guidelines similar to a trademark for the barber pole because of the concern for misrepresentation. She noted NABBA was represented by 20 to 30 states across the country and encouraged everyone to visit the website for information concerning the barber pole.

Mr. Christopher addressed the NABBA barber school 8 9 division that was working with barber schools in each 10 individual state to have labs and clinics to further 11 education. He mentioned speaking with Mr. Gent from 12 the Pennsylvania Department of Corrections for 13 assistance and would like to have representation in 14 the form of legislation by a representative who could 15 address membership and ways to streamline bills.

16 Mr. Christopher referred to House Bill 255 17 regarding grandfathering licenses, where those 18 qualified have an opportunity to grandfather or move 19 their license up to a barber manager or a barber 20 teacher one time only. He believed barber license 21 numbers are down, especially compared to cosmetology 22 in Pennsylvania, and noted the need more schools and 23 teachers involvement in the Commonwealth of 24 Pennsylvania.

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Mr. Christopher encouraged younger barbers to

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become more involved in a deeper level and requested an update on House Bill 255. NABBA is a great source to speak similar topics. He encouraged reaching out to the executive director of NABBA for information in reference to bills in Pennsylvania.

Acting Commissioner Claggett informed Mr.
Christopher that the Board is interested in
participating in 2023, noting Board counsel may be
able to provide an update regarding House Bill 255 at
the next meeting.

Prentice Michael Boone, Urban Barber Alliance, requested information from Board members regarding the barber license increase this year, noting he renewed the barber license as well as the barber teacher license that cost \$389 but only received the barber teacher license.

17 Mr. Boone noted The Urban Barber Alliance is 18 educating young barbers, already established barbers, 19 and advanced barbers but need help and support with 20 accessing the database of barbershops to encourage 21 them to visit their organization and learn more. 22 Acting Commissioner Claggett explained that fees 23 have not been raised in many years and need to be 24 raised in order to sustain the Board from staff,

25 legal, and Board member expenses.

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Acting Commissioner Claggett offered support and help with sending notifications to other barbers but explained that Mr. Christopher would have to come before the Board to present information to the Board and Board counsel. He suggested Mr. Christopher contact the Board administrator, and Ms. Sparkle provided an email address.

8 Chairman Muniz suggested Mr. Christopher be 9 thorough with the request for Board support by 10 providing information as to how the Board would be 11 able to offer support and exactly what the Board would 12 be supporting.

13 Darryl Thomas, Licensed Barber, presented to the 14 Board to discuss his concerns regarding COVID and 15 rebounding COVID. He noted many barbershop owners and 16 barbers were ordered out of the workplace and did not 17 think there was concrete communication between the 18 Board and barbers. He commented that the Board should 19 have addressed issues and had protocols in place in a 20 state of emergency.

21 Mr. Thomas reported many barbershops have gone 22 out of business and many have not rebounded due to the 23 apprehensiveness of clients still not wanting to come 24 into the shops. He asked what remedies or action the 25 Board is putting together to assist in keeping

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1 barbershops and barbers' lives going forward.

Acting Commissioner Claggett stated there was a notification sent through an email blast to all of the barber population and notifications posted online in their Facebook account and State Board of Barber Examiners website.

7 Mr. Thomas requested information as to where to 8 find updates and current information in the event of 9 an emergency to stay in sync with what the Board 10 mandates. He commented that he was one of many who 11 did not know and learned by Governor Wolf speaking on 12 the news.

13 Acting Commissioner Claggett explained that the Board does not have another mechanism to reach that 14 15 type of population other than sending out an email blast and Governor Wolf speaking about it on the news. 16 17 Chairman Muniz explained that he met with many 18 people to figure things out during COVID, but the 19 biggest issues was not having a quorum, which held up 20 a lot of meetings. He stated one of the reasons for 21 the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) is to have 22 everyone's information and be able to contact every 23 single licensed barber. He also mentioned that the 24 Board is discussing newsletters and emails to have 25 more communication with barbers.

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Chairman Muniz addressed the need for Board 1 2 members, where they are not able to have a meeting or 3 vote on certain matters and believed there are 4 currently four vacancies. He stated that information 5 regarding joining the Board was on their website. 6 Ms. Sparkle noted one professional member and 7 three public member vacancies and provided the Board's 8 website at www.dos.pa.gov/barber for further 9 information. 10 Acting Commissioner Claggett mentioned that his 11 office was taking steps to attract more board members 12 across all boards, including updates to the website.

He mentioned receiving questions concerning what the Board does and how to become a Board member and informed everyone that steps would be coming soon.

16 Chairman Muniz commented that one of the ways to 17 figure out what was going on was to become a part of 18 the Board in order to actually learn what was going on 19 behind closed doors. He mentioned that many 20 discussions were open to the public, including budget 21 meetings, and attending meetings was the best way for 2.2 someone to find information and state their opinion. 23 Chairman Muniz thanked everyone for attending the 24 State Board of Barber Examiners Meeting and looked

25 forward to seeing Mr. Christopher at NABBA.]
