Mr. Rouse reviewed the exposure draft for barbers regarding substantially equivalent, where the person's current and active license in another jurisdiction must require at least 1000 training hours and

successful completion of a barber examination. He noted substantially equivalent for barber teacher would be determined by the Board on a case-by-case basis.

Mr. Rouse reviewed competency requirements for a barber, which include actively practicing as a barber for at least 2 out of 5 years immediately preceding the date of application or pass Pennsylvania's barber examination within 18 months of the date of application. He stated competency for barber teacher would include actively practicing as a barber teacher for at least 2 of the 5 years immediately preceding the date of application or pass Pennsylvania's barber examination within 18 months of the date of application.]

separate area from the barbershop and would be generated toward stylists downstairs and barbers upstairs. He mentioned backing off the plan when COVID started, but the barbershop reopened.

Mr. Varley stated his wife is a licensed nurse practitioner certified to provide Botox injections and fillers and requested permission to have an area that would be separated from the salon/booth rental barbershop with locked exam rooms that could be rented to her with the same structure as a booth rental.

Mr. Varley noted his wife's business, Polished
Aesthetics, LLC, was in the process of being licensed
through the state Board of Medicine with a physician
owning the company and his wife managing the company
as the injector nurse practitioner. He was waiting to
obtain the prescriptive authority but sought options
through the Board of Barber Examiners.

Mr. Rouse requested an explanation of what type of services would be performed.

Mr. Varley stated his wife would be performing Botox injections and dermal fillers in a locked exam room similar to a doctor's office.

Commissioner Johnson questioned whether Mr.

Varley was seeking three distinct business licenses to have a medical business inside of a salon inside of a

barbershop.

Mr. Varley sought a license from the Board of Medicine to have a physician/nurse practitioner provide aesthetics services as a booth rental in a barbershop.

Chairman Muniz commented that Mr. Varley is able to have cosmetologists working under the barbershop as a barbershop license but recommended he acquire more research as far as the Board of Medicine is concerned on their regulations on providing the services. He stated the Board of Barber Examiners cannot go against the requirements of the Board of Medicine.

Mr. Rouse requested information regarding how Mr. Varley was advertising the salon.

Mr. Varley explained that there are two completely different areas with barbershop and the booth rental area downstairs. He commented that he did not have a salon license and would just bring stylists in. The stylists would do their own marketing and advertising.

Chairman Muniz questioned whether Mr. Varley ever submitted a variance request to add more stations for the salon section and suggested that be done first for Board approval. He also noted the need for more research as far as the medical service is concerned.
