of Finance and Operations, Department of State, 1 2 referred to licensee population over the past seven 3 years, noting the Board had 9,176 licensees in FY21-4 22 but decreased to 8,090 as of the time of the 5 She reported on a recent increase of 69 report. licenses for a total of 8,159 licensees. 6 7 Ms. Richards addressed license class. She stated 8 the Board renews in April of even years, where the

9 Board had 8,953 licensees and 9,176 at the last 10 renewal. She commented that the Board is increasing 11 licensees with every renewal and that it is normal to 12 see a decrease in a nonrenewal year.

Ms. Richards addressed revenue, noting it is reviewed on a biennial basis. She reported on the revenue for FY20-21 and for FY21-22, noting the biennial total.

17 Ms. Richards noted 95 percent of revenue comes 18 from renewals and applications. She stated that 19 revenue is received from other categories but is not 20 consistent. She noted a renewal fee increase went 21 into effect at the last renewal and referred to the 22 listing of the next incremental step in FY23. 23 Ms. Richards stated expenses are brought in 24 through direct charges, timesheet-based charges, and 25 licensee population. She noted the two main

categories when reviewing expenses are administrative 1 2 and legal costs. She referred to expenses in FY20-3 21, FY21-22, FY22-23, noting the current figure at 4 the time of the report. She noted the budgeted 5 amount for FY22-23 is very adequate. Ms. Richards addressed revenue and expenses 6 7 showing a projected balance in FY22-23 to be a 8 negative balance, but the renewal fee increase going 9 into effect puts the Board back in the black at 10 \$462,000 by FY25-26.] * * * 11 12 Report of Board Prosecution 13 [Andrea L. Costello, Esquire, Board Prosecution 14 Liaison, presented the Consent Agreement for Case No. 15 21 - 42 - 013892.1* * * 16 [Colby B. He noted prior Board discussion 18 concerning changes to § 3.54 regarding minimum 19 equipment requirements, noting language was added to 20 include one basket for every two students, where the 21 current regulation for a shop is one basket for every 22 two chairs. 23 Chair Muniz explained that it was one soiled 24 basket for the entire barbershop, and for schools, it 25 was one for every two students. He noted trash cans

was one for every two chairs inside a barbershop. 1 2 Mr. Barrett referred to § 3.54(8) one soiled 3 towel receptacle for the schools. He noted that 4 under the proposed regulation, one soiled towel 5 receptacle is needed for every two chairs, and the 6 Board wanted to change it to one per shop and one per 7 school. He will make that change and then send it 8 out for an exposure draft. 9 Mr. Barrett provided information regarding the 10 \$30,000 bond discussed at the last meeting. He noted 11 a comparison made with other state requirements, and 12 the \$30,000 is a big increase with a maximum of 13 \$5,000 under the current regulation. He mentioned it 14 was consistent with what other states require for 15 cosmetology and barber schools.] * * * 16 Discussion - Reelection of Board Positions and 17 18 Nominations from Board Members MR. * * * 1 2 Public Comment 3 [Sean Barrett, Esquire, Board Counsel, addressed a question at the last meeting concerning lavatories. 4 5 He explained that the Eleven Pennsylvania, LLC, decision applied to the State Board of Cosmetology 6 7 regulation requiring the Board have a lavatory within 8 the square footage of the salon. He noted the Board 9 found that Section 104(d)(1) of the Construction Code 10 Act preempted the regulation, making it unenforceable, where the Construction Code Act 11 12 overrules the Cosmetology regulation in that section. 13 Mr. Barrett explained that it does not apply to 14 the Barber Board because the Cosmetology Board has 15 its own regulations, and the Barber Board does not 16 require the lavatory be within the square footage of 17 a barbershop. He noted the cosmetology regulations 18 state something that is not in the barber 19 regulations. 20 Kathleen Lyons, Hamlin Barber Shop, requested 21 clarification as to whether barbershops do require 22 the bathroom to be open to the public. 23 Mr. Barrett could not give an advisory opinion 24 and the question is different than what was asked at 25 the last meeting. He referred Ms. Lyons to the

Construction Code requirements and regulations. 1 2 Matthew Lyons, Hamlin Barber Shop, asked whether 3 any research had been done concerning mobile 4 barbershops regarding the length of the trailer and 5 whether a bathroom would be required in that facility. 6 7 Mr. Barrett explained that it was a still a 8 proposed bill and no legislation had been passed, but 9 the Board may have to issue regulations at some time. 10 He encouraged anyone with input or questions on the bill to look on the General Assembly's website or 11 12 contact their local representatives.] 13 * * * 14 Adjournment 15 CHAIRMAN MUNIZ: 16 Do I have a motion to adjourn? 17 MR.
