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9 Report of Board Counsel

[Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, notified the Board that the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA) received reports of persons pretending to be from one of the health-related boards and are contacting licensees asking for personal information over the phone.

Mr. Kriner noted scammers are threatening license suspension for failure to act and falsely claiming involvement with the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) and the Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA).

Mr. Kriner noted BPOA would not contact anyone by phone to request payment and reminded everyone not to give any information over the phone. He stated the department initiates disciplinary action through an administrative process through certified mail and/or personal service and would also provide a contact name

and phone number. He informed everyone to contact
their local law enforcement if they have been a victim
or are receiving calls.

Report of Board Counsel - Regulatory Discussion

[Todd P. Kriner, Esquire, Board Counsel, referred to

16A-429 regarding general revisions, noting that he is

still reviewing those and would have an update at the

next meeting.

Mr. Kriner addressed 16A-4212 regarding Act 41 licensure by endorsement. He mentioned there have been letters from the House urging all of the different boards to pass these regulations. He noted that licensure by endorsement is a regulation to open a pathway that did not exist before for someone licensed in another state by showing the hours they physically worked as a barber or by taking the exam within a certain period of time.

Mr. Kriner stated the regulation was in front of senior regulatory counsel for approval and then would be open for a 30-day comment period from stakeholders and the public once approved.]
