- 22 Regulation 16A-66 regarding the publication as
- 23 proposed of the Act 53 regulations. He noted the
- 24 regulation contains a list of crimes considered to be
- 25 directly related to each profession of the 29 boards

and commissions under the jurisdiction of the commissioner of the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA). He stated the proposed rulemaking was published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* on November 19, 2022, and was given a 30-day comment period.

Mr. Rouse noted the Board has a list of crimes considered to be directly related to the profession of appraisers and assessors posted to the Board's website.

Mr. Rouse addressed Regulation 16A-7027 regarding broker price opinion. He mentioned the Board made recommendations at the last meeting regarding changes to the language of § 36.434 to read, "In conjunction with the purchase of real property, a BPO may not be used as the primary basis to determine the value of real property for the purpose of a loan origination of mortgage."

Chairman Pasquarella commented that the main issue was that it was focusing on residential real estate and should be for all real estate.]

- 6 He discussed a program he attended, Ignorance Isn't
- 7 | Bliss, explaining the regulatory environment
- 8 throughout the United States for appraisers and how
- 9 | boards differ and are the same. He mentioned that it
- 10 focused on three legs that hold up the entire process
- 11 being The Appraisal Foundation, Appraisal
- 12 | Subcommittee, and the federal agency and state
- 13 regulatory agencies.
- Mr. Smeltzer noted there was a report from Jim
- 15 Parks with the Appraisal Subcommittee and a breakout
- 16 session. He reported ASC is starting onsite reviews
- 17 up again at the beginning of 2023, looking at reviews
- 18 | for appraisers and appraisal management companies
- 19 (AMCs) being separate reviews. He noted ASC
- 20 mentioned the Board may want to appoint a Board
- 21 member to be an AMC representative.
- 22 Mr. Smeltzer addressed a presentation from David
- 23 Bunton at The Appraisal Foundation suggesting Board
- 24 members get on mailing lists to receive updates and
- 25 suggested they join the Advisory Group that advises

The Appraisal Foundation.

Mr. Smeltzer stated the Appraiser Qualifications Board (AQB) discussed the Practical Applications of Real Estate Appraisal (PAREA), noting it is moving along and several programs would be coming out next year. He stated AQB appreciated Pennsylvania changing position on PAREA and being more open to it.

Mr. Smeltzer commented that he was not sure where they stand with the legislation but believed the Board forwarded it and is waiting for final approval.

Mr. Rouse noted that he would be reviewing suggestions from regulatory counsel and then sending that back.

Mr. Smeltzer addressed a presentation by Michelle Bradley from the Appraisal Standards Board regarding the fourth exposure draft. He stated the proposed changes are extensive, and the current edition of USPAP has been extended until the end of 2023 to allow time to get everything right.

Mr. Smeltzer mentioned that the diversity initiative was discussed quite a bit, and one of the things they can do with grants from the ASC is to look into diversity initiatives. He noted discussion by Attorney Peter Christensen about cases of bias and how the Department of Housing and Urban Development

(HUD) is handling those. He reported over 100 complaints at the present time but no charges filed.

Mr. Smeltzer stated the Department of Veterans Affairs is expanding to allow desktop appraisals, primarily in response to the appraiser shortage in Alaska and that it is taking too long to complete appraisals.

Mr. Smeltzer informed everyone that several education programs are being offered by the Council on Licensure, Enforcement, and Regulation (CLEAR) to their personnel.

Mr. Smeltzer addressed presentations by Fannie Mae and Freddie Mac concerning quality issues. He stated Scott Reuter from Freddie Mac mentioned that gross living area (GLA) adjustments do not appear to be up to where they need to be, along with a lack of market condition adjustments when warranted.

Mr. Ausherman noted having conversations with appraisers from other states and noticed that appraisers are involved in prosecution in a lot of states. He also spoke with several board investigators and suggested sending one of their Board investigators to the next AARO Meeting.

Mr. Stoerrle commented that the role of the Board is enforcement and not advisory and encouraged

1 everyone to keep that in mind if they ever have to 2 come before the Board.

Chairman Pasquarella ask whether any Board members wished to be an AMC representative at meetings, and Mr. Stoerrle volunteered.

Chairman Pasquarella requested more information regarding the advisory group.

Mr. Smeltzer explained that The Appraisal Foundation has an advisory group of boards to help advise them on certain things and is a way for boards to help. He offered to represent the Board and would reach out to Mr. Bunton.

Chairman Pasquarella commented that Mr. Smeltzer should be part of that group because of his knowledge of USPAP.1

18 | Annual Budget Presentation

19 [Michelle Witmer, Fiscal Management Specialist,

20 Bureau of Finance and Operations, Department of

21 | State, presented the 2022-2023 budget information.

22 | She addressed licensee population, noting the numbers

23 are looked at on a biennial basis to provide an idea

24 from a revenue standpoint.

25 Ms. Witmer noted the Board had 4,482 licensees at

the time of the report. She mentioned the Board renews in June of odd years and compared it to the previous renewal. She noted FY20-21 had 4,508 licensees and an increase of 5 licensees this morning.

- Ms. Witmer discussed the figure the Board brought in in revenue in FY20-21 and FY21-22, noting the biennial total. She mentioned the last fee increase was in 2003 but the Board approved a biennial renewal increase last year that would go into effect for the FY24-25 renewal cycle.
- Mr. Rouse clarified that the regulation has not been approved through the formal regulatory process, and the Board's hope is to get that to final-rulemaking in time for the FY24-25 renewal cycle.
- Ms. Witmer reported 92 percent of revenue is from renewals and applications. She noted that other categories are important but are not counted on as a consistent source of revenue.
- Ms. Witmer addressed expenses, noting the expenses in FY20-21 and FY21-22. She explained that categories are broken down by administrative and legal costs and hit the Board through direct costs, indirect costs, and timesheet costs. She reported on the expenses as of December 12, 2022.

Ms. Witmer noted the Bureau of Finance and Operations (BFO) is looking at the projected revenue with the renewal and application fee increase for FY24-25, noting an increase through FY25-26.]

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Exploratory Committee

[Michael McFarlane, Professional Member, explained that the intention of the committee is to call for a public meeting in accordance with the Sunshine Act immediately following the Board's next public meeting on January 19. He noted a public notice would be provided on the Board's website. He stated they want to explore opportunities to procure available ASC grant funds specific to the five tenets listed in the grant description and are actively putting together documentation for the forthcoming requests.

Mr. McFarlane noted the committee wants to see if there may be any public interest that might help licensees or some particular cause. He stated the grants are specific to improvements to and/or expansion of the complaint process, investigations, and enforcement activities; improvements to the process of submitting data on appraisers and AMCs to the national registries; participation in trainings and conferences; expansion of credentialing

opportunities in underserved markets; and other areas as needed identified by the state Board.

Chairman Pasquarella thanked Mr. McFarlane for the excellent update and the work he is doing.

Mr. Rouse commented that in addition to the agenda being posted on the Board's website, the notice would also be in the newspaper in the same way they have notice of a regular meeting.

Mr. Smeltzer asked whether the Board could reach out to schools that serve underserved areas that would be interested in participating in this because grants are offered for education programs.

Mr. Rouse suggested having the names and email addresses put on the stakeholders list so it goes to them when the notice of the agenda goes out.

R. Scott Hartman, SRA, Appraisal Institute, informed Board members that he has a list and points of contact and would provide the list to Ms. Hennessy Hemler. He also offered to have their Diversity Committee and University Relations Committee send their lists.]
