5 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State
6 Board of Cosmetology was held on Monday, July 10,
7 2017. Stephen A. Wallin, Teacher, Professional
8 Member, Chair, called the meeting to order at 9:06
9 a.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. Roll call
10 was taken.

11 Kathryn Waters, Deputy Commissioner of
12 Professional and Occupational Affairs, was not present
13 at the commencement of the meeting.

14 ***

15 Report of Prosecutorial Division

16 [Timothy Smith, Esquire, Board Prosecution Liaison,
17 reported on a Consent Agreement for File No.
18 16-45-02331.]

19 ***

20 [Caroline Bailey, Esquire, Board Prosecution, reported
21 on a Consent Agreement for File No.
22 15-45-11276.]

23 ***

24 Appointment

25 [Gerard McAvey, Director of Marketing and Training,

1 Milady, addressed the Board with regard to hybrid and
2 blended learning for the cosmetology curriculum in the
3 State of Pennsylvania. He noted Milady as the number
4 one curriculum provider of beauty and wellness
5 education in the United States. Mr. McAvey provided a
6 history of his professional background.

7 Mr. McAvey discussed the top ten questions
8 regarding online learning, including the benefits of
9 online learning for students and instructors,
10 requirements of instructors for hybrid programs, the
11 timeline for completion of 25 percent of accumulative
12 hours online and accreditation, whether to allow
13 instructors more time to teach and less time to create
14 tests and exams, integrity of a program, and the
15 social aspect of learning. Mr. McAvey stopped to
16 answer questions at this point in his presentation.]

17 ***

18 [Kathryn Waters, Deputy Commissioner, entered the
19 meeting at 9:18 a.m.]

20 ***

21 [Mr. McAvey continued his PowerPoint presentation by
22 discussing Milady's curriculum, which he noted allows
23 schools to customize the content for their specific
24 business. He noted that every single piece of content
25 a student interacts with is graded on the spot and the

1 instructor will receive an overall report on the
2 student's progress.

3 Mr. McAvey next provided an overview of the
4 MindTap program and commented on the learning tools
5 associated with the program. He commented that
6 MindTap accelerates student learning and success. He
7 noted a greater understanding with this type of
8 learning within the last three years.

9 Mr. McAvey answered additional questions and also
10 welcomed Board members to contact him at his website
11 address, www.milady.com.]

12 ***

13 Approval of Minutes of the May 1, 2017 meeting

14 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

15 Do I have a motion to approve the
16 minutes from the meeting May 1?

17 MR. FARRELL:

18 Motion.

19 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

20 Is there a second?

21 MS. THOMSON:

22 Second.

23 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

24 We have a motion and a second. Are
25 there any additional questions or

1 Regulations. She noted additional updates will be
2 provided at the PAPSA meeting, which Commissioner
3 Harlow is scheduled to attend.]

4 ***

5 Introduction of Audience

6 [Chairman Wallin requested the introduction of
7 audience members.]

8 ***

9 Appointment

10 [Chairman Wallin introduced Salim Muhammed of Miracle
11 Eyebrows, a facility that was previously issued a
12 provisional denial on a variance request. Mr.
13 Muhammed was present to discuss his variance request
14 for his facility.

15 Ariel O'Malley, Esquire, Board Counsel, clarified
16 that this portion of the Board's Minutes was being
17 recorded verbatim.

18 Ms. O'Malley also clarified that there was a
19 notation in his appeal that there was an error in the
20 provisional denial in that the square footage being
21 noted as a deficiency was a clerical error, and that
22 there is no square footage deficiency. Ms. O'Malley
23 noted the only issue today was the request for a
24 lavatory variance.

25 Mr. Muhammed discussed the lavatory variance as

1 follows:

2 [REQUESTED VERBATIM]

3 MR. MUHAMMED:

4 Miracle Eyebrows has already one store
5 located in the Robinson Mall, and
6 that's a land store. In order to keep
7 up the store, the mall requested us to
8 open up a second location, and they
9 provided a kiosk, to open up a kiosk in
10 the upper level next to Sears.

11 Actually, the store is opposite
12 the Food Court, and the lavatory
13 actually is located in the Food Court
14 area. So even me operating the store,
15 the people can easily walk into the
16 lavatory, and it is not even less than
17 50 square feet --- I mean, 50 square
18 foot distance.

19 Unfortunately, there is no
20 required distance provided in any of
21 the laws as to how much is going to be
22 distance if I'm applying for a lavatory
23 variance. So we are here to find out
24 what should be the required distance
25 between the store and the lavatory.

1 MS. O'MALLEY:

2 Do you guys have any questions?

3 MR. MUHAMMED:

4 In the denial, it is stated that this is
5 public area but anybody can see the
6 lavatory by standing in front of the
7 kiosk.

8 MS. O'MALLEY:

9 So the one question that I have for
10 you, while the Board members look over
11 your application, is that in your
12 original application, it says that the
13 total distance between the salon and
14 the lavatory in feet and inches is 180
15 feet.

16 MR. MUHAMMED:

17 That is an error, actually, because we
18 are located in front of the Food Court.

19 MS. O'MALLEY:

20 Okay.

21 MR. MUHAMMED:

22 Between the food court and us, there is
23 a gap in between. There is a hallway
24 area and a corridor and open area so
25 people can see the downstairs. That is

1 why he mentioned that right, left,
2 right, left, pretty much like that.
3 But if you simply --- I mean, I have
4 the picture also with me. I went
5 yesterday also physically to see all
6 that for distance.

7 In fact, we can see the lavatory
8 by standing in front of the store
9 inside. It's not even more than 50
10 feet.

11 MS. O'MALLEY:

12 So are you saying that the visual
13 distance from your facility to the
14 bathroom is 50 feet ---

15 MR. MUHAMMED:

16 Yes, less than 50 feet.

17 MS. O'MALLEY:

18 --- or are you saying that you
19 physically walked that distance?

20 MR. MUHAMMED:

21 Actually, people can still walk
22 straight, but the problem is in between
23 the store, there's an open space, which
24 is ---. So if you walk straight, then
25 you have to make the left because of the

1 Food Court. If you don't want use of
2 the Food Court area, then you have to go
3 left and right. That's what it is.

4 MS. O'MALLEY:

5 Does anyone else have any questions?

6 MR. MUHAMMED:

7 The problem is if you don't get the ---
8 I mean, we are willing to relocating.
9 The space is the problem. The lavatory
10 is the problem. We agreed to relocate
11 the store also. Unfortunately, there
12 is no rule stating how much should be
13 the distance between the lavatory and
14 the store. It's our plan for variance
15 request.

16 So we were unable to figure it
17 out, what should be the exact distance
18 between the lavatory and the store. If
19 we are unable to open this location,
20 then we'll be losing the --- our main
21 location which is located in the same
22 mall. Because now the malls are
23 requiring to open up a second location
24 unless --- I mean, it's a business ---
25 it's a part of business, and we have

1 been experiencing same issues at
2 multiple locations. Unless we open the
3 second location, we are facing to lose
4 our first location.

5 We have around 50 locations across
6 the country so far, and Pennsylvania,
7 we have four locations. It would be
8 really great if you can approve our
9 application. And we agree to follow
10 the --- any guidelines according to the
11 Board.

12 MS. O'MALLEY:

13 So the only diagram that I see that was
14 submitted with your amended appeal is
15 this one. I don't know if you could
16 see it from this far away, but this
17 document doesn't actually have any
18 distance measurements on it.

19 MR. MUHAMMED:

20 No, no. I just brought the pictures to
21 show exactly how it actually looks
22 like. If you can see that --- if you
23 look at this two --- the square box?

24 MS. O'MALLEY:

25 Uh-huh, (yes).

1 MR. MUHAMMED:

2 That's what --- you make a left, make a
3 right, and make a left. If you go
4 straight, you can straight walk into the
5 bathroom, the toilet.

6 MS. O'MALLEY:

7 And if you go straight, you're saying
8 that that's ---?

9 MR. MUHAMMED:

10 It's actually in between the China Max
11 and Auntie Anne's. You can see there
12 is a space in between.

13 MS. O'MALLEY:

14 Right.

15 MR. MUHAMMED:

16 Because that is a bathroom right there.
17 If you walk straight --- if you can
18 look at the picture which I provided,
19 you can see if you keep walking
20 straight, it can be there. That's not
21 even less than 50 square feet.

22 MS. O'MALLEY:

23 Do any of the Board members have any
24 questions?

25 MR. MUHAMMED:

1 One more thing I would like to add,
2 actually, we are not providing any
3 other service other than the eyebrow
4 threading. I see now the State of
5 Pennsylvania has a very strict rule
6 with respect to eyebrow threadings just
7 to get a license. Most of the states
8 in the United States doesn't require
9 license for eyebrow threading and
10 doesn't require any particular rule,
11 which is applicable to aesthetics also.

12 Recently, Ohio changed the rule,
13 and Ohio doesn't require anymore
14 aesthetic license. Ohio introduced a
15 new permit for eyebrow threading.
16 Kentucky introduced the same thing, and
17 Texas more recently ruled out the
18 license for the eyebrow threading.

19 New York also introduced a new
20 license for eyebrow threading. Florida
21 also has the same rule and Connecticut
22 doesn't require.

23 MS. O'MALLEY:

24 Do you guys have any questions or
25 comments? Okay, seeing none, then the

1 Board will deliberate this matter when
2 they go into Executive Session, and
3 they will vote on it when they come
4 out. You are welcome to stay, or you
5 are welcome to give me a call later
6 this afternoon between --- probably
7 near 4:00, because I think this is
8 going to take a little while today. So
9 it's up to you.

10 MR. MUHAMMED:

11 Thank you.

12 MS. O'MALLEY:

13 Thank you, so much.

16 [Kathryn Waters, Deputy Commissioner, exited the
17 meeting at 10:06 a.m. and re-entered at 10:15 a.m.]

19 Appointment

20 [Chairman Wallin introduced Brian LaForme, Executive
21 Deputy Secretary, Department of Banking and
22 Securities, who addressed the Board with regard to
23 elder financial abuse.

24 Mr. LaForme presented a video, after which he had
25 further discussion regarding the matter. He provided

1 a brief history of his professional background as well
2 as the Department of Banking and Securities.

3 Mr. LaForme referred Board members to additional
4 information he distributed as he explained the Elder
5 Investment Fraud and Financial Exploitation (EIFFE)
6 training program and resulting continuing education
7 credits.

8 Mr. LaForme requested to be placed on the Board's
9 next conference agenda to provide further information
10 and training. Board members had questions and
11 comments.]

15 [Kathryn Waters, Deputy Commissioner, exited the
16 meeting at 11:02 a.m. and re-entered at 11:04 a.m.]

17 ***

18 Appointment

19 [Erin Boyd, Owner, Whirligig, addressed the Board
20 concerning her amended application for licensure for
21 Whirligig Salon.

22 Ms. Boyd discussed her amended application as
23 follows:]

24 [REQUESTED VERBATIM]

25 MR. BOYD:

1 Good morning everyone. My name is Erin
2 Boyd, and I'm here before you today
3 concerning my amended application for
4 licensure for Whirligig Salon Application
5 No. 3532500.

6 First of all, let me thank you for
7 considering my application and for the
8 chance to appear before you today. I was
9 previously here on May 1st when you
10 initially considered my application for a
11 space variance, and I appreciate the
12 opportunity to speak to you today and to
13 address the concerns that were raised
14 with my original application.

15 As you will recall, the Board
16 declined to approve my initial
17 application for a space variance as the
18 proposed salon measured 150 square feet,
19 which was 30 square feet less than the
20 180 square feet required for a one-
21 licensee salon.

22 As the counsel to the Board, Ms.
23 O'Malley stated in her letter of May that
24 it was the Board's assessment that the
25 proposed facility does not have

1 sufficient floor space to properly
2 install the equipment with regard to the
3 health and safety of patrons of the
4 salon.

5 To remedy this shortcoming of my
6 initial plan, I have added to my lease an
7 additional supply closet measuring 39
8 square feet located in the basement of
9 the building. This brings the total area
10 to 189 square feet. I am providing you
11 with an architectural print thoroughly
12 detailing the floor plan.

13 The additional space of the supply
14 closet will allow me to better organize
15 the sink closet of the salon as well as
16 to free up space in the main room of the
17 salon. Although the supply closet is not
18 contiguous with the main space of the
19 salon, I have direct access to it, and it
20 is for my exclusive use.

21 Included in the documents provided
22 to you today is a copy of the addendum to
23 my lease reflecting the addition of the
24 supply closet. With this additional
25 space, I have carefully reviewed the

1 overall layout of the salon in light of
2 the Pa. Code Section 7.71, which lists
3 the required equipment and supplies for a
4 salon.

5 I have accounted for each of the
6 requirements on the architectural plan,
7 where you will find notes specifying the
8 placement of each item. The drawing
9 allows --- I'm sorry, the drawing also
10 gives detailed measurements of the
11 equipment and its positioning and space.

12 As it happens, I'd ordered chairs
13 and a shampoo sink for the salon prior to
14 the last Board meeting, and they've
15 arrived since then. This has allowed me
16 to lock them up in the main room, as you
17 can see in the photos I am providing with
18 you --- for you.

19 To further ensure that this is a
20 workable plan with sufficient space, I
21 have also consulted with an architect.
22 He visited the space with the equipment
23 in place and also reviewed the drawings
24 that have been issued today. The plan
25 met with his approval, and in his words,

1 he is confident that the salon, while
2 intimate, will be functionally sound for
3 the proposed use and occupancy. I have
4 provided you with a copy of this letter.

5 It is my sincere opinion that you
6 have good reason to approve this
7 application, and that is because I
8 believe that this process of application
9 and review has led me to --- has led to a
10 thoroughly satisfactory plan, one that is
11 well-organized and safe.

12 The careful consideration of the
13 specific equipment requirements and the
14 layout of the salon assured me that this
15 salon will function very well for both
16 client and stylist, and it's essential to
17 me that my clients be comfortable and
18 safe. I'm absolutely certain with this
19 plan I will be able to provide my clients
20 with the attention and care that
21 initially led me to want to open my own
22 salon. I hope that you will arrive at
23 the same opinion.

24 If anyone has any questions,
25 please allow me the opportunity to

1 address them, and thank you for your
2 time.

3 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

4 What is in the hallway that's not part
5 of your salon?

6 MS. BOYD:

7 The vestibule.

8 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

9 It says hallway, not part of salon,
10 near the vestibule.

11 MS. BOYD:

12 It's just an entry to the salon itself.
13 It's a double door that opens and then
14 a glass door once you enter the
15 vestibule. Oh, I --- I know what
16 you're talking about. It's the hallway
17 to two apartments upstairs. So you
18 enter the vestibule and you turn right
19 to enter my salon, or you go straight
20 for those that live upstairs through
21 that hallway but closed doors for both
22 entrances once you enter the vestibule.

23 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

24 And you can't use that space?

25 MS. BOYD:

1 No.

2 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

3 You got about 40-some square feet right
4 there.

5 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

6 Including that hallway there.

7 MS. BOYD:

8 Correct. Correct.

9 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

10 Thank you.

11 Any other questions?

12 MS. THOMSON:

13 Erin, where do you stand to access the
14 supply closet?

15 MS. BOYD:

16 There's an entryway from the street
17 itself as well as inside the building,
18 but I would most likely enter once a
19 day, you know, just to supply my salon
20 and get what I need and have most of
21 my, you know, back stock and dry goods
22 in there.

23 So yeah, it's about 50 feet from
24 the entrance to the salon.

25 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

1 Any additional questions, comments?

2 MS. NEATOCK:

3 Did you say you can also enter through
4 the salon?

5 MS. BOYD:

6 No. You can enter through the building
7 itself, so it's an additional entrance.
8 Most likely, I would have my own
9 access.

10 MS. NEATOCK:

11 Okay. Perfect.

12 CHAIRMAN WALLIN:

13 Thank you.

14 MS. BOYD:

15 Sure. Thank you.

16 secure future with Sola Salon.]

18 [Greg Jockel, Sola Salon owner, indicated the rising
19 costs of maintaining and owning a hair salon recently
20 forced him to close its doors. He thanked Board
21 members for the opportunity to finish out his career
22 as a hair stylist within the Sola Salon concept.]

24 [Michelle Maust, Sola Salon owner in East Liberty,
25 thanked the Board for granting the lavatory variance

1 for Sola Salon.]
