CHAPTER 7. STATE BOARD OF COSMETOLOGY

APPLICATION FOR A SALON LICENSE

§ 7.51. Application for a salon license.

(a) An owner-applicant for a salon license shall submit a license application to the Board with the following:

(1) A sketch plan showing the layout of the salon, including the position of the doors, windows, partitions, shampoo basins, lavatories, adjustable chairs and other floor equipment.

(2) The name and license number of the individual who will be the designated person in charge of the salon in the absence of the owner.

(3) The salon license fee prescribed in § 7.2 (relating to fees).

(4) A copy of the certificate of occupancy or other documentation, establishing compliance with applicable building, fire safety and sanitary requirements imposed by state, county or municipal governments.

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PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS OF A SALON

§7.79. Lavatories.

Option 1

(a) A salon must have adequate lavatories on the premises. For the purposes of this section, “on the premises” means within the square footage of the salon.

(b) The Board, upon an applicant’s request, may grant a variance from the lavatory requirement concerning a salon, if the salon is within one of the following:

(1) A nursing home;

(2) A long-term rehabilitation facility;

(3) A veteran’s home; or

(4) An airport.

(c) A written request for a lavatory variance shall include the following:

(1) A detailed explanation as to why the variance is being requested

(2) A sketch plan that includes:

(i) Path and distance from the salon to the lavatory.

(ii) Distance from the lavatory to the nearest shampoo sink.

(iii) Surrounding businesses or operations that may utilize the lavatory facility.

(d) A salon granted a variance under this section shall comply with all local, municipal, state and federal building code requirements.

Option 2

(a) A salon must have adequate lavatories within 75 feet of a shampoo sink on the premises. For the purposes of this section, "on the premises" means within the square footage of the salon.

(b) The Board, upon an applicant's request, may grant a variance from the lavatory requirement concerning a salon, if the salon is within one of the following:

(1) A nursing home;

(2) A long-term rehabilitation facility;

(3) A veteran's home; or

(4) An airport.

(c) A written request for a lavatory variance shall include the following:

(1) A detailed explanation as to why the variance is being requested

(2) A sketch plan that includes:

(i) Path and distance from the salon to the lavatory.

(ii) Distance from the lavatory to the nearest shampoo bowl.

(iii) Surrounding businesses or operations that may utilize the lavatory facility.

(d) A salon granted a variance under this section shall comply with all local, municipal, state and federal building code requirements.

Option 3

- (a) A salon must have adequate lavatories on the premises. For the purposes of this section, “on the premises” means within the square footage of the salon.
- (b) The Board, upon an applicant’s request, may grant a variance from the lavatory requirement in accordance with the following:
- (1) A salon that is deemed to be new construction shall only be granted a variance upon establishing extreme hardship or impossibility. A variance in this situation shall be for no more than 25 feet.
 - (2) A salon that is deemed to be a renovation or remodel may be granted a variance up to 50 feet.
 - (3) A salon that is deemed to be existing construction may be granted a variance up to 75 feet.
- (c) A written request for a lavatory variance shall include the following:
- (1) A detailed explanation as to why the variance is being requested
 - (2) A sketch plan that includes:
 - (i) Path and distance from the salon to the lavatory.
 - (ii) Distance from the lavatory to the nearest shampoo sink.
 - (iii) Surrounding businesses or operations that may utilize the lavatory facility.
- (d) A salon granted a variance under this section shall comply with all local, municipal, state and federal building code requirements.

Option 4

- (a) A salon must have adequate lavatories ~~within 75 feet of a shampoo sinks on the premises.~~ For the purposes of this section, “on the premises” means within the square footage of the salon.
- (b) The Board, upon an applicant’s request, may grant a variance from the lavatory requirement in accordance with the following:
- (1) A salon that is deemed to be new construction shall only be granted a variance upon establishing extreme hardship or impossibility. A variance in this situation shall be for no more than 25 feet.
 - (2) A salon that is deemed to be a renovation or remodel may be granted a variance up to 50 feet.
 - (3) A salon that is deemed to be existing construction may be granted a variance up to 75 feet.
- (c) A written request for a lavatory variance shall include the following:
- (1) A detailed explanation as to why the variance is being requested

(2) A sketch plan that includes:

(i) Path and distance from the salon to the lavatory.

(ii) Distance from the lavatory to the nearest shampoo bowl.

(iii) Surrounding businesses or operations that may utilize the lavatory facility.

(d) A salon granted a variance under this section shall comply with all local, municipal and state building code requirements.

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
