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3 State Board of Crane Operators 1 March 24, 2021 2 * * * 3 [Pursuant to Section 708(a)(5) of the Sunshine Act, at 4 9:00 a.m. the Board entered into executive session 5 with Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 6 7 and C. William Fritz II, Esquire, Board Counsel, for the purpose of conducting quasi-judicial deliberations 8 9 on a number of matters that are currently pending 10 before the Board and to receive the advice of counsel. 11 The Board returned to open session at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 14 Board of Crane Operators was held on Wednesday, March 15 24, 2021. Daniel R. Haulman, Chair, Professional 16 Member, called the meeting to order at 10:32 a.m.] * * * 17 Roll Call/Introductions 18 19 [Chair Haulman requested Mr. Stauffer provide an 20 introduction of the Board members, staff, and audience 21 in attendance.] * * * 22 23 Approval of minutes of the January 27, 2021 meeting CHAIR HAULMAN: 24 25 At this time, I would like to get the

approval of minutes from our previous 1 2 meeting on January 27. If anybody has 3 any notes or changes, please make it known now. If not, could I have a 4 5 motion to approve those minutes? MR. PICARELLA: 6 7 I believe, at this point, the Board would entertain a motion to approve the 8 9 minutes of the January 27, 2021 Board 10 meeting of the crane operators. 11 MR. GOULET: 12 I make that motion. CHAIR HAULMAN: 13 I'll second that motion. All in favor 14 15 of approving those minutes, please say 16 aye. Any opposed? 17 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 18 19 Report of Prosecutorial Division 20 [Colby B. Widdowson, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 21 announced he would no longer be the prosecution 2.2 liaison for the Board due to the reorganization within 23 the office. He noted that the Board's prosecution 24 cases will now be under the supervision of Paul 25 Jarabeck's team, along with David Smith as the

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prosecution liaison and Kayla Bolan as a new 1 2 prosecutor. Mr. Widdowson thanked the Board for the 3 4 opportunity to work with them, noting the Board will 5 be in good hands moving forward. 6 Mr. Widdowson presented the Consent Agreements 7 for Case No. 18-71-009458 and Case No. 19-71-006657. 8 Mr. Picarella noted Mr. Fritz led the 9 deliberations and would be presenting the Board 10 Counsel part on these two Consent Agreements because 11 he recused himself due to prior conflict.] * * * 12 13 MR. FRITZ: 14 The Board would entertain a motion to 15 approve the Consent Agreement at Case No. 18-71-009458. 16 MR. MAUGER: 17 18 I make a motion to approve that Consent 19 Agreement as written. 20 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 21 Second. 2.2 MR. FRITZ: 23 All in favor? Any opposed? 24 [The motion carried unanimously. The Respondent's 25 name is Lloyd Crane & Equipment, LLC.]

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* * * 1 2 MR. FRITZ: 3 The Board would entertain a motion to 4 approve the Consent Agreement at Case 5 No. 19-71-006657. 6 Anyone make a motion? 7 MR. MAUGER: 8 I'll make a motion to approve that one 9 as written as well. 10 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 11 Second. 12 MR. FRITZ: 13 All in favor? Any opposed? 14 [The motion carried unanimously. The Respondent's 15 name is Aaron Lloyd, L.C.O.] * * * 16 17 [Paul J. Jarabeck, Esquire, Board Prosecutor, 18 addressed the prosecution division's reorganization, 19 stating that David Smith had previously worked with 20 the Board for about one year and noted Kayla Bolan 21 came from the Dauphin County District Attorney's Office. He informed the Board of their review of 2.2 23 cases and offered their assistance before the next 24 Board meeting if any questions arose. 25 Mr. Picarella thanked Colby Widdowson for his

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work for Board prosecution and welcomed David Smith 1 2 and Kayla Bolan as new prosecutors. 3 Chair Haulman also thanked Mr. Widdowson and welcomed Mr. Jarabeck.] 4 * * * 5 6 Report of Board Counsel - Regulations 7 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, noted items 2, 3, 6, and 7 were discussed during 8 9 executive session. 10 Mr. Picarella addressed 16A-7103 regarding the 11 final annex for the schedule of civil penalties regulation. He noted prior discussion at the last 12 13 meeting of the comments received from the Independent 14 Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC). He noted the 15 Board directed him to make changes to the final annex 16 and final preamble before promulgating them for final 17 rulemaking. 18 Mr. Picarella noted IRRC had a question as to why lapsed or expired crane licenses on the schedule of 19 20 civil penalties for citations for people who were not 21 licensed was not included. He stated the Board agreed 22 to not only use this for individuals who were never 23 licensed as crane operators but also include 2.4 individuals who were formerly licensed and their 25 license had lapsed or expired.

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Mr. Picarella addressed the addition to § 6.41(a) 1 of the schedule to add the phase, "or after a crane 2 3 operator's license has lapsed or expired" to the 4 section where it reads, "holding oneself out as being 5 able to operate a crane or using the title "licensed 6 crane operator" or the abbreviation "L.C.O." without a 7 license.] 8 MR. PICARELLA: 9 I believe the Board would entertain a 10 motion to accept the changes made to the 11 annex and to promulgate the annex for 12 the schedule of civil penalties for regulation 16A-7103 for final 13 14 rulemaking. 15 Does the Board have such a motion? MR. MAUGER: 16 17 I'll make a motion to accept it as 18 written. 19 MR. GOULET: 20 I'll second the motion. 21 MR. PICARELLA: 2.2 Having a motion and seconded. Can we 23 have a vote? All in favor, say aye. 24 Any opposed? 25 [The motion carried unanimously.]

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2 Mr. Picarella addressed changes to the preamble 3 relating to IRRC's request for clarification. He noted IRRC asked whether the Board considered 4 5 qualifying the use of the civil penalty for the offense of operating a crane without a license or 6 7 employing an unlicensed individual to operate a crane, 8 in those instances where the violation for either of 9 these two offenses resulted in bodily harm or 10 substantial property damage, and whether a civil 11 penalty should even be available for consideration in 12 those circumstances.

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Mr. Picarella also noted IRRC asked the Board to 13 14 explain their rationale on how dealing with violations 15 of that nature, as well as describe their approach to protect the public health and safety and deter 16 17 violations of statutory and regulatory requirements. 18 Mr. Picarella provided additional language to the preamble as directed by the Board at the last meeting 19 20 as follows: The ability for agents of the bureau to 21 file a citation for violations of these sections does 22 not foreclose the option of filing formal action for 23 these violations if the facts and circumstances 24 warrant a more serious penalty. The option of 25 issuance of a citation for unlicensed operation of a

crane or employing an unlicensed individual to operate 1 2 a crane is discretionary and should be used in those 3 situations where the violation occurs without aggravating circumstances, such as bodily injury or 4 5 property damage. This approach protects the public health and safety by allowing a quick resolution and 6 7 the establishment of a first violation of these provisions in those matters that do not involve bodily 8 9 injury or property damage. A subsequent violation requires the filing of a formal disciplinary action, 10 11 the threat of which would promote compliance with the licensing requirements of the Board. 12

Mr. Picarella noted IRRC also made a comment 13 about the fact that a license to operate a crane is 14 15 only valid in conjunction with certification if the 16 license maintains a current certification in a 17 specialty for which the crane operator is certified. 18 He stated, depending on the specialty or the 19 accrediting organization, certifications are valid for 20 2, 3, or 5 years. IRRC noted there may be times when 21 a crane operator's certification will expire during 22 the biennial licensing renewal period. IRRC further 23 noted that section 502(b) of the act (63 P.S. § 24 2400.502(b)) and the Board's regulations at § 25 6.32(a)(2), relating to renewal of a license, require

1 crane operators to have current valid certification at 2 all times and that the Board requires licensees to 3 submit evidence of certification renewal before the 4 current certification expires and that a licensee who 5 has failed to maintain certification or submit 6 evidence of recertification is subject to disciplinary 7 action.

Mr. Picarella noted IRRC questioned whether the 8 Board considered and rejected establishing a civil 9 10 penalty for failure to maintain certification or 11 provide evidence of certification renewal and, if so, 12 to explain the reason and rationale for excluding 13 these offenses from the schedule of civil penalties. Mr. Picarella mentioned the Board directed him to 14 15 include language explaining the Board's decision in 16 the preamble. He noted the language to read as 17 follows: The Commissioner and the Board did not include the failure to maintain certification or 18 19 submit evidence of recertification in the schedule of

20 civil penalties because a licensee may choose not to 21 recertify or maintain their certification for several 22 reasons. A licensee may no longer be employed as a 23 crane operator if no longer practicing the profession 24 or has retired from the profession at the time the 25 certification expires. In those situations, rather

than going through the expense of recertification when 1 2 a licensee is no longer practicing the profession, the 3 licensee may let their certification expire and not 4 engage in the practice of the profession, even though 5 they have a valid current license to do so until that 6 license subsequently expires. The Commissioner and 7 the Board believed that the ability to discipline a 8 licensee for failure to maintain certification did not 9 arise until the licensee actually operates a crane 10 after the crane operator's certification had expired. 11 As such, a violation of 63 P.S. § 2400.502(b) and 12 § 6.32(a)(2) would more appropriately be the subject 13 of formal disciplinary action.] 14 MR. PICARELLA: 15 We need a vote to accept the preamble as 16 amended and to promulgate it as our 17 final rulemaking. 18 At this point, the Board would 19 entertain a motion to accept the final 20 preamble as presented and to promulgate 21 it as final rulemaking. 2.2 Do I have such a motion? 23 MR. GOULET: 24 I make that motion. 25 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON:

13 Second. 1 2 MR. PICARELLA: 3 We have a motion and second. Any discussion? All those in favor of the 4 5 motion, please say aye. Any opposed? 6 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 7 8 Report of Board Counsel - Final Adjudication and Order 9 MR. PICARELLA: 10 At this point is the Final Adjudication and Order at Case No. 20-71-009719. 11 12 Based upon the discussions in 13 executive session, I believe the Board 14 would entertain a motion to approve the 15 Final Adjudication and Order at Case No. 20 - 71 - 009719. 16 17 CHAIR HAULMAN: 18 I'll make that motion to approve the 19 Adjudication and Order. 20 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 21 Second. 2.2 MR. PICARELLA: 23 Any discussion? All those in favor, say 24 aye. Any opposed? Any abstentions? 25 [The motion carried unanimously. The Respondent's

name is Christopher Humlhanz, L.C.O.] 1 * * * 2 3 Applications MR. PICARELLA: 4 5 The Board has reviewed the Initial 6 License Application with Certification 7 of William Leach. Based upon the discussions in 8 9 executive session, I believe the Board 10 would entertain a motion to table that 11 Application and direct the Board 12 administrator to send a discrepancy 13 letter seeking more information as outlined in discussions in executive 14 15 session. Do we have such a motion? 16 17 MR. MAUGER: 18 I make a motion that we direct a letter 19 to be sent. 20 COMMISSIONER JOHNSON: 21 Second. 2.2 MR. PICARELLA: 23 We have a motion and a second. Is there 24 any discussion on that? Seeing none. Ι 25 will ask for a vote as to whether we

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15 table it and direct the Board 1 2 administrator to send a letter for more 3 information. All those in favor, say aye. Any opposed? Any abstentions? 4 5 [The motion carried unanimously.] * * * 6 7 Report of Commissioner 8 [K. Kalonji Johnson, Commissioner, Bureau of 9 Professional and Occupational Affairs, recognized 10 Andrew LaFratte for his work regarding a 3-year 11 project funded by the Department of Labor & Industry to examine various aspects of licensure and the 12 impacts of licensure on unique populations, including 13 14 veterans returning from active service as well as 15 military spouses. Commissioner Johnson commended Mr. LaFratte for 16 17 doing a phenomenal job, noting a report should soon be 18 available for the public to view. He stated Mr. 19 LaFratte specifically worked on ways to help bridge 20 the gap for individuals returning to civilian life and 21 spouses who deal with being transient as far as 22 military specialties and professions and occupations. 23 Andrew LaFratte, MPA, Executive Policy 24 Specialist, Department of State, announced that the 25 report regarding veterans' licensure would soon be

posted on the professional licensing website and also
shared with Board administrators.

Mr. LaFratte addressed a survey conducted of over 3 4 200 military spouses and veterans located in the 5 Commonwealth regarding transition from the military to 6 employment, the barriers faced, and what could be done 7 to smooth that transition. He noted a number of 8 findings, policies, and recommendations that can be 9 done administratively through the Bureau of 10 Professional and Occupational Affairs (BPOA).

11 Mr. LaFratte mentioned the release of a military occupational crosswalk later in 2021 with the intent 12 13 of matching military experience and training to 14 positions that are licensed in the Commonwealth under 15 BPOA. He noted about 300 military occupations that 16 are somewhat equivalent to the licensing standards, 17 where veterans and people coming off active duty could 18 maybe take some sort of bridge program or refresher 19 courses and easily meet the licensure requirements in 20 a shorter length of time than having to redo a whole 21 civilian training course.] * * * 2.2 23 Report of Board Chair - No Report * * * 24 25 Report of Board Administrator - No Report
