The Board returned to open session 11 at 10:30 a.m.] * * * 12 13 Meeting Instructions [Amanda Li, Board Administrator, provided instructions 14 15 to be followed during the virtual meeting. 16 Ms. Li also noted the meeting was being recorded, 17 and those who continue to participate were giving 18 their consent to be recorded.] * * * 19 20 The regularly scheduled meeting of the State 21 Board of Crane Operators was held on Wednesday, 22 January 26, 2022. F. Allan "Buddy" Mauger Jr., 23 Chairman, Public Member, called the meeting to order 2.4 at 10:32 a.m.

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Roll Call/Introductions 1 [A roll call of Board members was taken by Ms. Li. 3 She also provided an introduction of attendees.] * * * 4 5 [Dean F. Picarella, Esquire, Senior Board Counsel, 6 noted the Board met in Executive Session prior to the Board meeting for the purpose of conducting quasijudicial deliberations and to receive the advice of counsel on a number of matters currently pending 10 before the Board.] 11 Approval of minutes of the November 22, 2021 meeting 12 1.3 CHAIR MAUGER: 14 The next item would be the approval of 15 the minutes. 16 I'll make a motion that we approve 17 the minutes from the November 22, 2021 18 Crane Board Meeting as written. 19 MR. 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8 Report of Prosecutorial Division - Prosecution

9 Division Annual Report Presentation

10 [Carolyn A. DeLaurentis, Esquire, Deputy Chief

11 Counsel, Prosecution Division, provided a summary of

12 the prosecution division's caseload during 2021.

Ms. DeLaurentis informed the Board that 56 cases

14 were opened in 2021 for the State Board of Crane

15 Operators, which is a decrease from 75 cases in 2020.

16 | She reported closing 104 cases in 2021 and 51 in 2020.

17 | She noted 52 open cases for the Board as of January 1,

18 2022.

19 Ms. DeLaurentis addressed enforcement actions and

20 thanked prosecutors, counsel, and the Board for their

21 combined effort in protecting the public and the

22 | integrity of the profession. She noted 13 cases

23 resulted in discipline in 2021. She reported 6 cases

24 resulted in fines, 3 suspensions, 3 reprimands, 3

25 revocations or voluntary surrenders, and 3 probations.

She reported 36 warning letters in 2021, which is an increase from 28 in 2020.

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Mr. Picarella asked Ms. DeLaurentis how many cases currently pending are for a lapsed license or practicing without a license since they now have the ability to issue Act 48 citations.

Ms. DeLaurentis stated the information would be in a report pulled from the Pennsylvania Licensing System (PALS) and will get back to him.

Paul J. Jarabeck, Esquire, Senior Board

Prosecutor, explained that the program works by

looking at past actions and reporting that forward.

He stated there were not many lapsed cases for the

Board and anticipated the lapsed cases to be around 10

to 15 percent of the total cases based on past years.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted the prosecution division as a whole opened 1,223 COVID-related cases in 2020 with none of those cases for the Board. She reported 543 COVID cases were opened in 2021, also with none of those cases for the Board.

Ms. DeLaurentis noted opening a record number of cases in 2021 and thanked all of the administrative assistants. She reported 18,363 cases were opened in 2021, which is an increase from 2020 at 13,394. She also reported closing 15,994 cases for 2021 and 13,274

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in 2020. She stated the prosecution division, the counsel division, and the Board should all be proud of that work.
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Ms. DeLaurentis noted the total number of current cases for the office as of January 1, 2022, is 15,141.

Mr. Jarabeck announced David Smith took another position at the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection. He introduced Greg Liero as the new Board prosecution liaison and Matt Anderson, who will be the primary crane team, and provided a summary of their professional background.]

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   practicing without a licensed, failure to notify the
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Board of a criminal conviction, or failure to notify the Board when certification lapses.
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Mr. Picarella explained that cited individuals
will be given an opportunity for a hearing before
state hearing examiners, where they will be allowed to
present evidence in their behalf regarding the
citation. He commented that Act 41 citation authority
will help the Board as far as streamlining operations
and cut down on any expenses the Board sees as far as
filing formal prosecution in those matters.]
